	brought some 300 postdoc fellows to the members since its inception.
	• The renowned Cor Baayen Award , presented each year to a promising young researcher in
	computer science and applied mathematics.
	• ERCIM News, a quarterly magazine with a circulation of 9000 copies, as well as free on-line
	access, providing a forum for the exchange of information between the institutes and also with
	 the wider scientific community. Cooperation with professional bodies, specifically with the European Mathematical Society
	(EMS), the European Telecommunications Standards Institute (ETSI), and the European Sci-
	ence Foundation (ESF). Additionally ERCIM is a founder-member of the European Forum for
