



COMMITTEE COSTS HARASSING HILLARY CLINTON: YOUR TAX DOLLARS AT WORK

The American people expect their tax dollars to be used efficiently and not for campaign purposes. That's an essential aspect of the public trust we invest in our elected officials. Unfortunately, but not surprisingly, House Republicans have squandered that public trust through a highly partisan, explicitly political, taxpayer-funded effort to damage Hillary Clinton.

Nowhere is this more evident than in the astronomical cost of the relentless and continuous investigation and re-investigation of the tragedy in Benghazi. Gowdy's committee has already spent more in 2015 than the House Committees on Intelligence, Veterans' Affairs, Ethics, Small Business and Rules. The full cost of the GOP's Benghazi investigations is at least \$20 million, with the operating costs of the first seven congressional investigations unknown.

The Benghazi Investigation Has Cost Taxpayers at Least \$20 Million.





But you know, it's a complicated set of facts. It's a lot of data, and it's a lot of material to review. So the window is pretty narrow. And so I hope literally today, tomorrow, this week, they'll make their choices, and I hope they'll do the right thing. These facts, Hugh, they're not partisan. I'm a veteran. You know, we've got a military that had the opportunity that night to take action. I want to get to the bottom of if they handled that appropriately. So you have lots of agencies, whether that's the State Department, the Department of Defense, the Central Intelligence Agency, all of these various agencies, the White House national security staff, had roles in this, and it's complicated." BROOKS SOUGHT ACCESS TO SERVER AS KEY TO BENGHAZI INVESTIGATION

Susan Brooks argued that access to Hillary Clinton's server was critical to the Benghazi Committee's investigation. BROOKS VOTED TO DEFUND PLANNED PARENTHOOD

Susan Brooks voted to defund Planned Parenthood and touted the vote on her website. "A divided House voted Friday to block Planned Parenthood's federal funds for a year, as Republican leaders labored to keep GOP outrage over abortion from spiraling into an impasse with President Barack Obama that could shut down the government. The House used a nearly party-line 241-187 vote to clear the legislation, which stands little chance of enactment. Senate Democrats have enough votes to block it, and for good measure the White House has



promised a veto. Seven of Indiana's nine U.S. congressional representatives – Jackie Walorski, Marlin Stutzman, Todd Rokita, Susan Brooks, Luke Messer, Larry Bucshon and Todd Young, all Republicans – voted in favor of the bill." [AP via susanbrooks.house.gov, <u>9/21/15</u>]

BROOKS CRITICIZED THE IRAN NUCLEAR DEAL

Susan Brooks invoked the victims of Benghazi and September 11th in a speech opposing the Iran nuclear deal. "I stand today in strong opposition to the Iranian nuclear deal. A deal with Iran, a leading state sponsor of terror. Every day that goes by another story comes out about why we shouldn't support the deal. The head of Iran's military says they will never accept the deal's restrictions on their arms capabilities. The AP recently recovered key verification provisions, buried in a pair of confidential side agreements that congress doesn't even have, that will allow Iran to inspect its own nuclear capabilities. And just last week, the Supreme Leader of Iran changed the rules of the game, saying Iran will not comply with their side of the deal unless sanctions are lifted and not merely suspended. This is a deeply flawed deal and I know we can do better. America is still the most prosperous and powerful country on Earth and the protector of freedom and stability in the world. BROOKS LED FIGHT FOR STATE SANCTIONS AGAINST IRAN TO CONTINUE

Susan Brooks authored a letter to Secretary Kerry to allow states to keep sanctions on Iran, while the federal government suspends sanctions as a part of the nuclear deal. "As the Joint Comprehensive Plan of Action (JCPOA), generally called the Iran nuclear agreement, goes into effect, 61 bipartisan Representatives from 25 states, led by Congresswoman Susan Brooks (R-IN), sent a letter to Secretary of State John Kerry to ensure that states are able to uphold their rights to impose and enforce restrictions against Iran. 'It is critical that we keep remaining sanctions on Iran at the state level, especially as federal sanctions begin to be waived,' Brooks said. 'I'm concerned that this agreement may infringe upon the ability of states, like Indiana, to enforce state sanctions already in place. These sanctions ensure that state pension funds or taxpayer dollars won't go towards funding Iranian terrorism or human rights' abuses." TREY GOWDY LEAKING MISLEADING INFORMATION TO THE PRESS

Trey Gowdy leaked information to press about a subpoena of Hillary Clinton's emails made without consulting Democratic Committee members. "In a letter sent to Chairman Trey Gowdy (R-S.C.) on Friday, the five Democrats on the panel criticized Gowdy for issuing the formal request for documents from Clinton's term as secretary of state without consulting with Democrats and accused the committee of operating as a campaign arm of the Republican National Committee.... 'Issuing this subpoena unilaterally with no deliberation by committee members, leaking information about the subpoena before informing Democratic Members, and providing inaccurate information at a press conference all contribute to a perception that this Committee is now targeting Secretary Clinton for political reasons rather than to clarify any remaining facts relating to the attacks in Benghazi,' the Democrats, led by Rep. Elijah Cummings (D-Md.), wrote." [Politico, <u>3/6/15</u>]

Trey Gowdy's committee doctored email exchanges and leaked them to Politico in order to drive the GOP narrative. "Documents released recently by the Benghazi Select Committee demonstrate that a Member of the Committee, a staffer on the Committee, or someone who has been given access to the Committee's documents inaccurately described to the press email exchanges obtained by the Committee in a way that appeared to further a political attack against former Secretary of State Hillary Clinton. On June 18, 2015, Politico ran a front-page story entitled 'Benghazi Panel Probes Sidney Blumenthal's Work for David Brock.'The anonymous source for this story appears to have been attempting to support a line of political attack...The source apparently took an email that was produced to the Select Committee in February, isolated Secretary Clinton's statement about the White House, removed it from the original email exchange about the presidential debates, and then added it to a different email exchange about Media Matters. The source then apparently misrepresented that the State Department had withheld this new hybrid document from the Select Committee. [Rep. Cummings letter to Chairman Gowdy, 7/6/15]

Trey Gowdy's committee leaked one third of Hillary Clinton's Benghazi emails prior to official release. "The emails set for release, drawn from some 55,000 pages and focused on Libya, have already been turned over to the special House committee investigating the 2012 attacks on the United States outposts in Benghazi. The New York Times has obtained about a third of the 850 pages of emails. They capture the correspondence and concerns expressed among Mrs. Clinton, who was secretary of state at the time, and her advisers following the attacks, which claimed the lives of the American ambassador, J. Christopher Stevens, and three other Americans." [New York Times, <u>5/21/15</u>]

Trey Gowdy's committee may have leaked false information intimating a criminal investigation into Hillary Clinton's use of personal email. "An article and a headline in some editions on Friday about a request to the Justice Department for an investigation regarding Hillary Clinton's personal email account while she was secretary of state misstated the nature of the request, using information from senior government officials. It addressed the potential compromise of classified information in connection with that email account. It did not specifically request an investigation regarding Hillary Clinton's personal email account while she was secretary of state for an investigation regarding Hillary Clinton's personal email account while she was secretary of state referred incorrectly, using information from senior government officials, to the Justice Department for an investigation from senior government officials, to the request. It was a 'security referral,' pertaining to possible mishandling of classified information, officials said, not a 'criminal referral.'" [New York Times correction, 7/23/15]

CITIZENS UNITED COORDINATING WITH THE BENGHAZI COMMITTEE TO SPREAD MISINFORMATION

Citizens United's David Bossie: "My staff communicated with the committee" about emails withheld by State. "One of my staff communicated with the committee and provided them with the Vaughn index and their response was that we don't think we have these,' Bossie said. The emails appear to be responsive to the Rep. Trey Gowdy (R-SC)-led Benghazi Committee's subpoena, the committee thought." [Breitbart, <u>9/23/15</u>]

Citizen's United David Bossie told Politico Benghazi Committee staff informed him that they did not have the emails. "A panel spokesman said he could not immediately confirm which of the documents had been turned over to the committee, but Citizens United President David Bossie told reporters that staffers at the House panel told the group State never produced the records to Congress. 'To the best of their knowledge, they do not have these documents either, even though they are under subpoena for an extended period of time,' Bossie told reporters outside U.S. District Court in Washington on Tuesday after a hearing on the suit." JUDICIAL WATCH FEEDING FALSE INFORMATION TO POLITICO

