

THE TOPONYMY OF THE FALKLAND ISLANDS AS RECORDED ON MAPS AND IN GAZETTEERS¹

A: Historical résumé of the period prior to 1982

1 The first confirmed sighting of the Falkland Islands was made in 1592, by an English navigator named John Davis. A small French settlement was established on the islands in 1764 at Port Louis; this was sold to Spain in 1767 and later abandoned. In 1765 a British settlement was established at Port Egmont; this was abandoned in 1774 but the British claim to sovereignty was maintained. British settlement on the islands was resumed in 1833. The ongoing interest of both Britain and Spain (later Argentina) in the islands has led to a parallel separate development of toponymy.

2 Until the Second World War, it appears that the selection of geographical names as found on British Admiralty hydrographic charts covering the Falkland Islands was considered adequate in both accuracy and density for all UK official purposes. Then in 1943 the Governor of the Falkland Islands, A W Cardinall, established a Naming Committee to assist in the preparation by the Royal Engineers of more detailed wartime mapping of the islands. This committee, under the chairmanship of the Colonial Secretary, called on the advice of expert local witnesses for the addition of geographical names which were in genuine and consistent colloquial usage but which had not hitherto appeared on maps. The resultant wartime mapping remained operational until a new 1:50,000 scale map series DOS453/H791 was published by the UK Directorate of Overseas Surveys (DOS) in 1961-62. With the advent of this particular mapping, forming a 29-sheet series dedicated specifically to the Falkland Islands, the names approved for use in the islands were for the first time displayed in a consistent and uniform map series.

3 A typewritten list of some 250 geographical names with their etymologies was compiled by Boumphrey, Hamilton & Busbie in November 1950 and entitled *Preliminary Derivations of some Falkland Islands Place-Names*. But the first meaningful gazetteer of the Falkland Islands was not compiled for a further two decades, using the DOS map series. This gazetteer formed part of an article entitled “The Geology of the Falkland Islands”, published in 1972 as *British Antarctic Survey Scientific Report No 76*. It contained almost 3000 names, listed in alphabetical order with generic terms reversed, with features located to the degree, minute and second. There were no feature designations or other feature attributes provided.

B: Stanley

4 There is some confusion as to whether the correct name for the principal settlement of the Falkland Islands is *Stanley* or *Port Stanley*. On 2 August 1956, the Officer Administering the Government of the Falkland Islands reported to the Secretary of State for the Colonies in London as follows:

There is some difficulty over the correct name of the capital. Early despatches contain reference to both Port Stanley and Stanley. Port Stanley was accepted by the Naming Commission set up in 1943 to consider the names then being included on the War Office maps. Local opinion differs on the matter, but there is no doubt that Stanley is now common usage and has been for some considerable time. The capital is defined as Stanley in the Interpretation and General Law Ordinance. In the circumstances I would advise that the correct name for the capital is Stanley.

The preference for *Stanley* appears to hold good today, notwithstanding the remark by Pat Watts of the islands' broadcasting service, quoted later in this paper².

C: The invasion of 1982: The UK and the toponymy of the islands

5 In the immediate aftermath of the invasion on April 2nd 1982, it was clear that the sheets of the original H791 series were inadequate because the existing sheets carried mere grid ticks at the sheet edges, rather than the full grid matrix across the map face which was required for operational purposes. But in the process of rectifying this, a serious flaw in the H791 series was discovered. Whereas the bulk of the Falkland Islands falls to the east of the 60°W line of longitude, about one-third falls to the west of this line. The Universal Transverse Mercator (UTM) grid system features a major zonal boundary at this line of longitude, with Zone 21F to the east and Zone 20F to the west. The grid lines, on both axes, are not at all parallel across the zone boundary. For some reason, all 29 sheets of Series H791 had been constructed showing grid lines for Zone 21F, which were wildly and dangerously inappropriate on all sheets west of 60°W³. As part of the process of producing new editions of the H791 sheets in April 1982, a wholly new UTM grid matrix was required on all the western sheets, added in red to distinguish it from the purple grid which extended the original grid ticks. This new grid matrix allowed the H791 series to be compatible with other operational mapping which had been separately and correctly compiled⁴. But each sheet west of the 60°W line had to carry a clear warning notice so that users made reference to the red rather than the purple grid. A sample can be seen at Annex A.

