Networking Opportunities

- Five times annually the ACT-IAC membership meetings provide an update on the organization, a speaker or panel on a hot topic and a networking reception — and it is free to all members
- Matchmaking sessions provide your company the opportunity to share capabilities and innovative solutions with Federal Government Agency and Prime Contractor representatives
- Program events and conferences throughout the year provide excellent venues to build and nurture new relationships

Shared Interest Groups

- SIGs and working groups allow government and industry to work together on high priority issues to develop best practices, new solutions and innovative strategies
- Shared Interest Groups include: Acquisition Management, Collaboration and Transformation, Cybersecurity, Emerging Technology, Human Capital, Networks and Telecommunications, and Planning and Architecture
- Working Groups include the Advanced Mobility Working Group and Cloud Computing Working Group

Program Events & Forums

- Each month ACT-IAC hosts 2-3 program events for industry and government — each program generally runs 2-3 hours and focuses on specific agency initiatives, policy issues, programs or upcoming acquisitions
- Forums are half day to full day events intended to be outcome-based and produce results that have value for the government IT community

Marquee Events



- Draws approximately 400 attendees each year, almost half of which are government employees
- Co-sponsored by ACT-IAC and GSA
- This event addresses acquisition related issues and provides training for the Acquisition Workforce



- Established in 2007 as a forum for addressing the needs of many small businesses in the government IT community
- Features matchmaking sessions with government and large businesses
- Attendance has grown to around 500



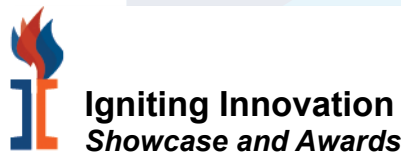
- ACT-IAC's longest running conference, created in 1980
- This event brings together government and industry executives interested in change management
- With a unique workshop approach this conference draws between 400 and 500 attendees



- The premier event in the government IT community
- Brings together senior executives from government and industry for collaboration on strategic issues
- Attendance is limited to 850 attendees

ACT-IAC Academy and Professional Development

- ACT-IAC Academy currently offers 10 courses with an emphasis on collaboration, experiential learning and sharing of real world examples among government and industry
- Our Professional Development Leadership Programs are tailored specifically to the phase individuals have reached in their career
- **Partners** targets senior level executives and **Voyagers** targets mid-level employees. These are annual programs where government and industry executives are paired together to participate in a 10-month leadership development program
- **Associates** targets employees with less than five years of work experience and provides participants with an introduction to the work environment over a 10-month period of educational meetings, lectures, discussions and collaborative sessions

- With over 80 appointed or elected positions, there are many leadership opportunities available

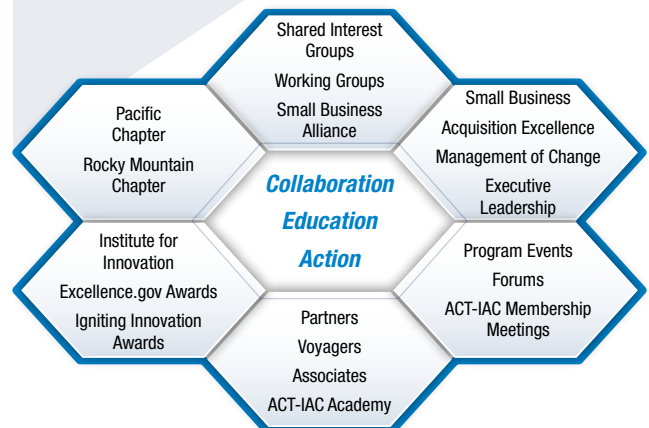