Judicial Watch released documents purported to show that Hillary Clinton signed off on Huma Abedin's special government employee status. "According to new documents obtained by conservative group Judicial Watch through a Freedom of Information Act lawsuit, the 2016 Democratic frontrunner was the immediate supervisor who approved the position on March 23, 2012, allowing her then-deputy chief of staff to work several jobs at once. That dual role, which wouldn't go into effect until June of that year, is currently under investigation by Senate Judiciary Committee Republican staff. Republicans and outside groups have openly wondered if the post presented a conflict of interest for the woman who is now vice chair of Hillary for America, or if her other jobs influenced what happened at State... 'Hillary Rodham Clinton, Secretary of State,' reads the name under the 'supervisory certification' box on the approval sheet. The signature, however, has been blanked out by the State Department." A second Politico story revealed that Cheryl Mills signed the approval, not Hillary Clinton. "Hillary Clinton's chief of staff —and not Clinton herself — signed a State Department form that helped another Clinton aide change to a job status that allowed broader private-sector employment, a Clinton campaign official said late Saturday. Although the campaign will not say whether it has the actual document in hand, a Clinton camp assertion that Clinton Chief of Staff Cheryl Mills signed paperwork key to Clinton aide Huma Abedin's 2012 change from a full-time role to a 'special government employee' could clarify why the Democratic presidential candidate and former secretary of state told an interviewer earlier this month that she was 'not directly involved' in converting Abedin's role to a senior adviser and expert." GRASSLEY RELEASING LETTER CLAIMING CLASSIFICATIONS WERE CHANGED BY CLINTON LAWYERS

Chairman Chuck Grassley released a letter to the State Department claiming Hillary Clinton's lawyers "deliberately changed classification determinations." "Some State Department lawyers seeking to avoid citing FOIA exemptions based on classified information in Secretary Clinton's email reportedly worked with her attorney, David Kendall, at Williams & Connolly prior to their current positions at the State Department. 2 Whistleblowers within the State Department reportedly notified the intelligence community that former colleagues of Mr. Kendall deliberately changed classification determinations to protect Secretary Clinton." State Department: State Department "policy experts make redaction and upgrade decisions" not lawyers.

"Gerlach said State lawyers don't change classifications. State Department policymakers sometimes seek guidance from attorneys regarding the Freedom of Information Act, and the attorneys advise on the legal standards,' he said. PUBLICLY QUESTIONING CLEARANCE OF CLINTON LAWYERS

Grassley demanded the names and clearances of anyone who reviewed Hillary Clinton's emails. 'The Iowa Republican in late August complained to Secretary of State John Kerry that Clinton's top lawyer David Kendall did not have an adequate clearance. In a Monday letter to Kendall, obtained by POLITICO, Grassley doubled down — demanding the names and clearances of any individual who reviewed the Clinton emails. Grassley specifically named Katherine Turner, Kendall's law partner who, like Kendall, had top secret clearance. But the chairman said the clearance level wasn't good enough because of top secret and 'sensitive compartmented information' found on the server by the Intelligence Community Inspector General (ICIG).' DISCLOSING INFORMATION FROM "CONFIDENTIAL SOURCE"

Chairman Chuck Grassley's office said he was tipped by a confidential source to the existence of approximately 7,300 emails from Huma Abedin's account involving Doug Band. "Grassley filed a statement in the Congressional record Tuesday evening indicating that he would block the nomination of career foreign service officer David Malcolm Robinson, who has been tapped by Secretary of State John Kerry to be Assistant Secretary for Conflict and Stabilization Operations. Grassley said Robinson was 'an innocent victim' of the State Department's 'contemptuous failures to respond to Congressional inquiries.' Grassley said the department 'has engaged in unreasonable delay in responding to Judiciary Committee investigations and inquiries' including the Abedin issue. Grassley's office says the Senator was tipped by a confidential source to the existence of approximately 7,300 e-mails sent or received by Abedin involving Douglas Band, the head of a global consulting firm, Teneo Holdings, who served as President Bill Clinton's personal aide for much of his presidency.... Grassley requested documents relating to Abedin's unusual employment arrangement in June 2013 and has yet to receive the e-mails, his office says." [Time, 8/5/15]

SENATE HOMELAND SECURITY AND GOVERNMENT AFFAIRS COMMITTEE

JOHNSON CALLING ON FBI TO TURN OVER RECOVERED EMAILS

Chairman Ron Johnson called on the FBI to turn over recovered emails for a review for federal records.

"Senator Ron Johnson, Republican of Wisconsin and the chairman of the Homeland Security and Governmental Operations Committee, has called on the F.B.I. to turn over any of these recovered emails to the State Department or some other third party so they can be reviewed to determine if any should have been retained as government records. 'If the FBI has recovered all of her emails, they must be reviewed promptly by the appropriate authorities to determine what is official and what is not, and whether they contain classified material, so that any national security concerns can be mitigated,' Mr. Johnson said in a statement Wednesday." Chairman Ron Johnson was "hopeful" that the results of the FBI inquiry would become public and vaguely promised his own "inquiry." "Senate Homeland Security and Government Affairs Committee Chairman Ron Johnson (R-Wis.) said he was 'hopeful' that the results of the FBI inquiry will be made public. He promised to press his own inquiry but offered no specifics. Regardless of what Congress decides to do, Hillary Clinton's decision to have a tech firm she hired turn the server over to the FBI last month at its request greatly raises the potential that messages she has claimed to be private will eventually make it into the public domain, lawyers tracking the case said." PUSHING TIMELINE DISCREPANCY NARRATIVE

Chairman Ron Johnson publicized his "terse letter" about a supposed discrepancy between State and Hillary Clinton. "The discrepancy between Clinton's timetable and the new information from the State Department prompted a terse letter Tuesday from Sen. Ron Johnson (R-Wis.), chairman of the Senate Homeland Security and Governmental Affairs Committee, who has been investigating whether Clinton's e-mail practices compromised national security. In the letter, he pointed to documents suggesting that Clinton's staff moved quickly that summer after she was first contacted about her private account. He cited a July 23, 2014, e-mail in which employees at Platte River Networks, the private company that was then maintaining her server, discussed sending copies of Clinton's e-mails overnight to Cheryl Mills, a longtime Clinton adviser. A spokesman for the company confirmed Tuesday that its workers started pulling Clinton's e-mails to submit to Mills in July 2014." [Washington Post, <u>9/22/15</u>]

FEEDING INFORMATION ABOUT I.T. COMPANY SECURITY CLEARANCE

Chairman Johnson fed information to the conservative Daily Caller about security clearance of IT company. "Platte River is not cleared' to have access to classified material, stated Cindy McGovern, chief public affairs officer for DSS in a telephone interview with The Daily Caller News Foundation. Sen. Ron Johnson, chairman of the Senate Committee on Homeland Security and Governmental Affairs, told the DCNF that the Platte River involvement 'raises serious questions' about the security surrounding Secretary Clinton's server over the last two years. 'The revelation that Secretary Clinton used a private company, Platte River Networks, to maintain her personal server raises questions about what steps the company took to preserve and secure sensitive information in Secretary Clinton's email,' Johnson said." SEEKING IMMUNITY IN ORDER TO INTERVIEW CLINTON I.T. STAFFER

Judiciary and Homeland Security Chairmen, Ron Johnson and Chuck Grassley, sought an immunity deal allowing IT staffer Bryan Pagliano to testify about the email server. "Grassley and Johnson are currently considering an immunity deal with Pagliano and have preliminarily reached out to his attorney Mark MacDougall, for a proffer, or preliminary overview of what he'd say if immunized. MacDougall has refused, saying that would endanger his client." [Politico, 9/14/15]

