The participants of the chat meeting suggest that this "wave" kicks off with co-ordinated protests in some regions of the world – for example the huge "day of action" in the U.S.A. on **October 7**th and the occupations in schools across Italy, which are expected to begin in the middle of October.

For groups elsewhere, especially in North America, the beginning of November seems to be a good time for actions. Therefore, they could join "the wave" at that stage.

The idea is, that the globally co-ordinated protests reach their peak during the week of the "International Students' Day" [Nov. 17th], which is **Nov. 15-21st**. Groups in Sierra Leone, the Philippines, Italy and the Kosovo already confirmed, that they will have protests during that week.

As part of the "Day of United Symbolic Actions" groups in various cities such as Freetown, Jakarta, Kathmandu, Manila, Marburg, Moscow, Prishtina, Samara, San Juan, St. Petersburg, Yogyakarta and Wilhelmshaven publicly announced the upcoming "Global Wave of Action for Education" through symbolic actions on June 16th. In addition a draft for a worldwide press release was published.

The "global wave" is an opportunity to strengthen the network between activists and groups worldwide and show that we stand united in our struggle for free and emancipatory education which is accessible to all. It has the potential to inspire and unite people around the world, as well as help to spread awareness by showing that our struggle is of global nature. The long timeframe [October – November] gives more groups the opportunity to join and be part of this protest.

A "united symbol" in combination with a "joint statement" will help to create a framework connecting all the different actions and protests during the timeframe.
