New sounds, ideas and styles in music are often preceded by innovations in instruments and music technology. Just think of garage rock without fuzz boxes or hip-hop without samplers and beat boxes: about as exciting as the sound of one hand clapping! More often than not those innovations are based on some earlier technologies and products. For example the crystal radio "rocks" from the early 20th century first retuned as diodes and then as transistors, extinguishing the fire of tubes that had ruled the world of amplification for several decades. It only took about 30 years for people to realize that for many applications tubes actually sounded

better, and the fires were lit again. The Now Sound depends heavily on unearthing forgotten diamonds.

Our humble hunt for pirate treasure that began with crate digging has now reached a point where a group of masters help us to not only find and polish rare jewels but to resurrect studio booty that never existed before. Let's go back in time, shall we?

1952 HELSINKI OLYMPICS

The 1940 Helsinki Olympics were replaced by a far deadlier competition between the countries of the world, but finally in 1952 the XV Olympic Games, sometimes called "the last real Olympics", were held in Helsinki. The Finnish national public-broadcasting company YLE developed a high quality outdoor production mixer UTV-652 to meet the national and also the international broadcasting needs of the games. We are the lucky owners of the only working UTV-652 in the world, restored and modified for modern studio use by Joni Vesanen.



Jimmy Page, Tom Jones, Richie Blackmore, David Bowie, Mitch Mitchell, Screaming Lord Sutch and Gene Vincent are just a few of the artists he captured on tape with his unique recording techniques that were unparalleled and continue inspiring creative producers around the world. Meek applied compression and distortion on pretty much everything, and one of his secret weapons (less secret now thanks to us!) was a modified RCA Orthophonic hi-fi preamplifier that Meek called a 'cooker', used especially for vocal processing. Our RCA is still a stock model, but we will unleash Mr. Vesanen on the poor thing very soon.


Leaded Crystal Prism

The company S. G. Brown Ltd was formed in 1910 at a small workshop in Houndsditch. Their mechanical amplifier (a magnet system driving a carbon microphone) was first manufactured during WW1 (1914-18) for the British Army. The use of a unit required an approval from the Postmaster General.





developed by Victorian Machines, and turned the original idea into a unique studio device: Aether Modulator. It converts sounds to magnetism and back to sounds, but with very unpredicatble results.

The Psychical Predictor, probably the strangest of all Pepe tools, is an offshoot of a secret "invisibility cloak" project run by Nikolai Tesla and Professor A.D. Conrow at Niagara Falls. Invented by Professor Conrow to communicate with his wife who was killed by X-ray radiation, this apparatus allows the user to contact the "other side" and receive simple "YES", "NO" and "ASK LATER" replies from a "spirit operator". Built by Victorian Machines.

An unhelpful spirit will give just "Ask Later" responses.


