Since 1983, Tri-Valley CAREs has strengthened global security by preventing the further development of nuclear weapons and working tirelessly for their elimination. The group was founded by concerned neighbors living around the Lawrence Livermore National Laboratory, one of two locations where all U.S. nuclear weapons are designed. Tri-Valley CAREs monitors nuclear weapons and environmental cleanup throughout the U.S. weapons complex, with a special focus on Livermore Lab and the surrounding Bay Area and Central Valley communities. Our vision for a "green lab" in Livermore provides tangible steps to move the world from reliance on nuclear weapons toward a more sustainable and just future.

OUR MISSION

Tri-Valley CAREs' overarching mission is to promote peace, justice and a healthy environment by pursuing the following five interrelated goals:

- 1. Convert Livermore Lab from nuclear weapons development and testing to socially beneficial, environmentally sound research.
- 2. End all nuclear weapons development and testing in the United States.
- 3. Abolish nuclear weapons worldwide, and achieve an equitable, successful non-proliferation regime.
- 4. Promote forthright communication and democratic decision-making in public policy on nuclear weapons and related environmental issues, locally, nationally, and globally.
- 5. Clean up the radioactive and toxic pollution emanating from the Livermore Lab and reduce the Lab's environmental and health hazards.

PEACE

Because we believe nuclear weapons decrease human security and pose one of the great social, economic and ecological challenges of our time, Tri-Valley CAREs is working to abolish them. Presently the U.S. is spending more money annually for nuclear weapons activities than it did during the height of the Cold War, money that could be better spent to provide basic health care, education, clean water and food for human beings everywhere. We also believe that the global security gained through cooperation is far stronger and more sustainable than that bought through fear.

Some of Tri-Valley CAREs' Projects for Peace

- Producing reports for Congress and the United Nations on the dangers and costs of U.S. nuclear weapons programs
- Educating people about nuclear weapons and their effects on communities, the environment and global security
- Mobilizing public opposition to nuclear weapons and war and bringing the public into contact with decision makers at every level

JUSTICE

Tri-Valley CAREs works to bring justice to those directly affected by the nuclear industry, specifically those who live and work in areas affected by the toxic and radioactive nuclear fuel cycle, such as Livermore. More than 4,000 claims for compensation have been filed by workers at Livermore Lab who are sick or dying from onthe-job exposures. For many of these workers and their families, help comes too late or not at all.

Some of Tri-Valley CAREs' Projects for Justice

- Using the Freedom of Information Act to expose dangers to workers and the community
- Working to strengthen and expedite compensation for sick workers of Livermore Lab
- Facilitating a support group for workers made ill by on the job exposures

ENVIRONMENT

For 30 years Tri-Valley CAREs has been a leading grassroots voice for the environment, winning cleanup of some of the most polluted areas on earth, including at Livermore Lab. Tri-Valley CAREs believes that access to clean water, land and air is a human right.

OUR ACCOMPLISHMENTS PAST AND PRESENT


Here are four examples of the many successes of Tri-Valley CAREs.

- 1. We stopped Livermore Lab from building a massive toxic and radioactive waste incinerator. Further, we led the successful campaign to shut down the Lab's existing incinerator.
- 2. We won improvements in Livermore Lab's program to clean up soil and groundwater contaminated by nuclear weapons research. Recently, we stopped a plan to send 80 million gallons of contaminated groundwater from the Lab into the San Francisco Bay, untreated.
- 3. We played a key role in convincing Congress to stop the funding for two new nuclear bombs that were under development at Livermore Lab, the "Robust Nuclear Earth Penetrator" bomb and the so-called "Reliable Replacement Warhead" Program.
- 4. We challenged plutonium use at Livermore Lab. In doing so, we exposed the Lab's security failures and gathered 14,000 local signatures on a petition. Today, Livermore Lab is no longer authorized to handle, use or store weapons usable quantities of plutonium, calling into question its future role as a "full-service" nuclear bomb design facility.
