To ask the Secretary of State for Culture, Media and Sport, how much has been spent on the Big Lottery Fund website in each year since the website's establishment [297114]

The table below shows how much was spent on the Big Lottery Fund (BIG's) website each financial year since our inception on 1 June 2004.
