

OPPORTUNITIES FOR LAW PLACEMENTS

Everything you learn with us has direct links to the workplace and your future career. For students studying law and justice, the Victoria Law School offers the following workplace programs:

MAGISTRATES' COURT PROGRAM

Second and third-year students can get involved in rosters at Melbourne, Sunshine and Werribee Magistrates' Courts – an opportunity provided through our partnership with Victoria Legal Aid.

FAMILY LAW INTERNSHIPS

Through our partnership with Victoria Legal Aid, you have the opportunity to participate in a six-month work placement with their Family Law Division, helping families resolve disputes and achieve safe and enduring care arrangements for children.

SUPREME COURT AND COUNTY COURT INTERNSHIP PROGRAMS

With the support of some of Victoria's most respected judges, students have the opportunity to gain a practical and detailed understanding of court proceedings.

SUNSHINE YOUTH LEGAL CENTRE

Staffed by VU's third and fourth-year students, the Centre provides young people with free legal advice and referrals. You will gain hands-on experience with real cases.

INTERNATIONAL MOOTING SUCCESS

Victoria Law School is equipping graduates for success through its world-class moot program. The moot courts at our City Queen Campus give students an opportunity to simulate proceedings, draft written appellate submissions and present legal arguments.

Our students have many opportunities to participate in moot competitions both locally and internationally. The VU team received the coveted Champion of the Moot Shanghai 2014, beating out 28 teams from law schools in 11 countries including the US and countries across Europe and Asia.

The team's achievement put VU at the top of participating law schools, which included Loyola University Chicago, Singapore Management University, University of Helsinki and the University of Cologne.



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FLEXIBILITY

THE VU MODEL OF TERTIARY EDUCATION

The VU Model provides opportunities for students from a wide range of backgrounds to achieve success on their own terms.

The VU model features work-integrated learning options, tailored learning support, plus flexible pathways and various entry and exit points between a tailored range of courses, including:

- largely accessible Bachelor degrees aimed at students who may be unsure about which study specialisations to follow, or require additional support while transitioning from vocational education

LAW AND JUSTICE FACILITIES

Our Victoria Law School at City Queen Campus is in the heart of Melbourne's legal and business district, surrounded by courts, law firms and legal practitioners. Students have easy access to the courts and professional law libraries because they are literally just down the street. This is particularly relevant for students participating in our Magistrates' Court, County Court and Supreme Court programs. These programs provide valuable grassroots insight into, and observation of, the criminal justice system in action.

OUR LEGAL CONNECTIONS

Our close relationships with courts, legal services and law firms provide many unique placement and volunteering options. Students can gain clinical, hands-on experience through work placements at the Sunshine and Werribee Magistrates' Courts, Victoria Legal Aid and Sunshine Youth Legal Centre. These experiences help students develop skills that allow them to make a difference to the lives of real people.

MOOT COURTS AND LAW LIBRARY

Our two high-tech moot courts at City Queen Campus give students an opportunity to participate in simulated proceedings, draft appellate submissions and present legal arguments. Mooting skills give students a significant professional advantage by equipping them for success in the real world.

The City Queen Law Library has large loans and reserve collections. Students also have access to a number of professional law libraries in Melbourne's legal precinct.

CITY QUEEN CAMPUS

As with all VU campuses, City Queen has student lounges and informal learning spaces. The Campus is also conveniently located near public transport. While there is no car parking on Campus, you can use our VU Carpool Program to make car-sharing arrangements with fellow students or staff who have similar travel needs.

CROSS-CAMPUS FACILITIES

As well as our City Queen Campus, VU has two other campuses in Melbourne's CBD and five across the western suburbs. All campuses are easily accessed by public transport.

INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY

We have nearly 4000 computers spread across our campuses and in all campus libraries. A central IT helpdesk is available to answer all queries and provide assistance regarding PCs and Macs, software and email use.

Students have access to a rich collection of online resources, 24 hours a day, seven days a week. These include databases or material housed within the library, student email, e-learning content for courses, student software packages and innovative social networking tools.

FEES AND ASSISTANCE

IMPORTANT FEE INFORMATION

Victoria University course fees will remain at pre-Commonwealth Government 2014 Budget levels for all students who enrol prior to 31 December 2014, before fee deregulation begins on 1 January 2016. This ensures that all students who have, or will enrol in a VU course in 2014 will be able to complete their undergraduate course at the same pre-budget fee level.

VOCATIONAL EDUCATION/TAFE FEES

As a vocational education (TAFE) student at Victoria University, the fee you pay will depend on what course you enrol in and the units you study.

VE/TAFE students may be eligible for a government subsidy as well as a concession to help with their tuition fees. The University also offers eligible students the option to pay their tuition fees via instalments.

HIGHER EDUCATION FEES

COMMONWEALTH SUPPORTED PLACES

Course fees for all domestic undergraduate students are shared between students and the Australian Government. The Government portion is called a Commonwealth Supported Place (CSP).

The following table shows the maximum student contributions for 2014 admissions for a year of full-time study. These amounts are indexed each year, but the actual amount will depend on the units a student enrols in.

POSTGRADUATE COURSEWORK DEGREE FEES

The University does not receive any government funding for postgraduate coursework student places, and students pay the full cost of their course. This is called a fee-paying place. Tuition fees are based on the units studied, rather than a fixed price for each course. Different units have different costs.

POSTGRADUATE RESEARCH STUDENT FEES

Research degree students who are Australian citizens or permanent residents of New Zealand DO NOT pay any tuition fees.

ASSISTANCE

There are many options available to help students with the costs involved in studying at university.

HECS-HELP is the Australian Government's Higher Education Loan Program for students studying in a Commonwealth Supported Place. It allows Australian students to borrow the amount of their course fee contribution and then pay back the loan once they are in the workforce. Students can also pay their contribution up-front and receive a discount.

FEE-HELP is a government loan program that enables eligible students to defer the payment of their tuition fees.
