FAIR GUEST SERVICES

ANIMAL BARN AND PETTING ZOO: Please refrain from eating in the animal barns and remember to wash everyone's hands after touching animals. Please supervise children at all times.

BABY CHANGING STATIONS: Six restrooms are equipped with changing stations and are accessible to both males and females. They are located in buildings #100, #200, #301, #401, #501, #601 and #604.

BUS SERVICE: Enjoy an easy, relaxing ride on a Community Transit bus directly to The Fair's West Gate entrance. Please visit www.communitytransit.org for schedule information or call (425) 353-RIDE (7433).

CASH MACHINES: For your convenience, ATMs are located throughout the Fairgrounds. Please check the Fairgrounds map for specific locations.

CHILD ID BRACELET: Be sure to pick-up a child ID bracelet at the Lost Children's Booth (#407).

FIRST AID & SECURITY STATION: The First Aid and Security Offices are located at the southwest end of the Fairgrounds, by the totem poles – near Frontierland.

INFORMATION BOOTHS: Can't find something? Need some help? You will find Information Booths at the Blue (East) and Red (West) Ticket Entrances. These booths are staffed by the Retired & Senior Volunteer Program (RSVP) members.

LOST AND FOUND: Lost and found articles may be taken to the West Gate # 201. Articles will be held in the Administration Office for 60 days. The lost and found telephone number is (360) 805-6777.

LOST CHILDREN: Lost children and fairgoers are brought to the Lost Children's Station near the Sheriff's Office (#407). Sponsored and staffed by Snohomish County Medical Reserve Corps, the lost Fairgoers are watched over until they are reunited with their families.

PEOPLE MOVERS: Hop aboard one of the free People Movers in the Red (West) or Blue (East) parking lots and ride to the main gates. After you've enjoyed the Fair, catch a ride back to your car. Shuttle stops are located at both the Red (#201) and Blue (#602) Ticket Entrances.

SMOKING: Please abide by all laws and regulations. Smoking tobacco within 25 feet of buildings, vendors or people in line is prohibited. Smoking or consuming marijuana in public is illegal.

SPECIAL NEEDS PATRONS: Disabled parking is available in "Official" Fairgrounds parking lots. Wheelchair rentals are available at Blue and Red information booths located inside the grounds. TTY users: Please dial relay #1-800-833-6388 or 711. Accommodations for people with disabilities will be provided upon request. Please provide two weeks advance notice.

WHEELCHAIR & STROLLER RENTAL: Manual and motorized wheelchairs are available to rent at the Blue and Red Information Booths, from 10am until 10pm, August 27-Sept. 6 and 10am-7pm on September 7. Rates are \$20 for manual wheelchairs; \$45 for motorized wheelchairs (4 hours), plus a security deposit. Strollers and wagons are \$15 per day. Valid ID or security deposit is required and will be retained until rental is returned. Wheelchairs and strollers are rented on a first come-first serve basis. Sorry, no reservations taken. 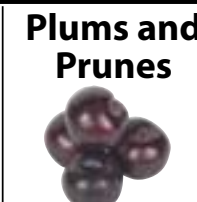

Keep your child safe at the Fair



The Evergreen State Fair is expanding their focus on child-safety by providing some suggestions that will help parents be proactive, to take steps before they leave home for a day at the fair. Searching for a lost child in a crowd of thousands is one of the most terrifying experiences a family can experience. The fair has exceptional safeguards and support in place including providing a "Lost Child Booth" (location #407 on the map) where you can pick up free ID wristbands to help identify your child. The sheriff has a facility on site that they use to monitor surveillance cameras that are placed throughout the fair to help keep track of children. There are also highly trained sheriff officers and

security personnel that patrol the grounds to help provide a family friendly event but this is not enough - your help is needed.

Helping parents and guardians prepare for a kid-safe, worry-free outing to the Evergreen State Fair is at the heart of the "before you leave home checklist" that has been developed with help from Providence Regional Hospital's Safe Kids Snohomish County program and Monroe Public Schools.