SENATOR CORNYN

CORNYN CALLING FOR SPECIAL PROSECUTOR

Sen. John Cornyn called on Attorney General Loretta Lynch to appoint an independent counsel to run the DOJ investigation into Hillary Clinton's email server citing concerns of a conflict of interest. "Sen. John Cornyn (R-Texas) sent a letter to Attorney General Loretta Lynch on Tuesday claiming that the 'extraordinary circumstances' surrounding Clinton's email practices warrant the appointment of an independent official to coordinate the investigation. 'The attorney general has a special duty to pursue justice even when political considerations run counter to doing so,' he wrote. 'Secretary Clinton's misconduct is evident and her intent — since the beginning of her tenure as secretary of State — to keep information from the public is clear." [The Hill, 9/15/15]

STATING HILLARY CLINTON VIOLATED LAW

Sen. John Cornyn claimed Hillary Clinton "intentionally evaded" FOIA laws, government classification and national security protections. "But they view Clinton's use of a private email server to store documents containing highly classified information as a potent issue that could roil next year's presidential race, and the moves by Cornyn, Grassley and Johnson show they are staking their claim to the issue. 'It's important because there are a lot of laws that are already on the books that were violated by Secretary Clinton setting up this private email server, circumventing freedom of information laws, government classification and national security protections. Trey Gowdy was scheduled to be the Special Guest at a \$2,000-per-couple fundraiser for Marco Rubio. "Marco Rubio brings his vision of a 'New American Century' to Texas next week with a highprofile fundraiser reception in the exclusive Dallas suburb of Highland Park. Real-estate investor Harlan Crow and his wife Kathy will present the \$2,000-per-couple event, scheduled for Tuesday, September 22. Host reception begins at 6:30 p.m.; general reception is at 7 p.m...South Carolina Congressman Trey Gowdy, the outspoken conservative who serves on the House Select Committee on Benghazi, is the special guest." As the Featured Speaker at the 2015 National Pachyderm Convention, Trey Gowdy praised Rep. Chuck Fleischmann's support of his Benghazi investigation by threatening to withhold State Department funding. The National Federation of Pachyderm Clubs describes itself as 'one of the most influential and most recognized political clubs in the nation' and as 'an official Allied Organization of the RNC." According to the Chattanooga Times Free Press, "In turn, Gowdy praised Fleischmann, who serves on the Appropriations Committee that he said helped the Benghazi probe by threatening to withhold State Department funding if the agency didn't comply with the committee's subpoenas. 'If you want to provide oversight and get the attention of the executive branch, step on the air hose called appropriations,' Gowdy said. 'We tried public shame, threats, subpoenas and letters, but they didn't work. What worked is when we partnered with our friends on Appropriations and let the State Department and other agencies know that your money will be cut if you do not provide us with documents." But it was revealed Monday that he was scheduled to help another group raise funds at an event called 'Beyond Benghazi.' By the day's end, Gowdy had pulled out and the event was canceled." A Cobb County GOP fundraiser featuring Lynn Westmoreland advertised 'an update on the Benghazi investigation' and touted Westmoreland's role on the Benghazi Committee. "Admission for the Marietta, Georgia, event was \$10. The Cobb County GOP touted the event as a 'very unusual breakfast' where its supporters would receive an 'update on the Benghazi investigation.' 'Congressman Westmoreland was selected by Speaker Boehner to serve on the House Select Committee on Benghazi,' read the invite, which was obtained by The Huffington Post." A separate website called 'BenghaziWatchdogs.com' still contains a link encouraging visitors to 'help fight liberals by donating today." "Gowdy addressed the issue of 'phony scandals,' in which the government is describing the scandals surrounding the IRS and NSA as fake, or phony. DESPITE GOWDY'S PROMISE OF AN AIRTIGHT INVESTIGATION, "PRIVATE" INFO IS CONSTANTLY LEAKED

Early on in the committee's history, Trey Gowdy promised to run a leakfree investigation. That claim was not only false—it's become one of the biggest jokes in Washington.

Time and time again, Gowdy's fingerprints have been all over selective and utterly false leaks from the committee's "closed door" hearings. One of the most shameful errors in New York Times' history—the front page story claiming that Hillary Clinton was the subject of a "criminal investigation"—resulted directly from leaks originating from Benghazi Committee investigations.

The evidence below proves that Gowdy lied about leaks—and his credibility on every other issue is in tatters as a result.

LEAK #1: TREY GOWDY COMMITTEE LEAKED NEWS OF HILLARY CLINTON SUBPOENA.

LINDSEY GRAHAM SAID HE WOULD NOMINATE TREY GOWDY FOR THE SUPREME COURT MULTIPLE TIMES

In February, Lindsey Graham said he would nominate Trey Gowdy for the Supreme Court. "When it comes to Supreme Court justices, if I get to be president, I would nominate Trey Gowdy. And I would expect Democrats to vote for him because he's a qualified person. I thought Sotomayor and Kagan, while I would not have chosen them, were very qualified candidates to be picked by a Democratic president. So, I'm very comfortable that I'm in the mainstream of conservatism." [CBS Face the Nation, 2/1/15]

Lindsey Graham told the Des Moines Register editorial board that he would nominate Trey Gowdy for the Supreme Court. "South Carolina Senator Lindsey Graham is lagging far towards the back of the pack in this year's crowded field for the Republican presidential nomination, but he's already got his first Supreme

Court nominee picked out: fellow Palmetto State lawmaker Trey Gowdy. In a meeting Wednesday with the Des Moines Register's editorial board, Graham said, he'd like to make his first justice a qualified lawyer 'with real world experience' rather than a career jurist. He suggested 'a guy like [Representative] Trey Gowdy." [Bloomberg, 7/1/15]

The Conservative Tribune endorsed Lindsey Graham's suggestion that Trey Gowdy should be on the Supreme Court. ATTORNEY GENERAL

Donald Trump said he would select Trey Gowdy to be Attorney General in his administration. "In a surprise move presidential contender Donald Trump announced his pick for Attorney General naming Congressman Trey Gowdy to replace the lackey Loretta Lynch who replaced Obama lap dog Eric Holder. No word on whether Rep Gowdy has been consulted or approached but Trump continues to show his political and media savvy. This is his tweet from 27 July. @realDonaldTrump '@USARestoring: @HillaryClinton's toast. Dems had better get the 'B Team' off the bench. @TGowdySC for Attorney General under President Trump." The Conservative Tribune endorsed Donald Trump's proposed selection of Trey Gowdy for Attorney General if elected. "In a Tuesday tweet, Trump said that he would pick South Carolina representative and chairman of the House Select Committee on Benghazi Trey Gowdy as his attorney general, were he to be elected president... Rep. Gowdy, whose tenacious manner with liberals and Obama administration officials has earned him the nickname "The Bulldog," has been a conservative favorite for quite some time now. In fact, before the 2014 Republican sweep of Congress, political action group the Tea Party Leadership Fund endorsed

Gowdy to take over John Boehner's position as speaker of the House. SPEAKER OF THE HOUSE

The Conservative Tribune supported the movement for Trey Gowdy to become Speaker of the House. HILLARY CLINTON'S EMAIL AND THE BENGHAZI COMMITTEE

JUST THE FACTS—FACTS TREY GOWDY HAS NEVER BOTHERED TO SHARE

Thanks to Trey Gowdy's relentless smear campaign of leaks and falsehoods, a lot of misconceptions about Hillary Clinton's emails have seeped into the public consciousness. However, some of the most widely-repeated claims about Clinton's emails don't hold up to scrutiny.

Now that it's clear that the Benghazi Committee has always been a partisan exercise, it's high time that the real facts about Hillary Clinton's emails get on the record.



