





Its findings show that the household wealth of the top 10% of the population stands at £853,000, which is over 100 times higher than that of the bottom 10%'s £8,800 or below; while those in the top 1% each possess total household wealth of £2.6m or more.

Poorest incomes fall £9 a week

Since 2007, the poorest 10% of households have seen weekly incomes fall by £9 a week, while those in the

richest 10% of homes have enjoyed a £45 a week increase. Overall, the poorest 20% saw real income fall by 2.6% in the very low levels of corporation tax. Ending the tax relief on three years to 2007-08, while those in the top fifth of the pension contributions from incomes over £100,000 a year, income distribution enjoyed a rise of 3.3%.
