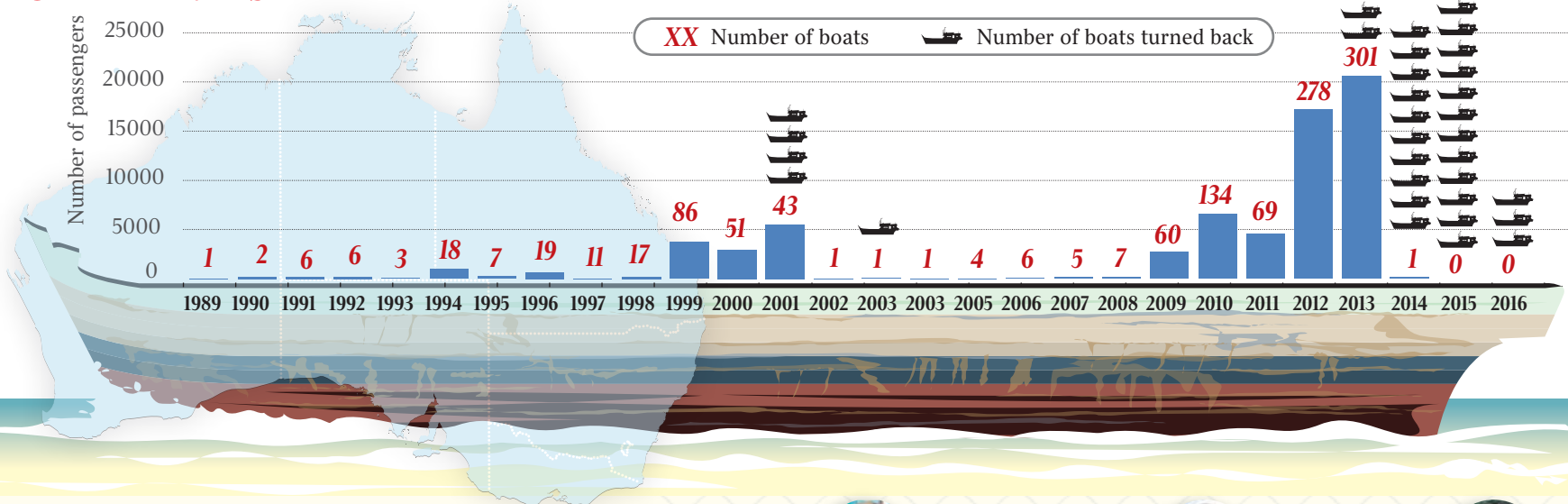

## LABOR'S DISSENTING VOICES

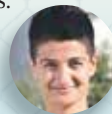
**CATHY O'TOOLE**

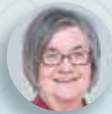

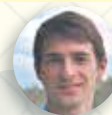