FACT: HILLARY CLINTON APPROPRIATELY SORTED FEDERAL RECORDS

Justice Department: Under NARA and State Department policies, "individual officers and employees are permitted and expected to exercise judgment to determine what constitutes a federal record." "Under policies issue both by the National Archives and Records Administration ('NARA') and the State Department, individual officers and employees are permitted and expected to exercise judgment to determine what constitutes a federal record. See NARA Bulletin 2014-06 ¶4 (Sept. 15, 2014) ('Currently, in many agencies, employees manage their own email accounts and apply their own understanding of Federal records management. This means that all employees are required to review each message, identify its value, and either delete it or move it to a recordkeeping system.'); 3 Department of State Foreign Affairs Manual, 5 FAM 443.2(b) ('[t]he intention of this guidance is not to require the preservation of every E-mail message.')" [Justice Department Filing, Case 1:12-cv-02034-RBW, 9/9/15]

NARA and State Department policies under the Federal Records Act rely on individuals to "make decisions as to what e-mails must be preserved as federal records." "The March 19 letter takes issue with Secretary Clinton's role, through her legal representatives, as the 'sole arbiter of what she considers private' and what she considers work-related. See March 19 Letter at 3. That procedure, however, whereby individual officials are responsible for separating what is work-related (and potentially a federal record) from what is personal—is the very procedure that NARA and individual agencies rely upon to meet their obligations under the Federal Records Act every day. Indeed, guidance and the State Department's policies make clear that the reliance on individual officials to make decisions as to what e-mails must be preserved as federal records is not an 'arrangement' that is 'unprecedented' or 'unique,' but instead the normal procedure carried out by tens of thousands of agency officials and employees in the ordinary course." [Attorney David Kendall Letter to Chairman Gowdy, 3/27/15]

White House spokesman: Hillary Clinton's emails were "properly preserved and maintained" when her team identified and sent to the State Department messages "related to her official government responsibilities." "When I'm talking about ensuring that those records are properly preserved and maintained, I'm talking about them being preserved and maintained at the agency. So they're properly preserved and maintained when Secretary Clinton's team does the work of going through the email, pulling the ones that are related to her official government responsibilities, and sending them to the State Department so that they can be properly preserved and maintained there." [Josh Earnest, White House press briefing, <u>3/4/15</u>]

HILLARY CLINTON WAS PERMITTED TO DELETE PERSONAL EMAIL AT HER DISCRETION

Justice Department: "State Department employees may delete messages they deem in their own discretion to be personal." "Second, because personal records are not subject to FOIA, and State Department employees may delete messages they deem in their own discretion to be personal, Plaintiff's preservation argument reduces to an unsupported allegation that former Secretary Clinton might have mistakenly or intentionally deleted responsive agency records rather than personal records. But Plaintiff offers no support for such a theory, and government agencies are not required to take steps to recover deleted material based on unfounded speculation that responsive information had been deleted." [Justice Department Filing, Case 1:12-cv-02034-RBW, 9/9/15]

Department of Justice lawyers ruled Hillary Clinton "had authority to delete personal emails without

agency supervision." "In the most complete legal defense of Mrs. Clinton, Justice Department lawyers insisted they not only have no obligation, but no power, to go back and demand the former top diplomat turn over any documents she hasn't already given — and neither, they said, can the court order that. The defense came as part of a legal filing telling a judge why the administration shouldn't be required to order Mrs. Clinton and her top aides to preserve all of their emails. 'There is no question that Secretary Clinton had authority to delete personal emails without agency supervision — she appropriately could have done so even if she were working on a government server,' the administration lawyers argued. 'Under policies issued by both the National Archives and Records Administration ('NARA') and the State Department, individual officers and employees are permitted and expected to exercise judgment to determine what constitutes a federal record." FACT: THE VAST MAJORITY OF HILLARY CLINTON'S EMAIL TRAFFIC WAS WITH .GOV ADDRESSES

More than 90% of Hillary Clinton's work-related emails were sent to or received by state.gov accounts to be captured on the department system. "This totaled roughly 55,000 pages. More than 90% of her work or potentially work-related emails provided to the Department were already in the State Department's record-keeping system because those e-mails were sent to or received by 'state.gov' accounts" [The Facts About Hillary Clinton's Emails, The Briefing, accessed 7/14/15]

FACT: STATE DEPARTMENT RECORD KEEPING FAILURE PREVENTED CAPTURE OF STATE.GOV EMAILS

A glitch in the State Department record keeping system prevented capturing of emails sent from Hillary Clinton to state.gov accounts. "Moreover, aides say that there was an actual technical glitch that prevented the State Department from capturing all of the e-mails that Clinton sent to people with state.gov addresses, so that problem needed to be addressed. (This appears to refer to an Inspector General report on how State Department officials at lower levels were not properly saving e-mails for archives, but the report said the assessment did not apply to the system used by senior State Department officials, including the secretary of state and top aides.)" [Washington Post, <u>9/28/15</u>]

Mother Jones: In 2014, State realized it had not captured email records for Secretaries going back to Madeleine Albright. "In 2014, the State Department suddenly realized that it had very few email records from secretaries going back to Madeleine Albright. Two years after Hillary had left office, they were trying to figure out where her emails were stored. This very much does not suggest to me that they were 'caught off guard' by Hillary's use of a private server. Rather, it suggests only that the State staffers responding to the congressional inquiries didn't happen to know that Hillary used a private server. More importantly, it also suggests that for well over a decade, (a) the department had no oversight of emails sent and received by Secretaries of State, (b) didn't really care about these emails, (c) didn't archive them, and (d) had no idea where they might be." FACT: STATE DEPARTMENT ISSUED OFFICIAL RECORDS REQUEST TO FORMER SECRETARIES IN OCTOBER 2014

On October 28, 2014, the State Department sent letters to four former Secretaries requesting federal records sent or received on personal email accounts. "We recognize that some period of time has passed since your principal served as Secretary of State and that the NARA guidance post-dates that service. Nevertheless, we bring the NARA guidance to your attention in order to ensure that the Department's records are as complete as possible. Accordingly, we ask that should your principal or his or her authorized representative be aware or become aware in the future of a federal record, such as an email sent or received on a personal email account while serving as Secretary of State, that a copy of this record be made available to the Department. In this regard, please note that diverse Department records are subject to various disposition schedules, with most Secretary of State records retained permanently. We ask that a record be provided to the Department if there is reason to believe that it may not otherwise be preserved in the Department's recordkeeping system." [State Dept. letter to Cheryl Mills, <u>11/12/14</u>; originally sent <u>10/28/14</u>]

FACT: HILLARY CLINTON WAS ONLY FORMER SECRETARY TO RESPOND TO STATE'S REQUEST

State Department: Hillary Clinton was the only former Secretary to respond, handing over 55,000 pages of emails to State. "When in the process of updating our records management – this is something that's sort of ongoing given technology and the changes – we reached out to all of the former secretaries of state to ask them to provide any records they had. Secretary Clinton sent back 55,000 pages of documents to the State Department very shortly after we sent the letter to her. She was the only former Secretary of State who sent documents back in to this request. These 55,000 pages covered her time, the breadth of her time at the State Department." [State Department Press Briefing, <u>3/3/15</u>]

FACT: HILLARY CLINTON TURNED OVER NEARLY 55,000 PAGES OF EMAILS

Hillary Clinton turned over roughly 55,000 pages of emails. "On December 5, 2014, 30,490 copies of work or potentially work-related emails sent and received by Clinton from March 18, 2009, to February 1, 2013, were provided to the State Department. This totaled roughly 55,000 pages." [The Facts About Hillary Clinton's Emails, The Briefing, <u>accessed 7/14/15</u>]

FACT: HILLARY CLINTON'S PRODUCTION WAS OVER-INCLUSIVE

Justice Department: Evidence "demonstrates that the former Secretary's production was over-inclusive."

