Letter from the President

Dear Democrats,

In 2014, the Harvard Dems kicked off the year with an expansion of our committees, helping expand our goal of action-oriented progressive work. We brought guest speakers to campus including Governor Deval Patrick, Governor Christine Gregoire, and Governor Mike Dukakis. We hosted a forum with all five Democratic candidates for Massachusetts' governor and started an **annual award program honoring high-achieving, underprivileged high school leaders** in the Boston and Cambridge public schools. We organized service projects including a book drive that collected over 500 books for the Mann School for the Deaf.

In the fall, we continued to move forward with important progressive work: we held door-to-door canvasses across Massachusetts for candidates up and down the ballot, including Attorney General Maura Healey and Dems' alums U.S. Representative Seth Moulton and State Senator Eric Lesser. We travelled to New Hampshire to re-elect U.S. Senator Jeanne Shaheen and spent a weekend in Maine campaigning through rain and snow for Mike Michaud's campaign for governor. We also held many phone banks for close Senate races, including in North Carolina, New Hampshire, Kentucky, and Georgia, as well as governors' races in Texas, Maine, Wisconsin, and Connecticut, just to name a few.

This year, we'll be building on our organizational success to give members more active roles in the organization. We're planning a series of **interactive panels**, **high-profile speakers**, **skills workshops**, **and service events** that will keep members engaged and give them valuable, concrete, political experience. We're engaging alumni and students to develop lasting connections and friendships, and working to create more connections to alums through internships and mentoring. Now, after elections, we are doing letter-writing campaigns, phone calls and meetings with state and national legislators, and writing op-eds on important issues.

But we can't do any of this without your help, which is why I'm asking you to get involved and stay involved. Join a committee and plan a service event. Help us meet with legislators at the Massachusetts state house and write an op-ed. Attend a skills workshop and contribute to our capital campaign. Because our values are shared, it's **the work done collectively by our members that have made the Dems the largest, most successful partisan organization at Harvard**. We hope we can count on you to continue that tradition of success, and we're excited to work with you!



registered over 500 hours of canvassing. For every volunteer hour, only \$2.08 was spent.

This coming year, we will have more work ahead of us; important legislation on everything from immigration reform, health care, civil rights, campaign finance reform, climate change, and much more will be decided upon both on the national and state level. Every dollar goes directly toward grassroots activism — whether it's organizing leaders on campus, knocking on doors while campaigning for Democrats, or making our voices heard on important issues.
