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OPEN CHANNEL SEEKS SUPPORT FOR CTV DIGITAL LICENSE

Community Television needs your support to move to digital broadcasting.

If you care about the future of Australian television, take the time out to support Community Television's bid to gain a digital license. Community television (CTV) provides diverse programming, quality content, training and community access. CTV provides programming for and by many under-represented communities, and needs to be given access to the digital platform as soon as possible.

Currently, CTV stations and some regional networks are the ONLY free-to-air stations that do not broadcast in digital AND analogue. This means that C31 is not given an equal platform to get its shows out into the community. Every time someone buys a digital set-top box, they effectively lose access to C31.

While C31 still gets 1.3 million viewers a month, the station needs to get a digital license so it can access all viewers - regardless of what TV they own.
