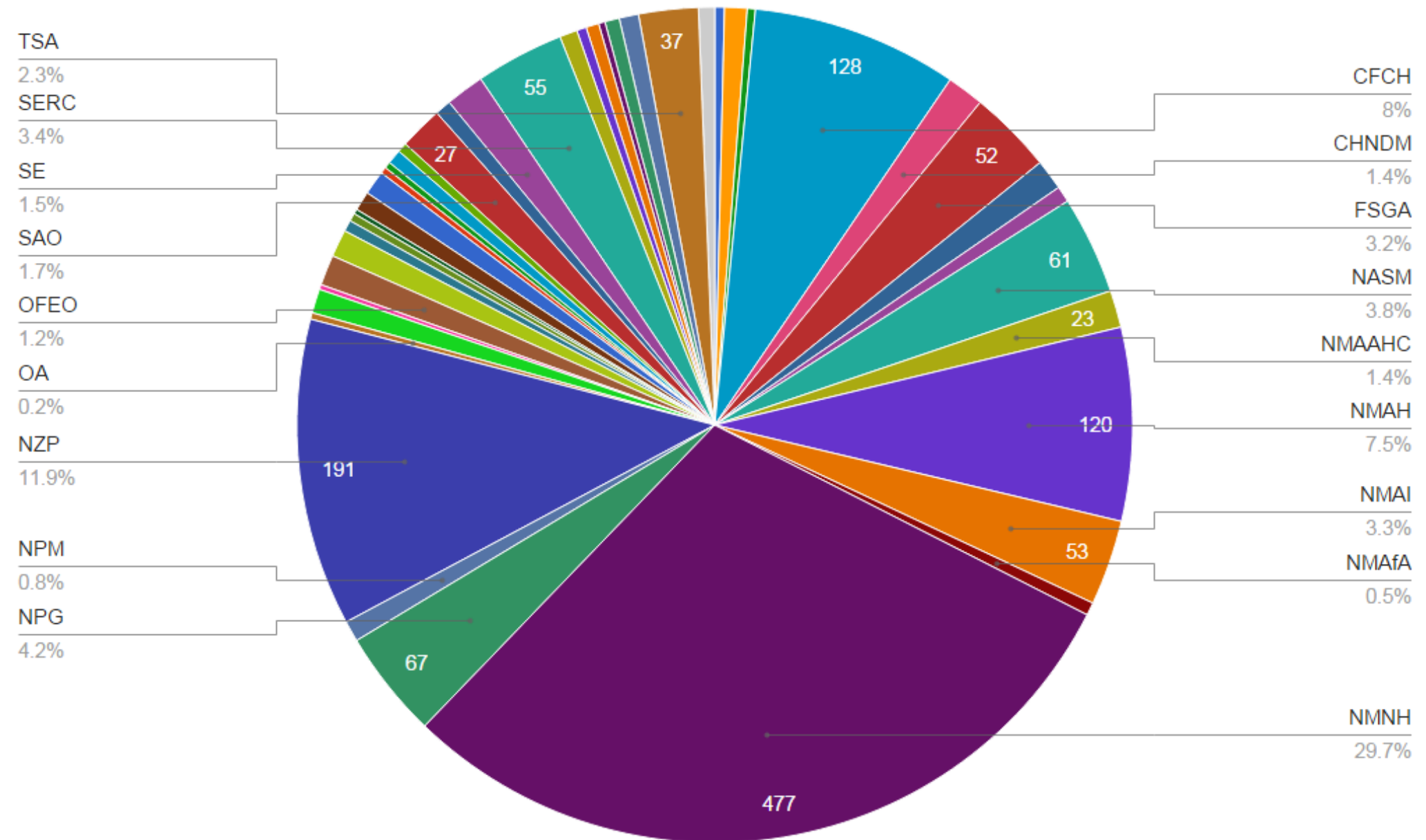

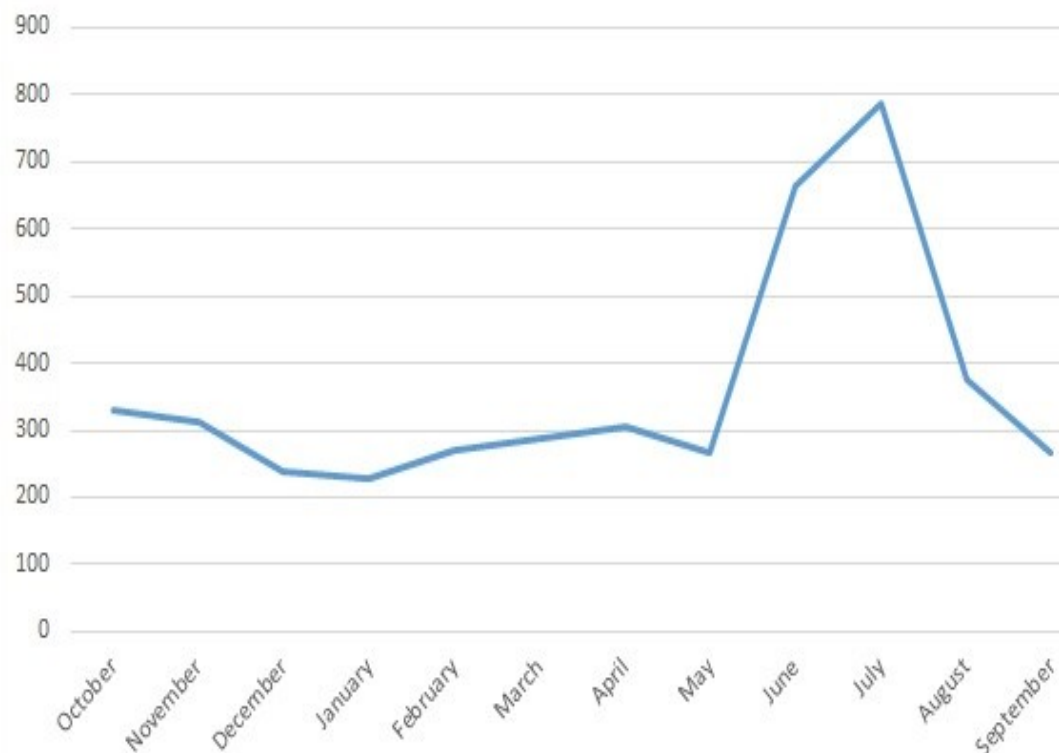

