Dear Friend,

The final arrangements for the demonstration this Friday have been set out below.

We are asking each peace group to ensure that they bring at least 10 cars for the funeral procession. Cars should, if possible, be decorated in suitable fashion.

## IDEAS FOR DECORATION OF CARS :

- black ribbon or streamers.
- N.L.F. flags.
- placards on sides, back or in windows.  
( with slogans or name of organization, etc. )

When arriving at B.P. House there will be someone to direct the cars to what parking facilities there are available. ( See Map.)

The procession will be led by the pall-bearers and other marchers followed by the car-cavalcade. The total distance of the march is about 4 miles. Those people who are marching (that is who do not have cars available) could, perhaps take storm lanterns or torches. People who do not have cars and will have difficulty marching the distance will probably be able to go in someone else's car.

There will be a truck or utility carrying a public address system which will be used by the V.C.C. to announce any last minute directions that are necessary. We will also have our own NON-VIOLENT police force to try and ensure that trouble does not break out and that the police do not follow Mr. Arnold's recent advice.
