WHY CAPITALISTS HATE THE I.W.W.

Writer in Newspaper Finds Anar chism and Socialism Harmless in Comparison.

The following letter in a New York newspaper is interesting. It explains, in its analysis of the vari-ous social movements, the reason for capitalist hatted against the LW.W.; the latter bodes ill to capitalism:

It is important that in the consideration of grave attacks upon our institutions the public he not misled into regarding as synonymous the names of two classes or types of organized discontent, differing widely in their methods and purposes. The avowed purpose of the revolutionary anarchistic movement is the destruction of all government and the removal of all restraint upon individual action. Their philamorphy-for they have one—is strongly individualistic in its nature.

The members of the I.W.W. on the other hand are collectivists, and as a body do not countenance speradic attempts at violent action, whatever some of their members may do. The propaganda of this organisation is based upon European syndicalism or industrial unboism, i.e., the unionizing of workmen, both skilled and unboism, i.e., the unionizing of workmen into craft unions, of which the American Federation of Labor is the best type in this country.
