twelfth biennial labour history conference 15 - 17 September 2011

The theme of the conference will be Labour History and Its People, with particular emphasis on the role of biography in the study of Australian labour history.

Labour biography has enjoyed something of a resurgence in recent years and it is intended that this will be reflected in the content and direction of the conference.

The year 2011 also marks the fiftieth anniversary of the founding of the Australian Society for the Study of Labour History in 1961 at the ANU. The conference venue is the ANU, thus taking advantage of a long standing connection.

The conference is being organised jointly with the National Centre for Biography, with backing from the Noel Butlin Archives Centre and local trade unions.

Contributions by way of papers, themed discussion panels, audio/visual presentations and performances are invited from history professionals, labour activists and others.

All intending contributors should send an abstract of not more than 500 words to the Convenor by **1 February 2011.**

Papers may be submitted for formal academic refereeing but must reach us by **1 March 2011.**

All papers, maximum length 5000 words, must be submitted by **1 August 2011** for distribution at the conference. Please prepare papers in accordance with the *Labour History* style guide.

Presentations of 15–20 minutes will be grouped into panels and a chair/commentator assigned to each panel. It is proposed to tape all sessions and deposit them in the Noel Butlin Archives.

A set of refereed and non-refereed conference papers will be provided to registered conference participants. To commemorate the fiftieth anniversary of the ASSLH, a book of selected conference papers will also be published in 2012.