6 Production of these new versions of the H791 sheets⁵ essentially took place during the week following the Argentine invasion of the Falkland Islands. Simultaneously, work was undertaken on an operational gazetteer of the toponyms of the islands, which was published as the *Gazetteer of the Falkland Islands and the Falkland Island Dependencies, GSGS 5442, Edition 1-GSGS, Directorate of Military Survey, April 1982*. This contained over 3000 entries⁶ for places and features in the Falkland Islands, plus approximately 830 entries for places and features in the then Falkland Islands Dependencies (South Georgia and the South Sandwich Islands). For the section relating to the Falkland Islands, the entries were based on the H791 series of 1961-62, now incorporating a later 1979 Edition 2-DOS version of sheets 14 and 15.

7 Other UK sources were also utilised in the compilation of this gazetteer, notably British Admiralty hydrographic charts and also information recorded in pencil during the 1960s or 1970s on copies of the sheets of Series H791 by members of the administration of the islands. This information variously added, deleted or repositioned a small proportion of the names on the H791 series. Although the Naming Committee had probably ceased to function by the time of these annotations and there was little supporting documentation for them, their provenance nevertheless conveyed a suggestion of authenticity and the information was duly incorporated into the gazetteer⁷. A vital additional incorporation was information from several Argentine map sheets at 1:500,000 scale, dated 1968 and 1974. Names in the gazetteer were listed in alphabetical order, with generic terms reversed, and located both to the degree and minute and also by Universal Transverse Mercator (UTM) grid reference. Variant names, which were for the most part those names found on Argentine sources, were cross-referenced to the main entries. Feature designations were added, using codes adopted by the United States Board on Geographic Names (BGN). Names were also located to their particular sheet of the H791 map series.

8 This gazetteer was produced to meet an exceptionally tight operational deadline and inevitably it contained certain deficiencies, the most notable of these being a duplication of name entries where a single feature appeared across neighbouring map sheets. To remedy such deficiencies, a second edition of this gazetteer was produced only three weeks later. This was the *Gazetteer of the Falkland Islands and the Falkland Islands Dependencies, GSGS 5442, Edition 2-GSGS, Directorate of Military Survey, 28 April 1982*. Many of the unnecessary duplications were removed, and the section relating to the Dependencies was significantly expanded to over 1000 entries. Both editions of the gazetteer were produced under the toponymic direction of the Permanent Committee on Geographical Names (PCGN) and were consecutively deployed to meet operational requirements during the campaign (which lasted until mid-June 1982).

D: The invasion of 1982: Argentina and the toponymy of the islands

9 Of course the UK maps of the Falkland Islands, including the H791 series, were also of interest to Argentina. It was subsequently confirmed that copies of such maps had been “left on the Islands by the Argentine forces” after that country’s troops had returned home in June 1982⁸. Some of these had been copied: “Maps were recaptured from the Argentine military during repossession of the islands but they had been reprinted in Argentina”⁹. Yet although the maps were surely an operational *sine qua non* for both Argentina and the UK, they did not always filter through to the Argentine troops on the ground, as this lament from ‘conscript Guillermo’ indicates:

“I hadn’t the slightest idea ... where I was. ... As soon as they [the British] had landed they had had an idea of where they were, they knew which hill was which. I, on the other hand, had no idea. ... We didn’t even have basic geography. ... You want to see a map, at least to find out where you are.”¹⁰

10 Even for those with access to maps, the parallel naming¹¹ would have been a handicap. More than 200 of the major geographical features of the islands have names which are different in the English and Spanish languages. On occasion the names may be simply a translation of each other – thus *Isla Oeste* for *West Island* – but frequently there may be no obvious connection between the two language forms, as in the case of *Bahía de la Anunciación* for *Berkeley Sound*. Knowledge of the correspondences across the languages was vital; consider for example the following statement from the Argentine military command concerning operations on 1 May 1982: “The record of the Argentine Joint Chiefs of Staff ... reports that at 1700 ‘A[n Argentine air force] Mirage hits an enemy destroyer near Puerto Enriqueta”¹². Both Argentina and the UK needed to know that the English language name for this place – the name that appeared on the operational H791 map series – was Port Harriet¹³.

