Of the important events there was a debate organized in November in the Croatian Parliament on the role of <u>renewable energy in the energy security</u>. In December, a conference was organized for the preparation of projects eligible for EU funding and a workshop in Brussels on the renewable energy cooperation among the countries of the Western Balkans and the European Union.