"The evidence, if anything, demonstrates that the former Secretary's production was over-inclusive, not under-inclusive. The Department's review, of the approximately 55,000 pages of documents provided to the Department determined that at least 1246 of the emails provided were not federal records." [Justice Department Filing, Case 1:12-cv-02034-RBW, <u>9/9/15</u>]

Hillary Clinton turned over all emails work-related or potentially work-related. "The Secretary's personal attorneys had reviewed every sent and received (whether as 'to,' 'cc,' or 'bcc') e-mail from the hdr22@clintonemail. com account during her tenure as Secretary (62,320 e-mails in total) and identified all work-related and potentially work-related e-mails (30,490 e-mails, approximately 55,000 pages)—which were provided to the State Department on December 5, 2014. The Department of State is therefore in possession of all of Secretary Clinton's work-related e-mails from the hdr22@clintonemail.com account." [Attorney David Kendall Letter to Chairman Gowdy, 3/27/15]

FACT: HILLARY CLINTON NEVER SENT OR RECEIVED ANY EMAILS MARKED AS CLASSIFIED

The State Department and Senate Intelligence Committee have confirmed that no emails on Hillary Clinton's server were marked as classified when they were sent or received. "In fact, the communications that travelled across Secretary Clinton's private server were not even marked as classified at the time they were sent or received. Classified information (which as a matter of federal statute is defined as 'information or material designated and clearly marked or clearly represented, pursuant to the provisions of a statute or executive order as requiring a specific degree of protection against unauthorized disclosure for reasons of national security') was reviewed by Secretary Clinton either while in her State Department office or using government secure transmission systems if she was on travel. These facts are uncontroverted and have been verified by the State Department and Senate Intelligence Committee." [Michael Zeldin Opinion, The Hill, 9/9/15]

AP: "There is no evidence of emails stored in Hillary Clinton's private server bearing classified markings." "By contrast, there is no evidence of emails stored in Hillary Clinton's private server bearing classified markings. State Department officials say they don't believe that emails she sent or received included material classified at the time. And even if other government officials dispute that assertion, it is extremely difficult to prove anyone knowingly mishandled secrets." [AP, <u>8/31/15</u>]

FACT: HILLARY CLINTON IS FIRST SECRETARY OF STATE TO ASK FOR ALL EMAILS TO BE MADE PUBLIC

Hillary Clinton: "I took the unprecedented step of asking that the State Department make all my workrelated emails public for everyone to see." "I took the unprecedented step of asking that the State Department make all my work-related emails public for everyone to see. I am very proud of the work that I and my colleagues and our public servants at the department did during my four years as secretary of state, and I look forward to people being able to see that for themselves." [Secretary Clinton press conference, <u>3/10/15</u>]

Hillary Clinton repeated called for public release of her emails. "I have said repeatedly I want those emails out,' Clinton told reporters. 'Nobody has a bigger interest in getting them released than I do.' Clinton said she was unable to demand their release, because it is the State Department who controls the emails, not her, but she asked the department she once ran do do 'anything that they might to do expedite that process." [WQAD8, <u>5/19/15</u>]

Rep. Cummings: "As far as I am aware, no other Cabinet secretary in history has ever called for the release of his or her emails." "The top Democrat on the House Select Committee on Benghazi is praising former Secretary of State Hillary Clinton for announcing that she wants messages from her personal email accounts to be made public. 'As far as I am aware, no other Cabinet secretary in history has ever called for the release of his or her emails — in their entirety and throughout his or her tenure,' Rep. Elijah Cummings (D-Md.) said in a statement on Thursday. 'I commend Secretary Clinton's decision.'" [The Hill, 3/5/15]

FACT: STATE DEPARTMENT AND COMMITTEE DEMOCRATS WANTED BENGHAZI EMAILS TO BE PUBLIC

Rep. Cummings called on Trey Gowdy to make Hillary Clinton's Benghazi emails public. "It has been public for several years that Secretary Clinton used her personal email account, apparently following the pattern of previous Secretaries of State. Although Secretary Clinton has produced her emails to the State Department, it is unclear from press reports whether previous Secretaries have done the same. Last month, the Committee received Secretary Clinton's emails relating to Benghazi, and now that we have them, I believe Chairman Gowdy should join with me to make them available to the American public so they can read their contents for themselves." Benghazi Select Committee members called on the State Department to publicly release Benghazi-related emails. "Democrats on the House Select Committee on Benghazi want the State Department to prioritize the release of Hillary Clinton's Benghazi-related emails as controversy swirls over her use of private email while secretary. Democratic Reps. Elijah Cummings (Md.), Adam Smith (Wash.), Adam Schiff (Calif.), Linda Sanchez (Calif.) and Tammy Duckworth (Ill.) are asking the State Department in a letter to release any emails related to the attacks on the Benghazi diplomatic mission that killed four Americans in a hope to quell concerns. 'Since the Department has already produced approximately 850 pages of these documents to the Select Committee on Benghazi, we request that the Department begin its review for public release with this subset of 850 pages of Benghazi-related documents in order to make them available to the public first without waiting for the full review,' the letter says." The State Department intended to speed release of about 900 pages of Benghazi-related emails sent by Sec. Clinton. "Under pressure to move quickly on the release of Hillary Clinton's emails, the State Department intends to speed release about 900 pages of Benghazi-related e-mails sent by the former Secretary of State on her private e-mail account, officials said Tuesday." [Politico, <u>3/10/15</u>]

FACT: THE EXISTENCE OF HILLARY CLINTON'S PERSONAL EMAIL ACCOUNT WAS MADE PUBLIC IN 2013

The existence of Hillary Clinton's personal account was made public after a Romanian hacker accessed Sidney Blumenthal's address. "In March 2013, a Romanian hacker named Marcel Lazăr Lehel, aka Guccifer, disclosed the existence of a private email address belonging to former Secretary of State Hillary Clinton. The Smoking Gun, Gawker and others reported that Clinton had been receiving emails at the address from Sidney Blumenthal, a close ally, concerning the storming of the American diplomatic compound in Benghazi, Libya, by Islamic militants in 2012." FACT: TREY GOWDY KNEW ABOUT HILLARY CLINTON'S PERSONAL ACCOUNT FOR 6 MONTHS PRIOR TO ACTING

Trey Gowdy admitted he knew about Hillary Clinton's personal email in the summer of 2014, six months before holding a press conference to make hay of the issue. "Speaking of which, Gowdy let something else slip while unburdening himself to Politico: he and his committee have known since last summer that Mrs. Clinton conducted business by private e-mail. So what you're just finding out now, Gowdy has known for at least six months. So what did he do about it? According to Politico, 'He said the committee has worked with Clinton advisers and the department to gain access to documents relating to the Benghazi attacks." FACT: OFFICIALS HAVE LEAKED AND ANONYMOUSLY DISCUSSED PURPORTEDLY CLASSIFIED DOCUMENTS

Trey Gowdy leaked one third of Hillary Clinton's Benghazi emails to the New York Times. "The emails set for release, drawn from some 55,000 pages and focused on Libya, have already been turned over to the special House committee investigating the 2012 attacks on the United States outposts in Benghazi. The New York Times has obtained about a third of the 850 pages of emails. They capture the correspondence and concerns expressed among Mrs. Clinton, who was secretary of state at the time, and her advisers following the attacks, which claimed the lives of the American ambassador, J. Christopher Stevens, and three other Americans." [New York Times, 5/21/15]

Officials from intelligence and other agencies "spoke to the AP on condition of anonymity" about the content of potentially "Top Secret" emails sent to Hillary Clinton. NO TRANSPARENCY, NO ACCOUNTABILITY, LOTS OF HYPOCRISY

While Hillary Clinton continues to display unprecedented levels of transparency in making her personal emails available to the public, several Republican presidential hopefuls—namely, Jeb Bush, Chris Christie, Marco Rubio, Mike Huckabee and Bobby Jindal—have failed to show a similar interest in transparency with their own record of work-related email. Nearly all of these candidates used private email accounts as public officials and some have failed to release work-related emails, while others took steps to delete communications that should have been part of the public record.

The GOP's repeated attacks against Hillary Clinton are deceitful, dishonest and duplicitous.