11 Parallel naming has also become true of the principal settlement of the islands, the town of Stanley. In January 1965 it was reported that the Argentine *Commission for the Recovery of the Falkland Islands* had demanded that the “Argentine flag should fly everywhere in Puerto Soledad, the islands’ capital”¹⁴. This name was taken from the Spanish language name for the island of East Falkland – Isla Soledad – on which Stanley lies. But in September 1966 a Douglas DC-4 of Aerolíneas Argentinas made an unauthorised landing at Stanley, which the crew of the aircraft referred to as Puerto Rivero¹⁵. This name, which resurfaced for a brief two days during the 1982 hostilities¹⁶, was in honour of Antonio Rivero, a gaucho who had fought against the 1833 British settlement of the islands and was celebrated by Argentina’s *Peronistas*. This name might have embedded itself as the chosen Argentine alternative for Stanley had not both this unauthorised landing and the 1982 invasion taken place during periods of anti-Perón military rule.

- before 2 April 1982: *Puerto Stanley* (used by the Argentine government and most media)
(in 1965 Puerto Soledad was used by certain Argentine media)
(in 1966 Puerto Rivero was used by *Peronistas*)
- 3 – 4 April 1982: *Puerto Rivero* (used by the Argentine government and media)
- 5 April 1982: *Puerto de la Isla Soledad* (used by the Argentine government and media)
- 6 – 20 April 1982: *Puerto de las Islas Malvinas* (used by the Argentine government and media)
- since 21 April 1982: *Puerto Argentino* (decree No 757 of the Argentine government, 21 April 1982; used by the Argentine government and media since that date)

It can be seen that Argentina employed five different names for Stanley during the first twenty days of the 1982 hostilities, before settling upon *Puerto Argentino*, which it uses to this day. This name, of course, was and remains anathema to the residents of the islands, as Pat Watts of the islands' broadcasting service recalled from his time in charge during the occupation:

"It hurt me greatly to call it [the radio station] *Radio Nacional Islas Malvinas*, and I used to try to avoid referring to Port Stanley as Puerto Argentino. I called it 'the capital' or the 'largest settlement on the island' "¹⁸.

Argentine toponymic naming and renaming in association with the Falklands Islands was limited to the islands themselves except for one instance in Buenos Aires, when in early June 1982 the *Plaza de los Ingleses* was renamed the *Plaza de la Fuerza Aérea* in recognition of the part played by the Argentine air force during the campaign¹⁹.

E: Toponymic developments since 1982

13 Following the swift production of its first and second editions²⁰, a revised third edition of the UK gazetteer of the Falkland Islands was published almost four years after the cessation of hostilities, as the *Gazetteer of the Falkland Islands, South Georgia and the South Sandwich Islands, GSGS 5442, Edition 3-GSGS, Directorate of Military Survey, 1986*²¹. As with the previous two editions, this third edition was produced under the toponymic direction of the PCGN. Part A comprises over 3600 entries for places and features in the Falkland Islands; Part B contains over 1400 entries for places and features in South Georgia and the South Sandwich Islands. Both figures include main entries and variant entries. This remains the current edition to the present day. Additional sources, both UK and Argentine, were incorporated into this third edition. There are still a few unnecessarily duplicated entries, and occasional minor defects in the sorting routine.

14 Argentina has undertaken only limited toponymic activity relating to the Falkland Islands since the hostilities of 1982. The Argentine authorities have decided upon new preferences for a limited number of features; for example *Bahía del Castor* has replaced *Bahía de la Plata* as their preferred name for Beaver Bay. But one Argentine development is of particular interest. At the time of the 1982 hostilities it was believed that, of the two neighbouring West Falkland peaks Mount Robinson and Mount Adam, the former was marginally the higher. It was accordingly to Mount Robinson that Argentina applied the name *Monte Independencia*, at the same time denoting Mount Adam as *Monte Beaufort*. But a more recent survey has revealed Mount Adam to be the higher peak, standing at 700 metres above sea level as against the 695 metres of Mount Robinson. Following this discovery, Argentina has transferred the name *Monte Independencia* from Mount Robinson to Mount Adam.

