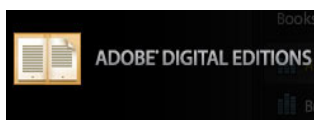


NOOK

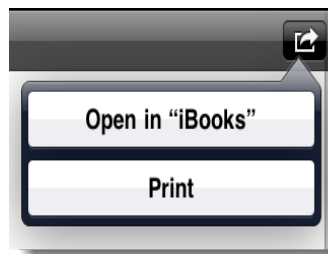
You can view PDFs through the Quickoffice Lite or Reader apps when using Nook Color, Nook Tablet and other newer models. You can choose either one.

Note: With older versions of the Nook, you will need to download the free [Adobe Digital Editions](#) app onto your computer and transfer PDFs from your computer to the Nook via cable. This will store a copy of the PDF on your Nook.



IPAD

Visit our [How To Documentation](#) page and select a PDF to open using your iPad. If PDFs aren't loading properly on your iPad, you can download the free [iBooks](#) app. After downloading the app, you can view a PDF by clicking the "Open in iBooks" tab located at the top right of the screen. Additionally, iBooks automatically saves a copy of the PDF and stores it in your iTunes Book library.



KINDLE

Newer models of the Kindle, including Keyboard and Fire, [natively support](#) the PDF format. To view PDFs on older versions, including Kindle Touch and Kindle 1, you can convert the PDF on your computer to Amazon's AZW file format, then [transfer](#) it onto the Kindle device through a USB cable. This conversion can be done using eBook reader freeware, such as [Stanza](#) or [Mobipocket Creator](#).

Note: You can also email the PDF to Amazon to have the file converted into the AZW format for a small fee. Find your Kindle email address on your "Manage Your Kindle" page on amazon.com.
