◆◆ FROM THE RECTOR ◆◆

Dear Friends in Christ:

Maybe you noticed a story in last week's *Catholic Herald* about new norms for Communion under both species in the Diocese of Phoenix. You may have wondered why this story from Arizona received such prominent coverage here (on page 3 of the *Catholic Herald*, where letters from Bishop Morlino appear). In fact, the story was featured because it will be significant for us as well. Bishop Morlino spoke to us priests about this while we together at Wisconsin Dells at the end of last month.



In the last couple of decades, Communion under both species (with the congregation able to receive the Precious Blood as well as the Sacred Host) has become routine in our experience. I knew (as many of you do) that Communion under both species was first introduced, on a limited basis, after the Second Vatican Council, and that it has become much more common since. What I did not know was that the widespread American practice of offering both species at most Sunday Masses began here under an indult (special permission) given by the Vatican in 1975, which expired in 2005.

Almost no one realized that until very recently. Maybe we can be forgiven for forgetting that we were operating under a temporary indult. After thirty years, something can seem pretty permanent. But it wasn't. The bishops of our country did apply for an extension of the 1975 indult, but that was denied.

So, all over the United States, we now find ourselves needing to bring our practice into conformity with current regulations (and with the rest of the world). In his comments at Chula Vista, Bishop Morlino mentioned a few instances in which Communion under both kinds is still permitted: the Chrism Mass, the Feast of Corpus Christi, for the bride and groom at a Nuptial Mass, and for those so allergic to wheat that they cannot tolerate even low-gluten hosts. Beyond those occasions and circumstances, Communion can be offered under both species at celebrations of special importance. But it is clear that we will not be seeing Communion under both species as a weekly practice.

Bishop Morlino understands that this comes as news to all of us. He is giving pastors considerable latitude as to the timetable for implementing this change. He suggested that the beginning of Advent (when the new translation of the Missal is fully implemented) would be one plausible date to make the change. That will be our timetable here at the Cathedral Parish (and also at St. Paul's University Catholic Center, the other parish clustered with us).

◆◆DE NUESTRO PÁRROCO◆◆

Queridos amigos en Cristo:

Si crecieron en América Latina, una de las diferencias que probablemente han notado en la Misa aquí en los Estados Unidos es que la Sagrada Comunión es usualmente distribuida en las dos formas, es posible recibir la Sangre Preciosa así como la Sagrada Hostia. En el último par de décadas, la Comunión en sus dos formas se hizo una rutina en nuestra experiencia en los Estados Unidos.

El Obispo Morlino habló de esto con nosotros, los sacerdotes, cuando estuvimos en reunidos a finales del mes pasado en Wisconsin Dells. El nos dijo algo que la mayoría de nosotros no tenía en cuenta. La práctica de ofrecer las dos especies en la mayoría de las Misas dominicales se inició aquí en virtud de un indulto (un permiso especial), dado por el Vaticano en 1975, y el cual expiró en 2005. Por lo tanto, en todo los Estados Unidos, nos encontramos con la necesidad de llevar nuestra práctica en conformidad con las normativas vigentes, y con el resto del mundo. En sus comentarios a nuestra asamblea el mes pasado, el Obispo Morlino mencionó algunos casos en que la Comunión bajo las dos especies es todavía permitida: la Misa Crismal, en la Festividad de Corpus Christi, para la novia y el novio en la Misa Nupcial, y para aquellos con alergia al trigo tan severa que no pueden tolerar ni la mas mínima cantidad de gluten en las hostias.

Además de estas ocasiones y circunstancias, la Comunión bajo las dos especies se puede dar en celebraciones particulares de especial importancia. Pero está claro que no vamos a estar viendo la Comunión bajo las dos especies como una practica regular.

El Obispo Morlino comprende que esto se presenta como una novedad para todos nosotros, tanto los sacerdotes como los feligreses. Él esta dando a los pastores libertad en el calendario para la aplicación de este cambio; sin embargo sugirió que el inicio del Adviento puede ser un buen momento para hacer el cambio. Ese día es el comienzo de un nuevo año en la liturgia de la Iglesia, y también es el día en que una nueva traducción al inglés de la Misa comenzará a ser utilizada en todas las parroquias de los Estados Unidos. El Misal en español no va a cambiar, pero el inicio del Adviento traerá este otro cambio: el recibir la solo la Sagrada Hostia en la Sagrada Comunión, tanto en las Misas en español como en las en inglés de nuestra parroquia.

Requisitos para Bautismo

- Padres y padrinos deben asistir a una platica pre-bautismal por lo menos un mes antes del Bautismo. La platica será en dos sesiones. Llamar a María a la oficina para anotarse en las clases.
- Acta de nacimiento del niño(a) deberá ser entregada el primer día de la clase.
- Los padrinos, si son pareja, deberán presentar copia del acta de su matrimonio católico. Recuerden que las personas que no estén casadas por la Iglesia y vivan juntas como pareja o familia no pueden ser padrinos de Bautismo. Si los padrinos no son pareja, pero tienen sus respectivas parejas y no son casadas por la iglesia, tampoco pueden ser padrinos.
- Las personas que piensan ser padrinos, deben ser católicos: bautizados y confirmados y poder recibir la Sagrada Comunión.

Requisitos para Matrimonio

- Los novios deben presentar: A) acta de bautismo actualizada para matrimonio; B) Acta de confirmación; C) Copia del acta de nacimiento. D) Si están casados por lo civil, presentar copia del acta.
- En caso de que algún contrayente no este bautizado o confirmado, favor de contactar a la oficina parroquial para inscribirse en el programa de educación religiosa para adultos. Sólo después de recibir el sacramento faltante se podrá realizar el matrimonio.
- Los novios asistirán a platicas.

Requisitos para Confirmación — Adultos

- Al momento de la inscripción deben presentar copia de: A) Acta de Nacimiento; B) Acta de Bautismo; C) Certificado de Primera Comunión (si lo tienen).
- Las clases son los domingos de 12:30 a 2:00 de la tarde.
