Canadians unite for peace

Hundreds of thousands across country

Pebruary 15 was a day of international action to stop war against the people of Iraq and elsewhere. Over ten million people took action around the world to speak as a collective voice for peace. Demonstrations were organized in over 77 Canadian communities of all sizes, and Canadians all over the country braved the winter chill to show up for peace.

While estimates of the numbers of people involved can vary widely, it can safely be said

there were over 200,000 people involved across the country, and perhaps even more than 300,000. Mainstream media reports have proven unreliable in assessing numbers — CBC, the Globe and Mail, and Sun Media Corporation were all quoted as assessing the number of people in Toronto as "about 10,000" while CTV announced 30,000 and the Toronto Star described "an estimated 80,000 marchers," which fit more with reports on the Ontario Indymedia site of 50,000-100,000.

But the numbers aren't the most important part of the story. The diversity of people involved and the messages they were voicing are what really matters. People off all ages, of all races, of all cultural and faith backgrounds, or all sexual identities, of all classes and of all political affiliations showed up. They were saying no to war, no to killing innocent civilians, no to sanctions, no to racial targetting, no to U.S. imperialism, no to a culture of war and military might, no to divisions among people. They were saying yes to peace, yes to justice, yes to freedom, yes to unity, yes to a collective humanity, and yes to the power of the people.

In a February 13 press release, Josh Matlow of the Canadian Peace Alliance said, "Marches, rallies and demonstrations are planned across the country. Each event brings
