Gun owners support common-sense public safety measures – in contrast to public perception.



- Gun owners – including significant majorities of NRA members – support laws protecting public safety.

- Gun owners believe personal freedom and public safety can — and should — coexist.

Gun owners believe 2nd Amendment rights and public safety laws can coexist.

Support for 2nd Amendment rights goes hand-in-hand with keeping illegal guns out of the hands of criminals.

Gun owners' knowledge of existing laws is tenuous.

Over half (53%) of non-NRA members and 57% of NRA members believe the statement, "Everyone who wants to buy a gun has to pass a background check to complete the purchase" is true.

Methodology

We polled 945 gun owners nationwide (margin of error \pm 3%) in May 2012.

The sample was divided evenly by gun owners who were current or lapsed members of the NRA, and non-NRA gun owners.
