**Keio University 150<sup>th</sup> Anniversary**  
**International Symposium on the International Criminal Court (ICC)**  
**"The International Criminal Court Reviewed**  
**-Significance, Accomplishments and Challenges-"**

Keio University will hold an international symposium on the International Criminal Court (ICC) on November 4<sup>th</sup>, 2006. As one of the pioneers in the field of research on International Criminal Law, it is notable that in Japan only Keio University provides regular courses on crimes against humanity, genocide and other related subjects, even though these issues have become a major topic worldwide. This will be a ground-breaking event with two ICC judges participating for the first time here in Japan. In addition, experts of criminal law from Humboldt University, Berlin and Cologne University as well as Congress members from Japan will join as panelists of the symposium. Representatives of the Embassy of Finland, representing the Presidency of the European Union, and the Embassy of the Federal Republic of Germany will also attend.

Over 100 countries have ratified the ICC Statute and Japan's earliest possible accession to the ICC is highly expected in the near future. This symposium will hopefully become a major impulse for Japan's ratification of the ICC Statute. Attendance of members of the press is highly welcome.
