#### ANNOTATIONS TO THE PROVISIONAL AGENDA

#### **INTRODUCTION**

- 1. The Conference of the Parties to the Convention on Biological Diversity, in paragraph 9 (1) of decision X/33, requests the Executive Secretary to "compile and synthesize available scientific information, and views and experiences of indigenous and local communities and other stakeholders, on the possible impacts of geo-engineering techniques on biodiversity and associated social, economic and cultural considerations, and options on definitions and understandings of climate-related geo-engineering relevant to the Convention on Biological Diversity".
- 2. Accordingly, the Executive Secretary, with the generous financial contribution from the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, convened a Liaison Group Meeting on Climate-Related Geo-engineering as it relates to the Convention on Biological Diversity, in London, from 29 June 1 July, 2011.
- 3. A draft study<sup>2</sup> was prepared and made available for technical and stakeholder peer review from 11 November to 9 December 2011.
- 4. Thanks to the generous financial support from the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, the Informal Expert Meeting on the Impacts of Climate-related Geo-engineering on Biological Diversity is being convened with the task to assist the Secretariat of the Convention on Biological Diversity in preparing the second draft of the study and filling the gaps in the study, for general peer review, including by the Convention on Biological Diversity focal points.
- 5. The final version of the study will be prepared for consideration by the sixteenth meeting of the Subsidiary Body on Scientific, Technical and Technological Advice (SBSTTA 16).

#### ITEM 1. OPENING OF THE MEETING AND ORGANIZATION OF WORK

- 6. The meeting will be opened at 8.30 am on Thursday, 5 January 2012. The Chair and a representative of the Secretariat of the Convention on Biological Diversity will welcome the participants and make opening statements.
- 7. After a brief self-introduction by the participants, the meeting will be invited to consider the provisional agenda prepared by the Executive Secretary (UNEP/CBD/LGCRG/ENG/2/1), adopt it
