What is #OCCUPYWALLSTREET:

Occupy Wall Street (OWS) is a leaderless people-powered movement for democracy that began in America on September 17 with an encampment in the financial district of New York City. Inspired by the Egyptian Tahrir Square uprising and the Spanish acampadas, we vow to end the monied corruption of our democracy. Our protests are against social and economic inequality, high unemployment, greed, corruption, and the undue influence of corporations—particularly from the financial services sector—on government.

People from all across the United States of America and the world have come to protest the blatant injustices of our times perpetuated by the economic and political elites. On October 6th individuals of Austin rose up against political disenfranchisement and social and economic injustice. We spoke out, resisted, and successfully occupied. Today, we proudly remain, constituting ourselves as autonomous political beings engaged in non-violent civil disobedience and building solidarity based on mutual respect, acceptance, and love. It is from these reclaimed grounds that we say to all Americans and to the world, Enough! How many crises does it take? We are the 99% and we have moved to reclaim our mortgaged future.

"This movement is about economic security. We demand effective reforms to prevent banks and financial institutions from causing future economic crises."


"This movement is about corporate responsibility. We demand strict repercussions for corporations and institutions who cause serious financial damage to our country and its taxpayers."

"This movement is about financial fairness. We demand tax reforms to ensure that corporations and the wealthy pay their fair share in taxes."




