The festival, which began on Tuesday, July 16, and wraps up today, is themed "*Unleashing Human Potential: Reinventing Communities, Business, and Education.*"

On Wednesday, July 17, Ambassador Urrutia participated in a <u>symposium</u>, themed "*Reinventing Communities and How We Live,*" on ways to create more affordable, reliable and efficient systems that produce happier and healthier societies.
