

WHY IS REGISTRATION IMPORTANT?



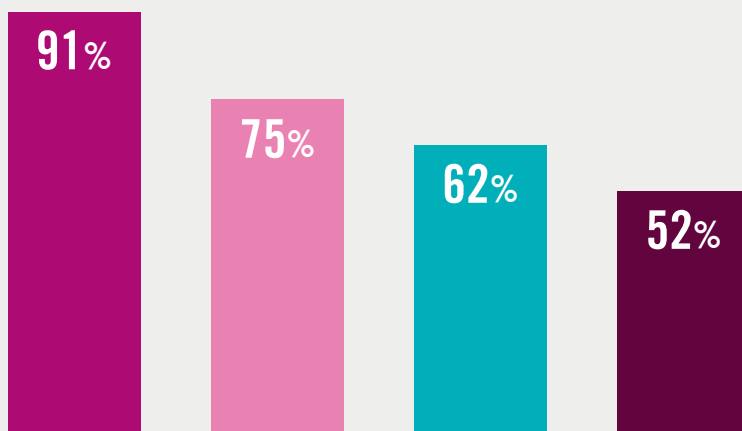

In Australia the family will always be asked to confirm the donation decisions of the deceased before organ and tissue donation for transplantation can proceed.

Australians are encouraged to join the Australian Organ Donor Register (AODR) to help end the wait for those in need of a life-saving transplant.

Organ donation consent rates



- A** 91% of families agreed to donation proceeding when their loved one **was a registered donor**.
- B** 75% of families agreed to organ donation when they **knew their loved one's decision**.
- C** This compares to the **62% national average**.
- D** 52% of families agreed to donation when the potential donor **had not registered or discussed** their donation wishes.

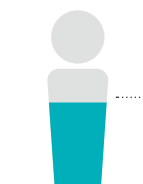

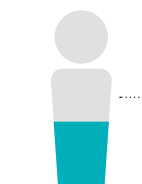