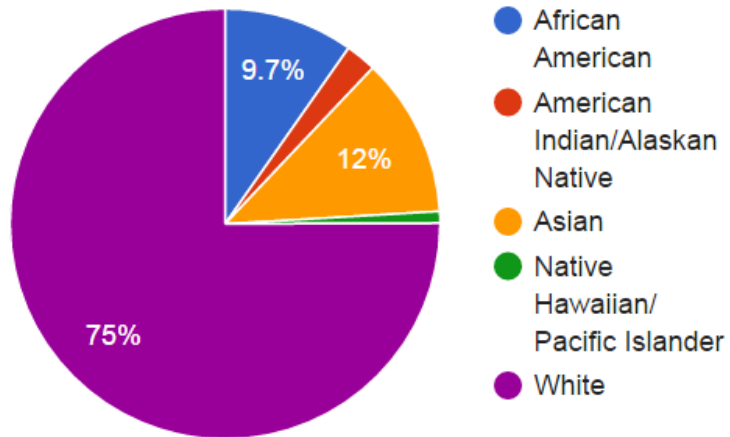

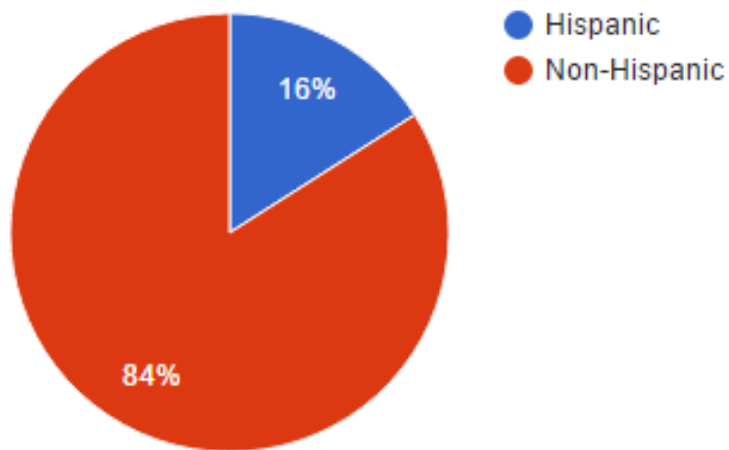

