

FROM SWINGERS' PARTY TO A GRISLY DEATH



FRIDAY, JANUARY 29

Police separate two people being held in custody, a man aged 57 and a woman, 41. Detectives and the police air wing conduct searches in central Victoria, particularly around Heathcote.

An exclusion zone is set up in bushland off Forest Drive about 4pm.

EVENING

■ Mario Schembri and Bernadette Denny are charged with murder and assisting or having knowledge of the disposing of Mr Rockefeller's body

■ Mr Rockefeller's remains, which have been cut up and burnt, are found in the backyard of a Glenroy house

MONDAY, FEBRUARY 1

Mr Schembri and Ms Denny face court.

Herald Sun reveals Mr Rockefeller had an alias he used in the underground swingers' network.

WEDNESDAY, JANUARY 27

Investigators searching for Mr Rockefeller access his Facebook page and ask questions of those wanting to be his "friend". The site swells from one South African business associate to 21 "friend" in a day.

THURSDAY, JANUARY 28

Victoria Police execute a warrant on a Hadfield property in South St, arresting a man and a woman in relation to his disappearance. Grave fears are held for Mr Rockefeller's safety.

■ The *Herald Sun* reveals Mr Rockefeller had a fight with the swingers because he failed to bring a "wife" to the house as arranged.

■ An electric Ozito chainsaw was allegedly involved in the dismemberment of Mr Rockefeller's body and bought at a Bunnings store near Glenroy after his death.