JEB BUSH

JEB BUSH FAILED TO RELEASE E-MAILS RELATED TO OFFICIAL GOVERNMENT BUSINESS

Jeb Bush's e-mail release did not include correspondence in which he personally weighed in on a trade dispute between Bacardi and Cuba. "But a 2002 trade battle between Bacardi and Cuba over the rights to the 'Havana Club' label shows Bush's transparency has its limits and shows some details are missing from the Bush email repository. A string of emails from Bush personally weighing in on the Bacardi fight when he was governor of Florida were not among any of the releases. Their existence is only known because a Florida investigative reporter obtained them years ago." [CNN, <u>10/01/15</u>]

JEB BUSH RELEASED EMAILS THAT EXPOSED SOCIAL SECURITY NUMBERS

Emails released by Jeb Bush included names, emails, and Social Security number of many Florida residents "leaving them vulnerable to identity thieves." "A trove of 250,000 emails released by prospective 2016 presidential candidate Jeb Bush includes the sensitive personal information of several Florida residents, leaving them vulnerable to identity thieves. A scan of the email dump by technology blogs The Verge and Gizmodo revealed names, emails and in some cases, Social Security numbers of Bush's correspondents. Many appear to be normal Florida residents unaware their messages to the then-governor would eventually become public." [The Hill, 2/10/15]

Nearly 13,000 Social Security numbers were compromised in Jeb Bush's email dump. "Todd Feinman, CEO of data protection firm Identity Finder, ran an analysis of the data and determined that nearly 13,000 unique Social Security numbers were released. His software, which uses natural language processing to identify sensitive information through contextual clues, found that about 12,500 of those were contained in a spreadsheet embedded in a PowerPoint slide attached to an email dated October 2003." Jeb Bush's email release was an "indiscriminate data dump being made for political reasons" and showed "a serious ignorance of the volume of sensitive information in the records and carelessness about their disclosure." "Many posts were critical of Bush, who is expected to be a major contender for the Republican presidential nomination in 2016. 'Even if most of these emails are subject to Sunshine Law disclosure, a public request for specific information is not the same as a huge, indiscriminate data dump being made for political reasons,' wrote T.C. Sottek with The Verge, which first reported the presence of Social Security numbers in the trove. 'At minimum, it shows a serious ignorance of the volume of sensitive information in the records and a carelessness about their disclosure — not a good look for someone who may want to sit in the White House,' Sottek wrote." JEB BUSH'S SERVER HOUSED SENSITIVE SECURITY INFORMATION

Jeb Bush discussed "security and military issues such as troop deployments to the Middle East and the protection of nuclear plants" using email housed on his private server. "Jeb Bush used his private e-mail account as Florida governor to discuss security and military issues such as troop deployments to the Middle East and the protection of nuclear plants, according to a review of publicly released records. The e-mails include two series of exchanges involving details of Florida National Guard troop deployments after the Sept. 11, 2001, attacks, the review by The Washington Post found. Aides to Bush said Saturday that none of the e-mails contained sensitive or classified information, and that many of the events mentioned in them were documented in press accounts, either contemporaneously or later. But security experts say private e-mail systems such as the one used by Bush are more vulnerable to hackers, and that details such as troop movements could be exploited by enemies." Jeb Bush housed emails containing "sensitive security issues" on his private server. CHRIS CHRISTIE

CHRIS CHRISTIE USED PRIVATE E-MAIL ACCOUNTS

Chris Christie used two private e-mail accounts as governor and asserted executive privilege to block the release of any messages from either account. "When I'm president of the United States, you'll have a right to know what your president is doing, and we have the obligation to be held accountable for what we're doing,' [Chris Christie] declared. Yet, back in New Jersey, the Republican governor's administration is asserting executive privilege to block the release of any emails he may have sent to state officials from two private email accounts." [International Business Times, <u>10/4/15</u>]

The existence of both of Chris Christie's private email accounts was confirmed by New Jersey state agencies. "In August and September, International Business Times filed open records requests for emails between state agencies and both a Yahoo address (christopherchristie1@yahoo.com) and an AOL account (hen84@aol.com) -- the latter of which was listed as Christie's address on a website for alumni of the New Jersey U.S. Attorney's office. The agencies indicated they knew both email addresses belonged to the governor, and blocked the release of any emails from the addresses by citing executive privilege." Chris Christie used his private Yahoo e-mail account to conduct government business related to the Bridgegate scandal. "Gov. Chris Christie has criticized Hillary Clinton in recent days over her use of private email to do State Department business. Christie turned over just one set of emails to the New Jersey Legislature in response to its subpoenas about Bridgegate. That email conversation contained edits that Christie made to a statement announcing the resignation of Port Authority official David Wildstein, who has since pleaded guilty for his role in the lane closures." [WNYC, 8/27/15]

An e-mail sent to Chris Christie's AOL address produced a read receipt, suggesting the account was still active. "An email sent by IBT to the Yahoo address requesting comment from Gov. Christie returned an error message. A similar email sent to the AOL address appeared to go through and produced receipts showing it had been read. No response was received. A spokesperson for Christie's office did not respond to questions from IBT." [International Business Times, <u>10/4/15</u>]

Chris Christie admitted that he maintained a private email account and said that no law required state business be conducted on government email. "Christie has said he maintains a private email account and that no law requires state business be conducted on government email, emphasizing that Clinton handled sensitive information and deleted some of hers. A spokesman for Christie's office, Kevin Roberts, acknowledged there is no published policy requiring employees exchange official email on state accounts. He noted that confidential guidance to employees on email use is clear and thorough relating to generally using state-issued email accounts." [The Hill, <u>8/28/15</u>]

CHRISTIE STAFF USED PERSONAL EMAIL AND CELL PHONES TO COMMUNICATE ABOUT STATE BUSINESS

Chris Christie administration emails and texts released during Bridgegate investigation "revealed...that state officials use personal e-mail accounts and cell phones to communicate." "The thousands of e-mails and texts released as part of the investigation into the September lane closures on the bridge revealed what many open public records advocates have long suspected: that state officials use personal e-mail accounts and cell phones to communicate." [Star-Ledger, 1/13/14]

The New Jersey ACLU called on Chris Christie to require all state employees to use state email for business. "The American Civil Liberties Union of New Jersey today called on Gov. Chris Christie and the state attorney general to require all public employees to use government e-mail accounts and cell phones to conduct official business, in response to the unfolding George Washington Bridge lane-closure scandal. The group said in a letter that the release of thousands of pages of e-mails and text message Friday related to the scandal showed government employees are attempting to circumvent the state Open Public Records Act by using personal accounts to discuss official matters." The New Jersey ACLU believed that Christie administration officials "could be attempting to circumvent the state Open Public Records Act by using personal accounts to discuss business." "In a letter to Gov. Chris Christie, the state attorney general and several state lawmakers, the ACLU said the communications showed employees could be attempting to circumvent the state Open Public Records Act by using personal accounts to discuss business." [Star-Ledger, 1/13/14]

Chris Christie's administration spent \$441,000 in legal fees fighting open records requests, including requests related to withheld Bridgegate e-mails. "When a judge determines that the state withheld records illegally—which happens frequently—her group wins legal fees. As of September 2014, Christie's administration had paid \$441,000 to North Jersey Media Group and other media outlets for records. [...] In January 2014, a judge ordered the release of top Christie staffers' communications about the George Washington Bridge lane closures. Reporters for the Record had previously requested some of those same communications in 2013, and the state released some records in response. But reading the new documents, they realized that Christie's office had failed to turn over critical documents that were covered by their

request. The outlet sued and won access to a limited number of additional emails, says Borg, the North Jersey Media Group lawyer. It's still the most egregious of these cases,'she says." [Mother Jones, <u>2/4/15</u>]

REGINA EGEA DELETED BRIDGEGATE TEXT MESSAGES BETWEEN HER AND CHRISTIE

A legislative report showed that there were 12 text messages exchanged between Chris Christie and Regina Egea on day the Port Authority started to question the Christie administration's explanation for lane closures. "Contradicting sworn testimony and New Jersey Governor Chris Christie's repeated accounts that he barely paid attention last fall to the burgeoning scandal surrounding politically-motivated lane closures on the George Washington Bridge, a new report shows there were 12 text messages exchanged between the Governor and a top aide during an explosive day of testimony a year ago. That was the day that top officials of the Port Authority of New York and New Jersey began to dismantle key elements of the Christie administration's official explanation of events -- that the lane closures were a traffic study gone awry. AT&T did not release the content of the texts, and it's not unusual that the Governor and the aide would have been exchanging messages that day with the aide, Regina Egea, his incoming chief of staff and head of his authorities unit, who was monitoring the testimony. But their previous denials raises the question of what other communications were deleted as the scandal unfolded." [WNYC, 12/5/14]

Egea said a deleted text was "not at all substantive" and that she did not know when she deleted the text. "In Egea's own testimony last summer, the new report notes, she referred to a single text she sent that day as 'not at all substantive.' She said she 'couldn't recall' a response from the governor. Egea acknowledged deleting the text, though she couldn't say when." [WNYC, 12/5/14]

Christie told friends that he texts instead of emails because text messages are harder to trace. "The governor has told allies that he had learned when he was the United States attorney for New Jersey to communicate by text rather than email, because text messages are harder to trace. (Email can remain on servers even after being deleted; cellphone carriers vary in how long they preserve deleted texts.)" [New York Times, <u>8/27/14</u>]

