#### PROVISIONAL PROPOSALS FOR NORTHERN IRELAND PARLIAMENTARY CONSTITUENCIES PUBLISHED

Provisional Proposals for new parliamentary constituencies in Northern Ireland are published today (Tuesday 13<sup>th</sup> September). The proposals follow a review by the Boundary Commission for Northern Ireland which began on 4 March 2011. The decrease in the number of Northern Ireland constituencies from 18 to 16, as a result of the Parliamentary Voting System and Constituencies Act 2011, has meant a redrawing of the existing constituency boundaries.

The Commission's task in conducting the current review is a complex one, requiring it to balance a number of inter-dependent legal requirements for constituency design starting with a predetermined electoral quota of 76,641 based on the parliamentary electoral register as at 1 December 2010 and a ruling that every new constituency must have an electorate that is within 5% of the UK quota i.e. within a range of 72,810 to 80,473 electors.

When carrying out that task, the Commission aims to take a consistent approach across all of Northern Ireland.

The publication of the Commission's proposals triggers a 12-week public consultation period which will include three public hearings.

The Deputy Chairman of the Commission, the Hon Mr Justice McLaughlin said,

"Maintaining public confidence in the review process is an important part of our approach. The publication of these proposals is only the beginning of a lengthy and inclusive consultation process which will be replicated across the rest of the UK by the other Boundary Commissions. We would encourage anyone with an interest to contribute to this consultation.

People may send us their written representations on or before 2 December or they may come along and speak at one of the 3 public hearings we will be organising in October during the consultation period.

We will give serious consideration to the representations we receive during each stage of the consultation process".

Annex A provides details of the public consultation process.

Annex B sets out the rules and powers contained in the legislation.

Annex C describes the main effects of the new proposals.

Annex D sets out the composition of the proposed constituencies.

#### **Notes for Editors**

- The Boundary Commission for Northern Ireland is an independent and impartial public body which is responsible for reviewing Parliamentary constituencies in Northern Ireland and making recommendations to the Secretary of State for Northern Ireland every 5 years.
- 2. The Chairman of the Commission is the Speaker of the House of Commons, the Rt Hon John Bercow MP. The Deputy Chairman is the Hon Mr Justice McLaughlin, a Judge of the High Court of Justice in Northern Ireland. The other members of the Commission are Mr Richard Mackenzie CB and Dr Bill Smith.

- 3. There are four Boundary Commissions in the United Kingdom: one each for England, Scotland, Wales and Northern Ireland. The current review is being carried out simultaneously by each of the four Commissions and each is required to submit its report before 1 October 2013.
- 4. By virtue of section 33 of the Northern Ireland Act 1998, the boundaries of the Northern Ireland Assembly constituencies are the same as the parliamentary constituencies, with each constituency returning six Assembly members.

#### **DEVELOPING THE PROPOSALS: THE CONSULTATION PROCESS**

- Copies of the Commission's Provisional Proposals Report and the accompanying map have been published on the Commission's website today and placed on display at the headquarters of district councils, public libraries, Area Electoral Offices and the offices of the Electoral Commission and the Boundary Commission.
- 2. Written representations in respect of the proposals may be made from today until Friday 2 December 2011. Representations should be addressed to the Secretary to the Boundary Commission for Northern Ireland, Forestview, Purdy's Lane, Belfast, BT8 7AR. Representations may also be made by emailing review@boundarycommission.org.uk
- The Commission has organised 3 public hearings into its proposals to give an opportunity for the public to make representations on them. The hearings will be conducted by independent Chairs and, according to the legislation, must be completed within 2 days. They will be held as follows:
  10/11 October: Ramada Plaza Hotel, Shaw's Bridge, BELFAST
  19/20 October: Silverbirch Hotel, Gortin Road, OMAGH
  24/25 October: Tullyglass House Hotel, 178 Galgorm Road, BALLYMENA
- 4. After this initial 12 week consultation period, the Commission will publish the representations received and the records of the public hearings, and invite written comment on them during a further "scrutiny" period of 4 weeks.
- 5. The Commission will consider all representations, the records of the public hearings, any scrutiny comments made concerning representations and any other relevant information. It may then make amendments to the Provisional Proposals and publish the resulting Revised Proposals for a further 8-week public consultation period. There will not be any further public hearings.

