  - 6. Attached to this Affidavit and marked Exhibit "B" is a true copy of a certificate I received from St. Mary's Indian Residential School for being a member of the School Band.
- [15] A Commissioner for taking affidavits must:
  - i. review the contents of the affidavit with you,
  - ii. ask you if you swear the contents to be true, and
  - iii. then they must sign this affidavit in front of you.

Each province has different rules for who is a Commissioners for taking affidavits, but in general they include: lawyers, notary publics, government agents, and some Service Canada agents.

If the person making the affidavit is unable to read, the Commissioner for taking affidavits must read it out loud to them. The person making the affidavit must then certify that the affidavit was read to them aloud and that they seemed to understand it.