Regina Egea testified that she deleted text messages between her and Christie about the lane closings. "Gov. Chris Christie's designated future chief of staff, Regina Egea, testified that she texted the governor about the lane closings in December, after testimony in a hearing that day disputed his administration's assertion that the closings were part of a traffic study. But she said she deleted the texts." [New York Times, <u>7/17/14</u>]

Star-Ledger editorial board: Chris Christie "knowingly deleted 12 text messages he exchanged with a senior aide who was monitoring the Bridgegate hearings." "For Christie to lead the charge on this takes remarkable chutzpah. He knowingly deleted 12 text messages he exchanged with a senior aide who was monitoring the Bridgegate hearings in December 2013, as Port Authority witnesses demolished the phony claim that the infamous lane closures were part of a traffic study. What was in those texts, governor? And why did you erase them?" [Star-Ledger editorial, <u>9/2/15</u>]

Star-Ledger editorial board: Chris Christie "never answered the question" when asked about his deleted Bridgegate text messages. "What was in those texts, governor? And why did you erase them? Wallace, to his credit, asked Christie about that on Sunday. The governor pivoted back to Hillary, and never answered the question." [Star-Ledger editorial, <u>9/2/15</u>]

MARCO RUBIO

Marco Rubio used his personal e-mail account to conduct official business. "When the Orlando Sentinel filed a public-records request for the emails from the private account about the legislative session, Mr. Rubio's spokeswoman said they had been deleted. The newspaper reported that emails from Mr. Rubio's personal account had been included in responses to at least two other records requests, suggesting he used his personal account for government-related business on multiple occasions." [Wall Street Journal, <u>3/12/15</u>]

Florida law allowed Marco Rubio and his staff to decide which material was significant enough to preserve from his private and government accounts. "The law appears to have left it to Mr. Rubio and his staff to decide which material was significant enough to preserve from his private and government accounts, said Ms. Petersen of the watchdog group." [Wall Street Journal, <u>3/12/15</u>]

Marco Rubio conceded that he did official work on his private account and deleted personal e-mails. "In Rubio's case, the senator concedes he did official work on his private account, but he insists the deleted private emails had nothing to do with his official duties." [MSNBC, <u>3/31/15</u>]

Work-related e-mails from Marco Rubio's private account e-mails were to be treated as public records. "Barbara Petersen, a public records expert [said] that e mails relating to public business are public records, regardless of whether they were sent from a personal e mail account." [St. Petersburg Times, 4/24/08]

Marco Rubio used a personal email account to "vent" about Republicans to reporters. "As Marco Rubio's time as House speaker dwindles, he finds himself double teamed by the Senate and Gov. Charlie Crist. Over the weekend, he decided to vent. After the House devolved into partisan chaos over a decision by Rubio's team to block Democratic debate on an education bill, Rubio dashed off a series of e mails to St. Petersburg Times reporters on his personal e mail account. He freely offered opinions, laying out each chamber's top priorities, deriding the governor's last minute plan to cut gas taxes and criticizing a tax commission's hesitance to cap government tax revenues." [St. Petersburg Times, <u>4/23/08</u>]

Marco Rubio claimed to have deleted the e-mail exchanges after Florida media requested copies. "Public or private? After House Speaker Marco Rubio's remarks appeared Wednesday on the St. Petersburg Times' Web site, tampabay.com, the Orlando Sentinel requested copies of Rubio's e mails. House spokeswoman Jill Chamberlin said Rubio had deleted them from his personal account." [St. Petersburg Times, 4/24/08]

St. Petersburg Times: "The Times has encountered a similar response several times over the past year." "The Times has encountered a similar response several times over the past year when asking for e mails from Rubio's personal account." [St. Petersburg Times, 4/24/08]

MIKE HUCKABEE

Mike Huckabee "destroyed government-owned hard drives as he left office," and was accused of violating state law. "A lawsuit was filed Thursday against former Gov. Mike Huckabee that accuses the Republican presidential hopeful of breaking state law when his administration destroyed government-owned hard drives as he left office in January. Jim Parsons of Bella Vista filed the lawsuit in Pulaski County Circuit Court accusing Huckabee of violating the state's Freedom of Information Act and a state law prohibiting damaging a computer without authorization." [Associated Press, <u>7/27/07</u>]

A lawsuit against Mike Huckabee asked the court to "send a message that destroying public records is not the standard operating procedure." "The state's Ethics Commission has previously dismissed two complaints that Parsons, a self-described 'gadfly,' has filed against Huckabee over the hard drives' destruction. The lawsuit, described in the filing as a 'citizen complaint,' asks the court to 'send a message that destroying public records is not the standard operating procedure' of elected officials when they leave office." [Associated Press, 7/27/07]

BOBBY JINDAL

Bobby Jindal used a private e-mail account to conduct government business. "The Republican governor, who campaigned on a platform of providing more transparency in government, uses a private email account to communicate with immediate staff." [Associated Press, <u>3/7/15</u>]

Bobby Jindal used executive exemptions to refuse to disclose any work-related emails from his two terms in office. "Gov. Bobby Jindal will not release any work-related emails that he has sent during his two terms in office. [...] Thomas Enright, Jindal's chief lawyer, wrote in response to The Advocate's request that no records exist outside of exemptions outlined in the state public records law. 'Aside from the obvious reason for excluding security information, these content-based exemptions support the environment of open discussion and full analysis necessary for staff to make recommendations to assist the governor in the usual course of the duties and business of his office,' Enright wrote in the denial, noting that Jindal only officially emails with internal staff. Jindal's office did not respond to a request for further comment from the governor." [The Advocate, <u>6/22/15</u>]

The Jindal administration's interpretation of Louisiana's open records law means that his work-related emails may never become public, even after he leaves office. "It's not clear whether the documents would have been public, anyway. The Jindal administration has often interpreted the governor's 'deliberative process' exception to extend beyond his inner circle to all documents generated by any agency for Jindal's office. Louisiana also has no archiving requirement at all for the governor, making it an outlier nationally. That means records now sealed under that executive privilege may never become public, even after Jindal leaves office." [Associated Press, 3/7/15]

THE ENDLESS BENGHAZI COMMITTEE

GOWDY DRAGGED OUT INVESTIGATION FOR YEARS TO COINCIDE WITH 2016 RACE

It's clear that the Benghazi Committee has not only engaged in politics, it has needlessly drawn out its investigations to become one of the longest-running select committees in history—longer than government investigations into Pearl Harbor and Hurricane Katrina. The committee has waited months to request documents and witness appearances, featured long periods of inactivity, and delayed Hillary Clinton's testimony, despite her total willingness to appear before the committee.

Why would Trey Gowdy needlessly drag out his committee's taxpayerfunded work? The reason is a partisan one: to harm Hillary Clinton's presidential campaign by attempting to overshadow the 2016 race. Trey Gowdy's spokesperson promised that the Benghazi investigation would stretch into the months just before the 2016 election. "The findings of a Republican-led committee investigating Hillary Clinton's response to the deadly 2012 attack in Benghazi, Libya, likely will not be released until next year, just months before the 2016 presidential election. Representative Trey Gowdy of South Carolina, chairman of the U.S. House Select Committee on Benghazi, has been emphasizing a desire for the panel to finish investigative work by the end of 2015, including its review of Clinton's e-mail practices as secretary of state. Now that seems less likely. In a statement on Tuesday to Bloomberg News, committee spokesman Jamal Ware confirmed the delay. 'Factors beyond the committee's control, including witness availability, compliance with documents requests, the granting of security clearances and accreditations—all of which are controlled by the Executive branch—could continue to impact the timing of the inquiry's conclusion,'Ware wrote." ABANDONED INVESTIGATIVE PLANS

ABANDONED 11 HEARINGS WITH KEY OFFICIALS IN ORDER TO FOCUS ON HILLARY CLINTON

The Select Committee abandoned plans to hold 11 specific hearings in 2015, instead focusing attacks on Hillary Clinton. "At the beginning of this year, Select Committee Republicans provided Democrats with detailed information about their plans to hold 11 hearings between January and October on a wide range of topics relating to the Benghazi attacks. Since then, however, Republicans have completely abandoned this plan—holding no hearings at all since January and instead focusing on former Secretary Hillary Clinton. Amazingly, the last eight press releases on the Select Committee's webpage deal entirely with Secretary Clinton." [Republicans Abandon Plan for Benghazi Hearings to Focus on Clinton, 7/15/15]