- 6. The Commission will take account of any representations it receives regarding its Revised Proposals and decide whether any further modifications are required. The Commission is not required to publish the modifications it may decide to make for further consultation. It will, however, publish its final report for information.
- 7. At the end of the review, the Commission will submit its recommendations in a report to the Secretary of State for Northern Ireland who is responsible for laying the report before Parliament. When reports have been submitted by all four Boundary Commissions, Ministers will introduce a draft Order in Council to Parliament giving effect to their recommendations. Once the draft Order completes its legislative process, it will come into operation from the next general election.

#### **DEVELOPING THE PROPOSALS: RULES AND POWERS**

- 1. The legislation governing the current review requires that:
  - there will be a total of 600 parliamentary constituencies;
  - all constituencies must be constructed using a United Kingdom electoral quota based on the parliamentary electoral register as at 1 December 2010. For the current review the electoral quota is 76,641.
  - with a few exceptions (relating to protected islands in Scotland and the Isle of Wight and very large, sparsely populated constituencies) every constituency must have an electorate that is within 5% of the UK quota i.e. within a range of 72,810 to 80,473 electors;
  - a prescribed formula establishes the number of constituencies allocated to each part of the UK. For this review Northern Ireland will have 16;
  - under Rule 7, the Boundary Commission for Northern Ireland may define constituencies with electorates which vary by more than 5% from the UK electoral quota, where it is satisfied that the application of the quota range would unreasonably impair is ability to apply its discretionary powers (see paragraph 2) or jeopardise its reporting deadline.
- In applying these rules, the Commission has the discretion to take into account other factors provided they do not interfere with the requirement to meet the 5% target, namely:
  - special geographical considerations, including in particular the size, shape and accessibility of a constituency;
  - local government boundaries (ward boundaries in the case of Northern Ireland) as they exist on the most recent ordinary council-election day before the review date;
  - boundaries of existing constituencies;
  - any local ties which would be broken by changes in constituencies; and

• the inconvenience attendant on such changes.

This last factor does not apply to the current review but will apply to future reviews. These powers give the Commission some discretion in how to configure constituencies.

#### THE EFFECTS OF THE COMMISSION'S PROPOSALS

- The main effect of the amendments to the Parliamentary Constituencies Act 1986, contained in the Parliamentary Voting System and Constituencies Act 2011, is to reduce the number of parliamentary constituencies in Northern Ireland from 18 to 16 at the next General Election.
- 2. The Commission identified and considered a range of optional models for Northern Ireland's new parliamentary constituency boundaries.
- Because of the requirements to reduce the number of seats to16 and to respect a much tighter electoral quota range than previously, the provisional proposals require substantial changes to the existing constituency architecture.
- 4. Nine of the existing constituencies recognisably continue with only incremental adjustments.
- 5. All of the proposed constituencies are within the required 5% of the UK electoral quota of 76,641 i.e. between 72,810 and 80,473 electors.
- All but one of the proposed constituencies (Fermanagh and South Tyrone) are also within 5% of the Northern Ireland electoral average (the figure obtained by dividing the NI parliamentary electorate by 16 constituencies).
- The proposed constituencies range in size from 72,903 electors (Belfast South East) to 78,664 electors (Fermanagh and South Tyrone).
- 8. The legislation allows Northern Ireland constituencies to vary by more than 5% from the UK electoral quota when the NI average electorate differs from the UK quota to such an extent that the ability of the Boundary Commission to exercise its discretionary powers, or to meet the deadline for the

submission of its report to the Secretary of State, is jeopardised. The Commission does not consider that these conditions are fulfilled.

- 9. Within the confines of the electoral quota range, the proposals take account of both special geographical considerations and their potential impacts on identifiable local ties.
- 10. In Belfast, the existing 4 constituencies amount to 3.2 seats. The Commission considered a number of options which would maintain a fourconstituency Belfast, however, these would all have required substantial extensions of the Belfast constituency boundaries into adjacent rural areas and settlements outside the city. The Commission therefore proposes 3 constituencies for Belfast.
- 11. Having looked at a range of constituency groupings, the Commission noted that the 5 western constituencies of Fermanagh and South Tyrone, West Tyrone, Mid Ulster, Foyle and East Londonderry amounted to 4.2 seats. They therefore propose that 4 seats should be delineated for this part of the region.
- 12. There is only one split ward, namely Derryaghy, which was split at the Fifth Review of Parliamentary Constituency Boundaries in 2008 between Belfast West (Derryaghy North) and Lagan Valley (Derryaghy South). The Commission saw no reason to depart from this.
- 13. The following table shows the 16 proposed constituencies together with the variance from the UK electoral quota and the NI electoral average.
