4 MAY WHAT HAPPENS WHEN WE SLEEP?

Why we need sleep, night sky, the moon, why we have night and day, people who work at night, night animals.

Fits in with the International Year of Light and National Primary

LA: CROSS CURRICULAR — (Science, Social Sciences, Health and PE, Enalish. The Arts)

2 NOVEMBER AMAZING BUTTERFLIES

Butterflies and other flying insects, including monarch butterflies, cicadas, dragonflies, life cycles, grouping. An exciting topic and an ideal topic to cover as the days get warmer and more insects start appearing.

3 MARCH TANGAROA'S TREASURES

Life on the rocky shore, interdependence and change, seashore code, Tangaroa — God of the sea, tikanga, kai moana, tracking trash, action planning, surveys and data gathering.

Seaweek 28 February — 8 March. LA: CROSS-CURRICULAR — (Science, Social Sciences, Mathematics and Statistics)

31 MARCH OUR AWESOME COMMUNITY

Our local and school community, maps, graphing, surveys; helping our community, e.g. community gardens, beach and river clean-ups, planting stream banks. LA: SOCIAL SCIENCES and Environmental Education (Links to Maths, Health and P.E.)

5 MAY HOT WIRED!

Invisible forces, how electricity works, circuits, how we use it, experiments with electricity, conserving electricity, safety around electricity. Fits in with the International Year of Light and National Primary Science Week.

LA: SCIENCE (Physical world - Links: Health + P.E.)

2 JUNE ON THE MARAE

Marae protocol, the importance of the marae, key feature buildings and associated stories, the iwi, hau kainga (custodial people), powhiri protocol, learning some te reo Māori. Māori Focus Month. LA: SOCIAL SCIENCES and Te Reo Māori, The Arts.

30 JUNE KITCHEN SCIENCE

Changes when mixing, heating, and cooling food; cooking and chemical changes in food, e.g. bread, pizza dough, yeast, yoghurt, popcorn; fun and simple experiments with food.

LA: SCIENCE (Links: Technology, Social Sciences; maths).

28 JULY KITES, ROCKETS & PLANES

Flight and how it happens, movement and forces, flight experiments, making their own kite, rocket, plane; What the latest air carriers are like; Future flight. LA: SCIENCE (Links to Technology, The Arts).

25 AUGUST THE WRAP ON PLASTIC

How plastic is made, what we use it for, the effect on our environment, plastic ocean, alternatives to plastic, sifting and sorting, recycling and reusing, trash to flash (Wearable Arts), shopping smarter. LA: ENVIRONMENTAL EDUCATION (Links: Science, Technology, The Arts).

3 NOVEMBER HIVES ALIVE!

Honey bees, their importance to us and plants, pollination, making honey, beekeepers at work, health properties of honey, threats to NZ bees, investigating bees. Conservation Week – first week of November. LA: CROSS CURRICULAR (Links: Science, Health and PE; Social Sciences).

1 DECEMBER WEIRD & DANGEROUS ANIMALS

A very exciting topic for kids, looking at strange and dangerous mammals enabling them to "recognise that there are many different living things in the world and that they can be grouped in different ways" - Science curriculum. LA: SCIENCE.

17 FEBRUARY HOWZAT!? (CRICKET WORLD CUP)
