ARTS LAW WEEK WRAP-UP!

During May, OPEN CHANNEL presented Rights Online and VIDEO SLAM! as part of Arts Law Week. Both events were a great success, and attracted much interest from filmmakers, students and media. OPEN CHANNEL would like to thank all participants for generously contributing their time, talents and skills.

VIDEO SLAM!'s final 10-minute short, entitled '5 Smiles', was screened at events and lectures in Brisbane and Sydney as a model of Creative Commons licensing, and will also be screened at the next Creative Commons iSummit in Dubrovnik.

For Andrew Garton, OPEN CHANNEL's Program Director the VIDEO SLAM! experience was extraordinary and inspiring: "Not only did we produce 10 minutes of original film in under 48 hours (34 in fact), 22 people showed unsurpassed generosity, friendship and integrity in what could very well have been an international first... no less than 110 individually licensed items from the Web were legally employed in the creation of '5 Smiles' and that we could do so with a legal team at hand, proved it was possible to create new work from the generosity of other artists the world over... VIDEO SLAM was a product of both a local and global community of artists who, by way of the Creative Commons licenses they elect to use to copyright their work, are part of a new way of creativity that thrives outside of the mainstream."

HORSE BAZAAR DIGITAL ART PRIZE 2007

The Horse Bazaar Prize for panoramic content is an open digital art prize for the production of screen-based content that best uses Horse Bazaar's unique panoramic projection system.

The screens are custom-built for the environment and extend for nearly 20 metres around the bar. Casting aside the traditional 4:3 screen format, Horse Bazaar invites visual artists to produce digital content at an 8:1 ratio.
