Scrap Baseline Assessment for Reception Children



Petition Secretary of State for Education

The proposals for baseline assessment to be administered to all children in their first few weeks of school would subject children - the majority being only 4years old - to tests so that schools can demonstrate the "value" they add between Reception and Year 6.

The proposed assessments are not a reliable or valid source of data for this purpose, will not improve the quality of schools, and will not benefit children. The tests will not be age-adjusted or reflect that children's development.

Time spent on the assessments will hinder a child settling in at the start of their primary education. Children who perform less well on assessments will be stigmatised and labelled as failing at the start of school. This will also damage the relationship between the school and parents at a crucial early stage. We urge the Secretary of State for Education to abandon Baseline Assessments and reinstate the Early Years Foundation Stage Profile (EYFSP), a rounded assessment of children's development based on observation over time, as a statutory requirement instead.
