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# Counterinsurgency SITREP - 18 February 2009

#### **Director's Comments:**

Would like to apprise you of a recent organizational change that will impact across the greater COIN, Stability Ops, & Security Force Assistance fields of interest. On 22 Jan 09, Commander, Combined Arms Center (CAC) was designated as the Army Proponent for **Stability Operations (SO)** and **Security Force Assistance (SFA)**. The COIN Center will serve as the initial nucleus of both SO & SFA Proponent Offices and will focus on integration, coordination, and collaboration with Joint, Interagency, Intergovernmental, & Multinational partners to effectively address complex challenges in support of a comprehensive approach to winning the current fight. One the first priorities of this Proponency initiative is to rapidly put *Security Force Assistance* doctrine into the hands of troops in the field. In that light, I'd like to pass on the following request to you from the CAC Commander:

"Team -- we would appreciate your assistance and support in refining the attached draft <a href="Field Manual Interim">Field Manual Interim</a>, <a href="FMI 3-07.1">FMI 3-07.1</a>, <a href=""Security Force">"Security Force</a>
<a href="Assistance."</a> We are on a tight timeline to produce this FMI and provide it as rapidly as possible to those who need it. This doctrine provides a framework for Army forces to conduct SFA within the construct of full spectrum operations. It addresses the operational and tactical levels, while focusing on the brigade combat team conducting security force assistance and advising. The suspense to return comments to our lead authors is 4 March. We would ask for a thorough review of this Draft as we do not plan to do multiple reviews. Please feel free to share this Draft with whomever else you think would have an interest in this subject. ### INTEGRATION.

- COIN Triad Implementation Status:
  - Conducted CALL CSTC-A Theater Observation Detachment (TOD) Embed Training (12 Feb)
  - Continue to collect POIs from organizations providing COIN training and post them in <u>COIN Knowledge Center</u>. If your organization has a COIN training program that we should be aware of please contact <u>MAJ Niel</u> Smith.
  - HQ ISAF 27 Dec 08 FRAGO on Mandatory COIN Training: Recent ISAF FRAGO 442- 2008 tasks CTC-A with training and education requirements for Coalition and ANSF units in Afghanistan.
- **GEN Dempsey Roundtable (26 Jan):** Central theme: "Win the fight that we are in and maintain the all volunteer force"
  - Great fan of FM 7.0 because it allows commanders to focus on tasks they need to emphasize given their specific mission (CMTEL/DMETL); school houses should use same principals to focus their POIs.
  - Need to reduce "bubbles and redundancies" that exist in TRADOC
- Monthly COIN Integration Mtg/DCO (29 Jan): COIN Integration DCO (to coordinate key efforts in COIN COI and share lessons learned from Iraq and Afghanistan theaters) had 40 participants including: COIN CFE Iraq, CTC-A, CGSC CTAC, HQDA Strategies and Programs, AWG, JSOU, USSOCOM, WOCC, TRISA, JFCOM IW Center, CAC G3, JIEDDO JSOE, USASOC, BCTP Ops Group B, ONI IW Center & LNOs from Canada, Netherlands, France, Australia, Japan, & UK. Complete briefings <a href="https://example.com/here/cac/here/">here (CAC Access)</a>. Key topics of discussion:
  - Iraq Lessons Learned Highlights:
    - Successful BCTs employ comprehensive approach emphasizing multiple LOEs (Securing the Population, HN Force Development, Governance, Economics) at all echelons.
    - Tension between two LOEs: (1) Conduct security operations and (2) Develop host-nation forces: default COA for every operation should be for ISF to conduct the operation, with the US unit behind the scenes teaching and coaching on planning and preparation, and to a lesser extent, on the execution.
    - Identify Drivers of Instability and Focus Efforts to Eliminate Them: Successful units conduct holistic assessments of human terrain and infrastructure to identify grievances and fault lines that drive instability across all LOEs.
  - CTC-A outlined their training methodology, assessment concerns WRT implementing shape/clear/hold/build, and posed a list of simple yet important questions that each unit should answer.
    - Is your Mission population, terrain, or enemy focused?
    - What is the difference between partnering and mentoring? What are you going to be doing?

 CTC-A will host conference for COIN training stakeholders in Kabul in April.

## **ADVISORY, EDUCATIONAL, & ASSISTANCE VISITS**

- 1st Army (West) COIN Leaders' Workshop (13-15 Jan): Conducted COIN Workshop at Fort Carson, CO, for 90 First Army (West) trainers responsible for predeployment COIN instruction for Reserve and Guard units. Workshop modules included: COIN Principles, Imperatives, Paradoxes; Understanding Operational Environment; Understanding Insurgencies; Leadership and Ethics in COIN; and COIN Training Resources. Practical exercises focused on FM 3-24 analysis and application of workshop material to participants' training mission. Next step: conduct COIN workshop for First Army (East) at Fort Meade, MD, from 9-12 Feb to enable trainers for non-landowning, non-BCT reserve component units. For more information contact MAJ Niel Smith.
- Independent Election Commission of Afghanistan (IEC) RFI: COIN Center
  Deputy Director responded to IEC Security Advisor's RFI on security focus for
  Afghanistan elections. IEC reports that some Taliban elements in East, when
  confronted by Afghans who were registering, put down their weapons and
  registered in record numbers indicating a desire of some insurgent groups to
  partake in Afghan political process. In contrast, Western Taliban elements have
  vowed to shut down Voter Registration and Elections in 2009.
- JFC Brunssum CREVAL Working Group (27-28 Jan): At NATO's request, COIN Center Deputy Director presented "Principles of COIN" to Combat Readiness Evaluation Working Group (CREVAL) at JFC HQ Brunssum. Purpose of working group was to establish combat readiness evaluation standards and criteria for Non-Article 5 operations for NATO/ISAF units. Criteria to be used for all NATO units, from Battalion to Corps level, deploying on operations with respect to COIN, include:
  - Conduct JIIM planning to address root causes of an insurgency.
  - Plan and conduct military operations to counter insurgent strategy, tactics, techniques and procedures.
  - Within assigned AOR, plan and execute intelligence-driven information and communications operations.
  - Perform intelligence preparation of the operational environment.
  - Establish control measures in order to isolate insurgents from population.

