These breakdowns, e.g. 'South Australia', are subject to greater sampling variation than the national estimates and should be treated with caution. Note that the figures for all states are based on small sample sizes – for example South Australia is based on around 85 interviews (margin of error of +/-11%), Western Australia is based on on around 300 interviews (margin +/- 7%), Victoria is based on around 250 interviews (margin +/- 6%) and NSW on around 320 interviews (margin +/- 5%). Interviews were also conducted in Tasmania and the ACT (around 20 to 30 in each location, margin +/- 20%) but are not shown separately in this table. South Australia data includes the Northern Territory. The maximum margin of error for the national estimates is approximately +/-3.1%.