New York Times: The Benghazi Committee "put aside all of its proposed public hearings focused on the attack" and abandoned "most of its announced witness interviews." "But even as these new materials came in, the committee put aside all of its proposed public hearings focused on the attack and never followed up on most of its announced witness interviews with top Defense Department and intelligence officials." Politico called a planned hearing "a rare occurrence" for the committee. "The hearing, a rare occurrence for a panel that has preferred to work behind closed doors, was scheduled for Wednesday." [Politico, 7/27/15]

DELAYED PLANS TO INTERVIEW INTELLIGENCE AND DEFENSE OFFICIALS

Trey Gowdy abandoned plans to conduct interviews with top intelligence and defense officials, including with former Defense Secretary Panetta and former CIA Director Petraeus. "Gowdy also abandoned plans he had made in February to start conducting interviews of the following top defense and intelligence leaders in April: former Defense Secretary Leon Panetta, former CIA Director David Petraeus, General Martin



Dempsey, and former Director of the National Counterterrorism Center Matt Olsen. He never invited any of these defense or intelligence leaders for interviews. Gowdy then announced that he planned to start conducting the following interviews in June: former Defense Secretary Panetta, General Martin Dempsey, and General Carter Ham. Those interviews were also abandoned." [Benghazi Democrats press release, 10/6/15]

The Benghazi Committee held only one of a dozen interviews planned with intelligence, Defense Department, and White House officials. "The committee has conducted only one of a dozen interviews that Mr. Gowdy said in February he planned to hold with prominent intelligence, Defense Department and White House officials, and it has held none of the nine public hearings — with titles such as 'Why Were We in Libya?' — that internal documents show have been proposed." [New York Times, 10/11/15]

The Benghazi Committee has not held an interview with a single White House official. "But an approximate tally produced by the Democratic minority staff shows that the committee has so far followed up with only a third of the potential witnesses from the intelligence community, none of the six from the White House and fewer than half from the Defense Department. Meanwhile, more than 70 percent of the potential witnesses from the viewed." [New York Times, 10/11/15]

The Benghazi Committee has not held a transcribed interview or deposition with a single Defense Department Official. "In the entire 14 months since the Select Committee has been in existence, the Select Committee has not conducted a transcribed interview or deposition of even a single Defense Department employee." ADDED APPEARANCES BY STATE DEPARTMENT AND CLINTON STAFFERS

The Benghazi Committee added interviews with 8 current or former Clinton campaign staffers. "By the end of this month, Republicans will have interviewed or deposed 8 current or former Clinton campaign staffers, compared to only a total of four Defense Department officials." [Benghazi Democrats press release, 10/6/15]

The Benghazi Committee added at least 18 current and former State Department staffers to interview list. "At the same time, the committee has added at least 18 current and former State Department officials to its roster of witnesses, including three speechwriters and an information technology specialist who maintained Mrs. Clinton's private email server." [New York Times, <u>10/11/15</u>]

The Benghazi Committee has interviewed more than 70% of potential State Department witnesses compared to 1/3 from intelligence community and zero from White House. "But an approximate tally produced by the Democratic minority staff shows that the committee has so far followed up with only a third of the potential witnesses from the intelligence community, none of the six from the White House and fewer than half from the Defense Department. Meanwhile, more than 70 percent of the potential witnesses from the state Department have been interviewed." [New York Times, 10/11/15]

Interviews and depositions with new witnesses connected to the Clintons and State Department lasted hours and "ranged far afield of Benghazi." "In the spring and summer, the committee drew up new lists of targets for interviews that to Major Podliska and other committee staff members, particularly Democrats, seemed to have little to do with Benghazi. Among the targets were Bryan Pagliano, a State Department aide who helped set up Mrs. Clinton's email system, and Sidney Blumenthal, a friend and informal adviser to Mrs. Clinton who had sent emails to her about Libya before and after the attacks. The questioning of Mr. Blumenthal and others, in sessions that took place in a closed-door conference room and frequently lasted seven or eight hours, also ranged far afield of Benghazi." DELAYED SECRETARY CLINTON'S INITIAL TESTIMONY

TREY GOWDY FIRST CLAIMED TWO HEARINGS WERE NECESSARY

Trey Gowdy attempted to drag Hillary Clinton before the committee for two separate hearings. "Clinton agreed to testify before the committee in May. Gowdy, however, rejected that offer and asked the secretary to appear twice — once on her exclusive use of a private email server while at State and another in regard to the Benghazi attack. Kendall, who has spearheaded Clinton's communication with the committee, said the former first lady would only testify once on both topics and offered to do it during the week of May 18 or later. The date came and went, however, with no testimony." [CNN, 7/25/15]

THEN HE INDEFINITELY DELAYED HER SCHEDULED APPEARANCE

Trey Gowdy indefinitely delayed Hillary Clinton's planned May 2015 testimony. "The chairman of the House Select Committee on Benghazi says Hillary Clinton's testimony will be delayed until the panel gets all relevant documents from the State Department. 'Simply put, the Committee must have the records of communication requested more than six months ago before the secretary's appearance can be scheduled,' Rep. Trey Gowdy (R-S.C.) wrote Thursday in a letter to Secretary of State John Kerry... 'The Committee has had Secretary Clinton's emails for months,' he added, referencing 300 messages from Clinton's server that Gowdy said are relevant to the investigation. 'This new claim that the Department has not produced a single responsive document is completely baseless and appears to be yet another excuse to drag out Secretary Clinton's testimony until closer to the election,' said Cummings." WAITED MONTHS TO ISSUE DOCUMENT OR WITNESS REQUESTS

COMMITTEE OPERATED FOR SIX MONTHS BEFORE ANY SUBSTANTIVE DOCUMENT REQUESTS

The Benghazi Committee waited six months to "submit its first substantive document request." "The detailed chronology provided in the Department's letter also notes that the Select Committee did not submit its first substantive document request until November 18, 2014 –more than six months after the Select Committee was established. The letter explains how Republican staff prioritized the production of Secretary Clinton's emails, which was the first request in the Chairman's letter." WAITED NEARLY A YEAR BEFORE REQUESTING DOCUMENTS FROM DOD

WAITED NEARLY A YEAR BEFORE REQUESTING NEW DOCUMENTS FROM CIA

Instead, the Select Committee waited almost a full year after its inception—until April of 2015—before sending its first request for new documents to the CIA." WAITED UNTIL JANUARY 2015 TO SUBPOENA ARB DOCUMENTS

NEVER ISSUED REQUEST FOR APPEARANCES BY TOP DEFENSE OFFICIALS

The Benghazi Committee "never sent a letter to former Defense Secretary Robert Gates or former Defense Secretary Leon Panetta requesting their testimony." "To date, the Select Committee has never sent a letter to former Defense Secretary Robert Gates or former Defense Secretary Leon Panetta requesting their testimony. The Select Committee has been virtually silent on its plans to hear from either of these individuals or anyone else from the Defense Department. In the entire 14 months since the Select Committee has been in existence, the Select Committee has not conducted a transcribed interview or deposition of even a single Defense Department employee." FAILED TO SET UP ELECTRONIC SYSTEM FOR DOCUMENTS

Benghazi Committee has not finished setting up an electronic system to manage 50,000 pages of documents handed over. "The process of setting up an electronic system to manage more than 50,000 pages of documents that the committee has assembled is still not complete, meaning that staff members sometimes have to search through boxes to find critical pieces of paper — an almost comical task, staff members said." WASTED COMMITTEE TIME DRINKING AND BUYING GUNS

Republican staff members formed a wine-drinking club and a gun-buying club that would meet in the committee conference room to discuss "Glock handguns they intended to buy." "With the slow progress, members have engaged in social activities like a wine club nicknamed 'Wine Wednesdays,' drinking from glasses imprinted with the words 'Glacial Pace,' a dig at Representative Elijah E.
