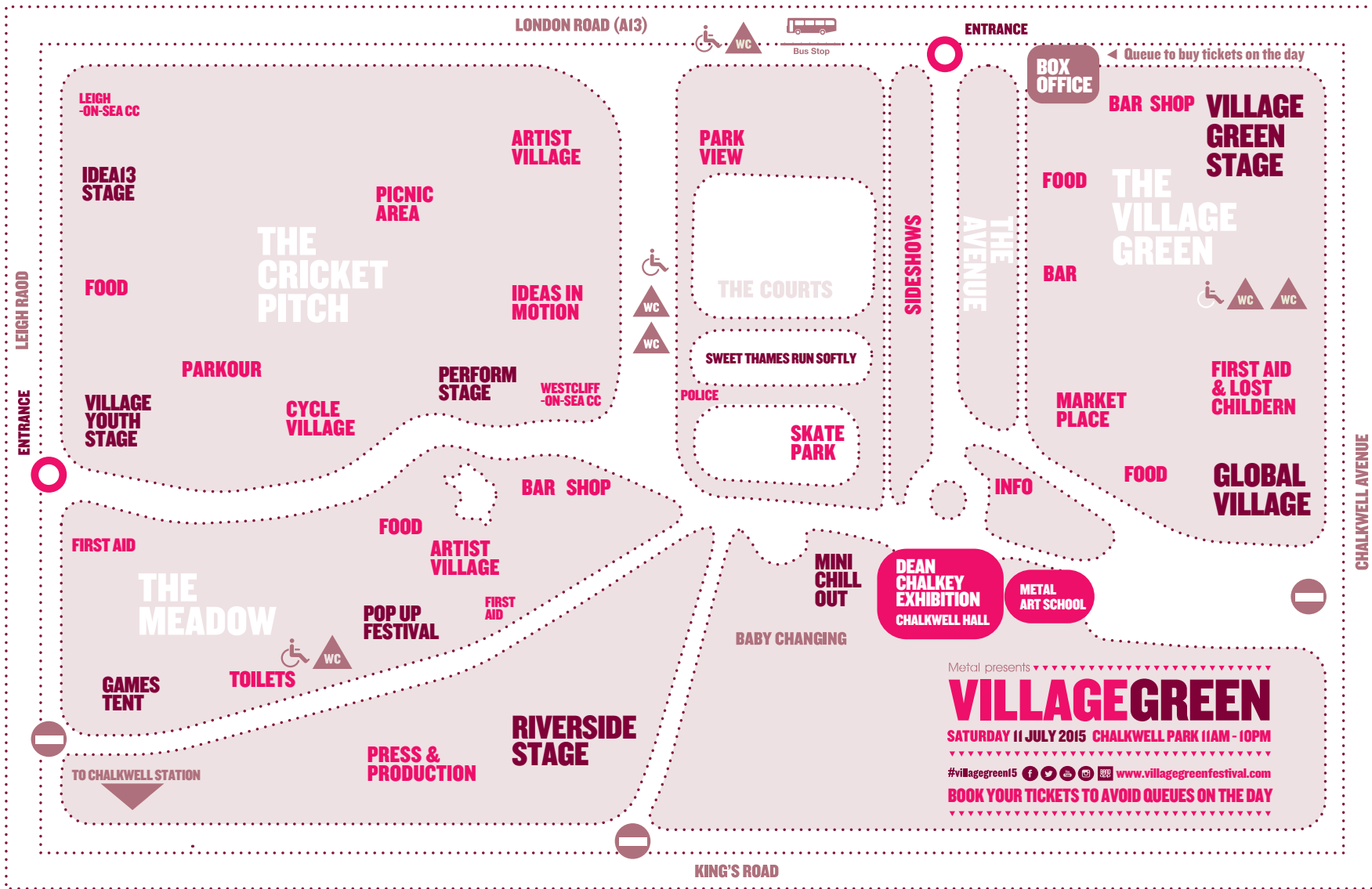

Created as a result of being commissioned by national deafblind charity Sense - a project focusing on the deafblind experience of the world in collaboration with people with sensory loss from around the country.
