BOYS FINALISTS



Christian Berry

MUS junior

A finalist for the third straight year, Berry won the state championship in the 50 freestyle while also helping the 400 freestyle relay team to a title. Also at state, he got a second-place medal in the 200 freestyle relay while taking fourth in the 100 freestyle. Earlier, Berry set the county record in winning the 100 freestyle (46.04).



Henry Keel

MUS senior

The team captain and driving force for the state champion Owls, Keel set a meet record in winning the 50 freestyle county championship. The future Virginia swimmer then helped MUS to a state title in the 400 freestyle relay while earning three seconds (50 and 100 freestyles, 200 freestyle relay). Keel is a finalist for the second year in a row.



Jack McCaghren

MUS junior

McCaghren was an all-metro performer in 2015 and took another leap forward this year, finishing second at state in the 100 butterfly and third in the 100 backstroke while helping the 200 medley and 400 freestyle relay teams to first-place finishes. McCaghren also won both butterfly races at the county meet.

Robinson — a finalist for the third straight year — had another fine season for the state champion Owls. Last year's award winner, Walsh broke a 12-year-old record in winning 200 freestyle at the county meet in a time of 1:40.38 to help Collierville finish in second place behind MUS while winning the combined boys-girls title. At state, the three-time all-metro performer had two second-place finishes (100 freestyle, 200 freestyle).

A winner for the fifth straight year, Parker's Owls dominated the county meet, beating Collierville by almost 250 points to win the title for the eighth year in a row. MUS then capped a banner year by winning the state championship.

Lauren Mabie

St. Mary's sophomore

An all-metro choice as a freshman, Mabie set the county record in winning the 100 IM (59.19) while finishing third in the 100 breaststroke and helping the Turkeys to two relay victories. She was a part of the state-winning 200 medley relay and the runner-up 400 freestyle relay while earning individual medals in the 100 breaststroke (third) and 200 IM (sixth).



Ali MacQueen

St. Mary's senior

MacQueen has been an all-metro performer in each of her four years and is a finalist for the second year in a row. She had three first-place results at the county meet (100 butterfly, two relays) before helping the Turkeys to the state title in the 200 medley relay. At state, she also finished second in the 100 butterfly and 400 free relay, and fourth in 100 free.