Fewer Worries = More Fun

1. Keep Photos on Your Phone & Get Free ID Bracelets at the Fair

Take a close-up photo of your child and a photo of the two of you together and store them on your phone.

- Make a mental note of what your child is wearing and who they're with.

- NEVER have your child's

name displayed on clothing or backpacks.

- Get a free ID bracelet for your child at the fair's Lost Child Booth.

2. Know the Fair's Safe Places & Safe People

Get a map immediately upon entering the fair and locate the Help Center and Lost Child Booth (map on page 2 of this guide).

- Talk with your child about who to ask for help - fair staff, police or fair security.

- Be sure your child knows to not search for you on their own and not to leave the fairgrounds under any circumstances.

- Program your child's cell phone with key contact numbers.

- Tell you child it's OK to call 911 if they get separated from you.

3. Supervise, Supervise, Supervise

Adult supervision is required for children under 12 years old.

- Never leave a child alone in the carnival area. If they go on a ride without you, find a place where you can see them at all times - while they're in line, when they enter the ride and when exiting.

- Older children should stay in groups and use the buddy system.

4. Accompany Your Child to the Restroom

Never let your child enter or stay in the restroom alone. The Events Center has family restrooms that allow you to accompany your child.

- Older children should use the buddy system when using the restroom.

5. Make Tracking Your Child Easy

Dress your child in bright clothing so they're easy to see in crowded areas.

- Avoid becoming separated: walk at a pace that is comfortable for your child and never leave a procrastinating child behind.

- Hold your child's hand; place small children in strollers.

6. Make Contacting You Easy

Make sure your child knows their full name and phone number. Have them practice both saying it out loud and writing it down.

- Write your phone number on a small slip of paper and tuck it in your child's pocket.

7. Be Clear, Be Firm & Practice Together

Children begin to understand appropriate public behavior by age two or three.

- Lead by example.

- Be firm with your rules, and have your child repeat them back to you.

- Reinforce stranger danger rules, and role play strategies for safety.

- Playing Red Light, Green Light is a fun way to help children practice following your directions before the distractions of the fair begin.

8. Stay Together in Parking Lots

Never allow your child to walk or run ahead of you in parking lots.

- Hold your child's hand firmly and be alert when walking in a parking lot.

- Remember that even though you and your child can see a vehicle, the driver may not be able to see you.

9. Have Open, Trust-Building Conversations

Encourage your child to talk with you about any situation that makes them feel uncomfortable. Listen and take them seriously. Report any concern immediately.

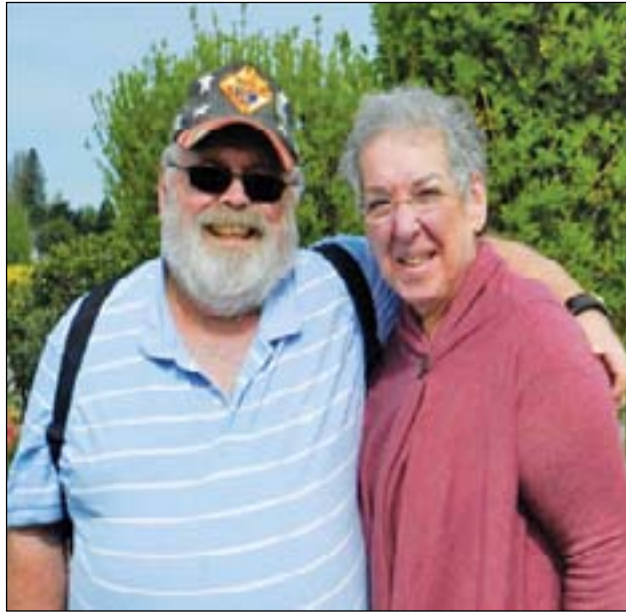
Ed and Vicki Miller 2015 Fair Honorees
