Minchinhampton Pony Club Branch, from Gloucestershire, has won a brand new jumps trailer thanks to its nomination by Louise Mills who won the second prize of £1,000 cash.

Taking third prize is Tredegar Farmers Hunt Pony Club Branch, from Cardiff, who thanks to Ian James has won a selection of show jumps. Ian also has reason to celebrate – having won £500 for himself!