15 In July 1999, the United Kingdom and Argentina issued a Joint Statement on relations between the two countries, which touched on the question of place names in the Falkland Islands. The relevant section of the Joint Statement announced that:

IV (ii): The Argentine Government is prepared to look at the question of toponymy in the Falkland Islands. To that end it will continue to consult the appropriate national institutions²².

This statement was elaborated upon by the UK Foreign Secretary of the time, Robin Cook, in an accompanying press conference at which he reported:

“For its part, the government of Argentina will review the Spanish place names for locations in the Falkland Islands which were imposed by decree by [Argentine General] Galtieri”²³.

The inference is that Argentina’s intention was to discuss this matter internally with its own “appropriate national institutions”, though whether it has done so is not known. There would seem to be little to discuss bilaterally with the UK under this proposal, since although there are more than 200 features on the Falkland Islands with unofficial Spanish-language names (as well as their English language names), only one such name truly dates from the Galtieri period: *Puerto Argentino*, still used for Stanley today. Most other Spanish names, most notably *Islas Malvinas* itself, have a much longer historical pedigree and, although unofficial in terms of sovereignty, have a genuine role in the Spanish language.

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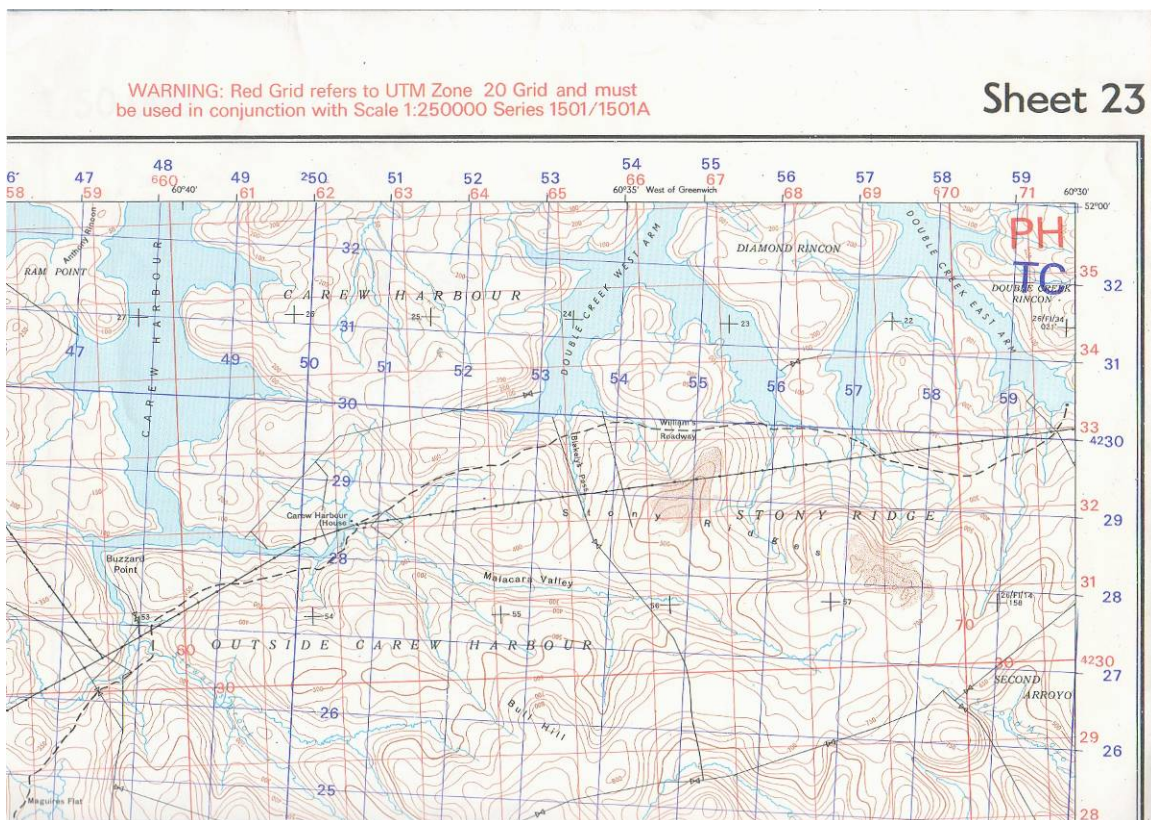