This endeavor was first COIN education for many key staff officers at JFC HQ Brunssum and SHAPE HQ. Next step: CREVAL Working Group to formalize criteria in Oberammergau in April.

   Assessment to Congress: "Successes have allowed Coalition forces to transition primary security responsibility to the ISF and shift focus to governance and capacity building in the majority of the country."
- Human Terrain System Handbooks: <u>Human Terrain Team Handbook</u>, Commander's Handbook
- Afghanistan Special Study: Operational level study conducted from Dec 2008-Jan 2009 by two ILE Staff Groups to develop course of action recommendation for Afghanistan Campaign Plan. Recommended COA centered on building Afghanistan National Security Force (ANSF) capability. Strengths of this COA identified as: Legitimacy (ANSF focus ties to original ISAF mandate); Perseverance (legitimacy strengthens resolve of member nations); Transitionability (ANSF is the long-term solution for Afghan security). Major challenges to success in Afghanistan identified as ethnic differences, lack of security throughout the country, incorporation of tribal system into concept of central government, and poppy/drug production and trafficking that dominates Afghanistan's economy.   - Complex problem: collusion among Al Qaeda, the Taliban, narcotraffickers, and criminal gangs.
  - Internal balance between centralized and traditional power centers is key to reaching the desired end state: sustainable system of governance that can provide adequate security for the Afghan people.
- Quadrennial Roles and Missions Review Report (29 Jan 09): Report, signed by SecDef concludes that "we must improve our soft power: our national ability to promote economic development, institution-building and the rule of law, internal reconciliation, good governance, training and equipping indigenous military and police forces, strategic communications, and more." In addition, a whole-ofgovernment approach is necessary to improving US soft power.

 Iraq vs. Afghanistan Discussions: Discussion on lessons learned and strategy in Iraq and Afghanistan continues. Interesting perspectives include:

- Forget the Lessons of Iraq warns "...Relying on the experience in just one kind of conflict to redefine America's military carries the dangerous potential to have the nation learn the harsh lessons of defeat on tomorrow's battlefields where the enemy chooses not to fight as Iraqi insurgents did."
- Unintended Consequences of COIN "My concern about the current COIN fixation is that by redesigning our military to better fight the last wars (insurgencies), at the expense of different future ones (interstate conflicts), we may invite the very thing the COIN strategists seem to be betting won't emerge: namely, the rise of a peer competitor that is not content just to play the peaceful role of a responsible stakeholder."

- Canadian Forces Land Force Command and Staff College Commandant Visit (22 Jan): Canadian Forces Land Force Command and Staff College Commandant Col Lewis met with COIN Center Deputy Director in order to find ways to integrate COIN training into Canadian Army's officer education process.
- STRATCOM Fusion Team Meeting (23 Jan): U.S. Department of State's
   Strategic Communications Fusion Team presented Drs. Sebastian Gorka and
   David Kilcullen. Discussion centered on narrative conflict with al-Qaeda,
   including relative cohesiveness of al-Qaeda narrative, challenges and
   implications of the new media environment, and potential lessons from Cold War
   information engagement practices.
- LTG (FR) Raffenne (2 Feb): COIN Center hosted French Army Lieutenant General (ret) J.P. Rafenne for his presentation "Can We Learn Lessons from History? Battle of Algiers 1957/Battle of Baghdad 2007, Irak War 2003/Algerian War 1954–1962." Lt. Gen. Rafenne presented a comparison of the Iraq War

- (2003–present) and the Algerian War (1954–62), asking if we are able to retain the counterinsurgency lessons that history teaches.

Panel members were: Ms. Shameem Rassam and Mr. Farhad Pazhwak, senior analysts at International Research Center; Ms. Nancy Youssef, chief Pentagon correspondent for McClatchy newspapers; and Professor Dennis Murphy, Director of Information in Warfare Group, Center for Strategic Leadership, U.S. Army War College.
- JFCOM JIWC Update: Joint Irregular Warfare Center (JIWC) established by 14 Jan DoD Memorandum. POC: COIN Center JIWC embed John Moulton.
- COIN/FID/IW/Stab Ops Exercise and Conference Highlights:
  - O IW Support Group Project Starfish Meeting (26-27 Jan): JFCOM-led Project STARFISH Irregular Warfare training meeting in Crystal City, VA from 26-27 Jan included participants from across DoD to develop a proposed virtual and physical action plan to share IW related educational curricula across services, government agencies, and academia. Joint Irregular Warfare Center (JIWC) will lead in developing further resources for IW curriculum and knowledge exchange.
  - Upcoming DC-based Planner Training Course (9-13 Mar): CMIC, CGSC, and DOS/ Political Military Affairs coordinating for DC-based Planner Training Course for DOS employees. Syllabus Planner's Course will include Humanitarian Assistance and Peace Enforcement scenarios.
