Stanley Cohen US authorities who seek to silence him and end his law practice targeted Attorney and Human Rights Advocate Stanley Cohen with charges of obstructing and impeding the Internal Revenue Service. Cohen's December 17, 1992 career in court includes defending Palestinian and Lebanese liberation movements, anti-imperialist guerilla warfare in the US, anti-Islamophobic vandalism, anti-racist cop-killers as well as families of people murdered by police, Mohawk Warrior Society during the Oka crisis, Tompkins Square Park rioters, ACT-UP needle exchange and condom distribution programs, Homeless children, IRA bank robbers, Anarchist newspapers and magazines, Black Bloc demonstrators, Squatters, Anonymous, War-Resisters, and Occupy Wall Street organizers.

Rashid Johnson Rashid Johnson became a revolutionary in 2001, eleven years into his life sentence, and 6 years after winning multiple reforms as a jailhouse lawyer. He is now the defense minister for the New Afrikan Black Panther Party-Prison Chapter and continues his jailhouse lawyer activities. An avid and talented artist, his art has appeared in prison movement publications such as the Incarcerated Worker and 4StruggleMag Address envelope to Kevin Johnson

> Zolo Azania is a former Black Panther convicted of a 1981 bank robbery that left a Gary, Indiana cop dead. He was arrested, unarmed, miles away from the incident. The prosecution intimidated witnesses, suppressed favorable evidence, presented false eyewitness and expert testimony, and denied him the right to speak or present motions in his own behalf.

Fred "Muhammad" Burton Fred Burton is one of the Philly 5, a group of men accused of an alleged attack on a police station that left one officer killed. He was sentenced to a life term for murder. Burton has maintained his innocence since his arrest.

> Chelsea Manning, Army intelligence analyst, leaked a video showing the killing of civilians, including two Reuters journalists, by a US Apache helicopter crew in Iraq. She also shared documents known as the Afghan War Diary, the Iraq War Logs, and embarrassing US Diplomatic Cables, with the anti-secrecy website WikiLeaks. Address envelope to Bradley Manning.

Connor Stevens Connor and four others were arrested on May 1st, 2012 and accused of plotting a series of bombings, including of an area bridge. The FBI, working with an informant, created the scheme, produced the explosives, and coerced them into participating.

Casey Brezik In 2010, anarchist Casey Brezik tried to assassinate the governor of Missouri. In June of 2013, he was convicted and sentenced to a dozen years on each of three counts - assault and two armed criminal action charges – and seven years on a second count of assault. All sentences will run concurrently.

"To my family, friends, supporters and those whose resistance has inspired me. [...I]n about 18 hours I will enter prison—IT WILL NOT BREAK, SILENCE OR CHANGE ME. I have struggled since adolescence to stand up and be counted among those who dare to say no and will do so until my last breath in this life. I am sure that your struggle, resistance and struggle to make this world a more just and equitable place will continue in all places for all people.