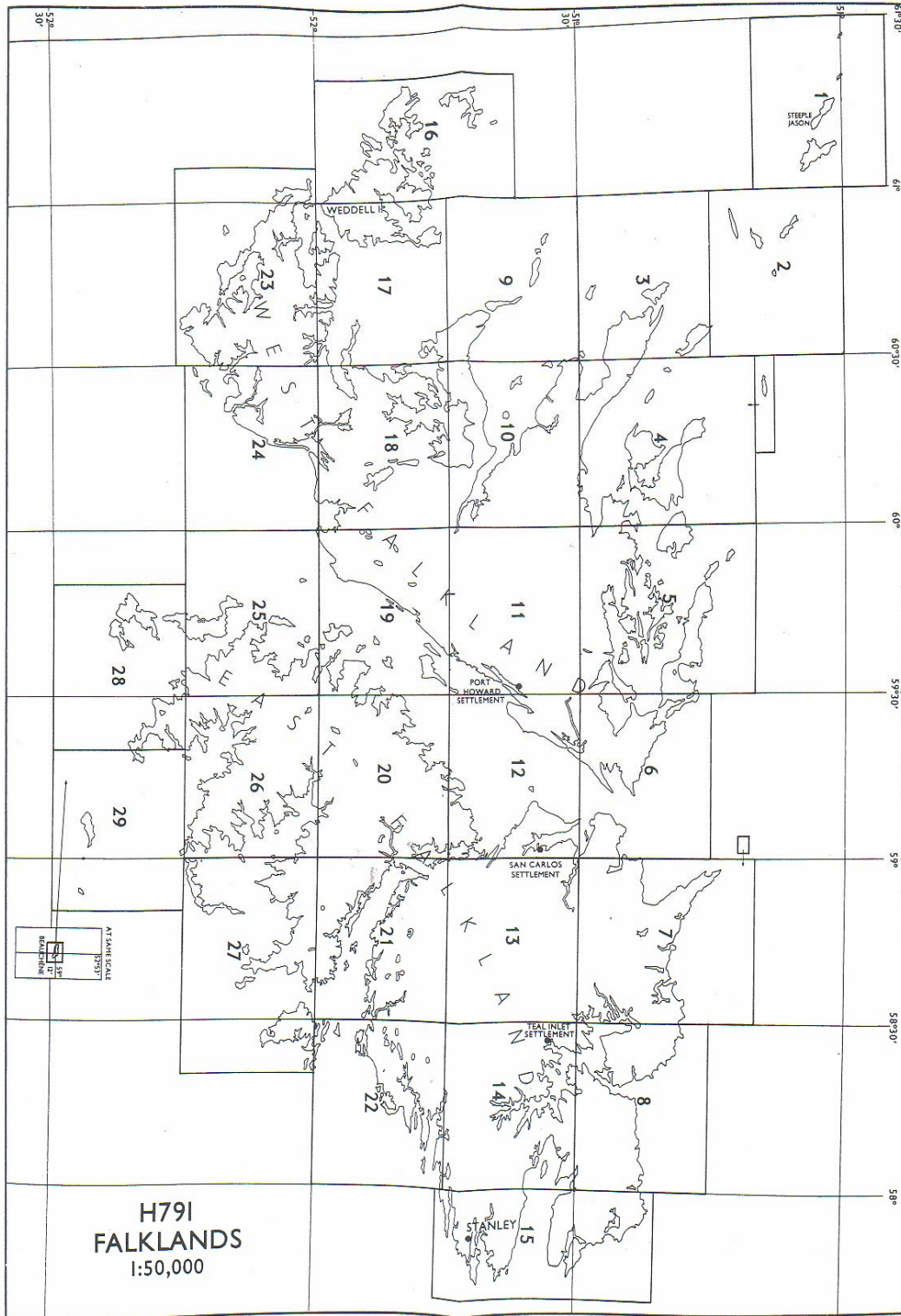
Extract from sheet 23 of the H791 map series at 1:50,000 scale, showing the double grid matrix printed on all sheets west of 60°W