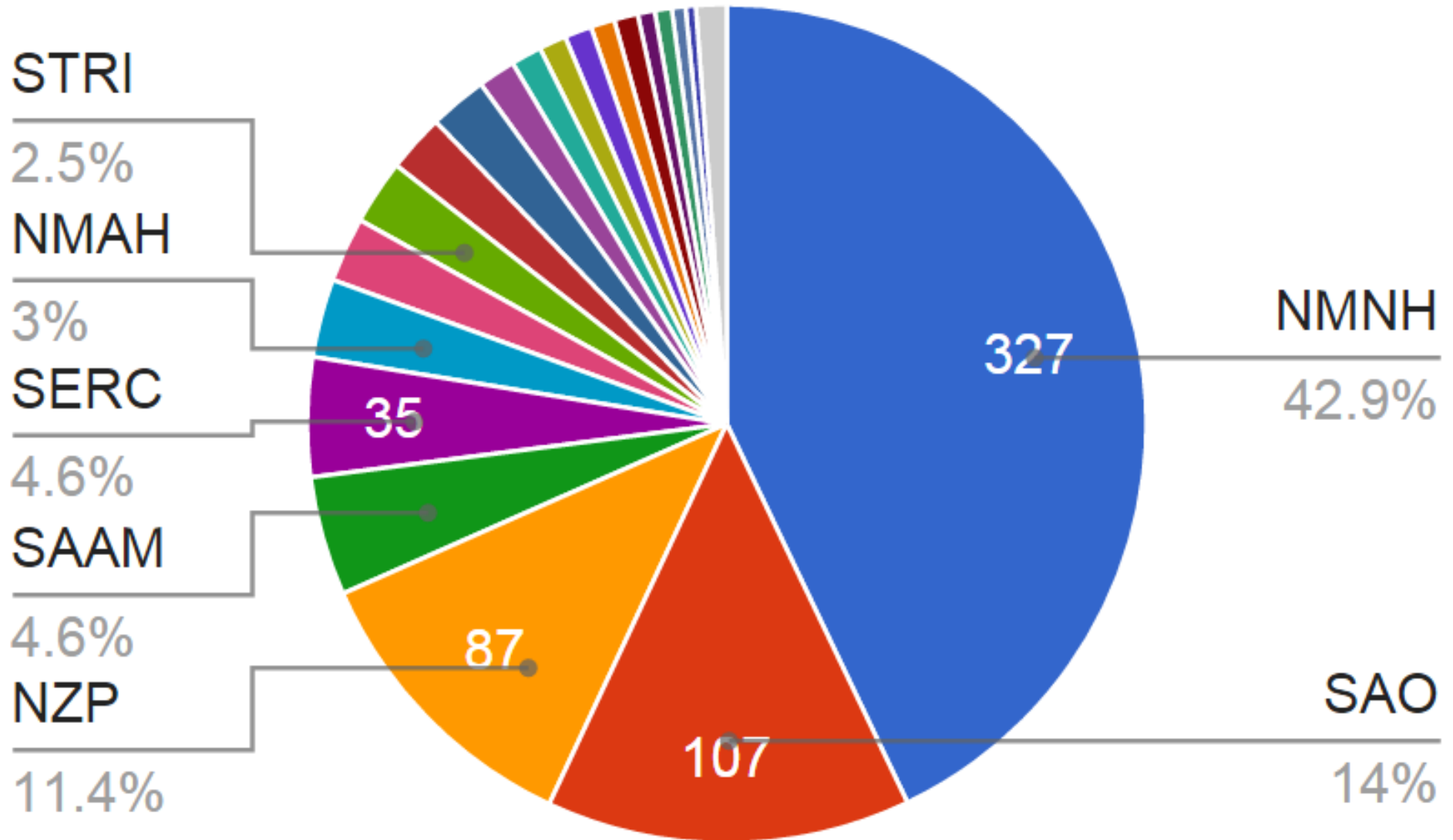

Where Did FY15 Smithsonianian Fellows Go? (Click Chart)



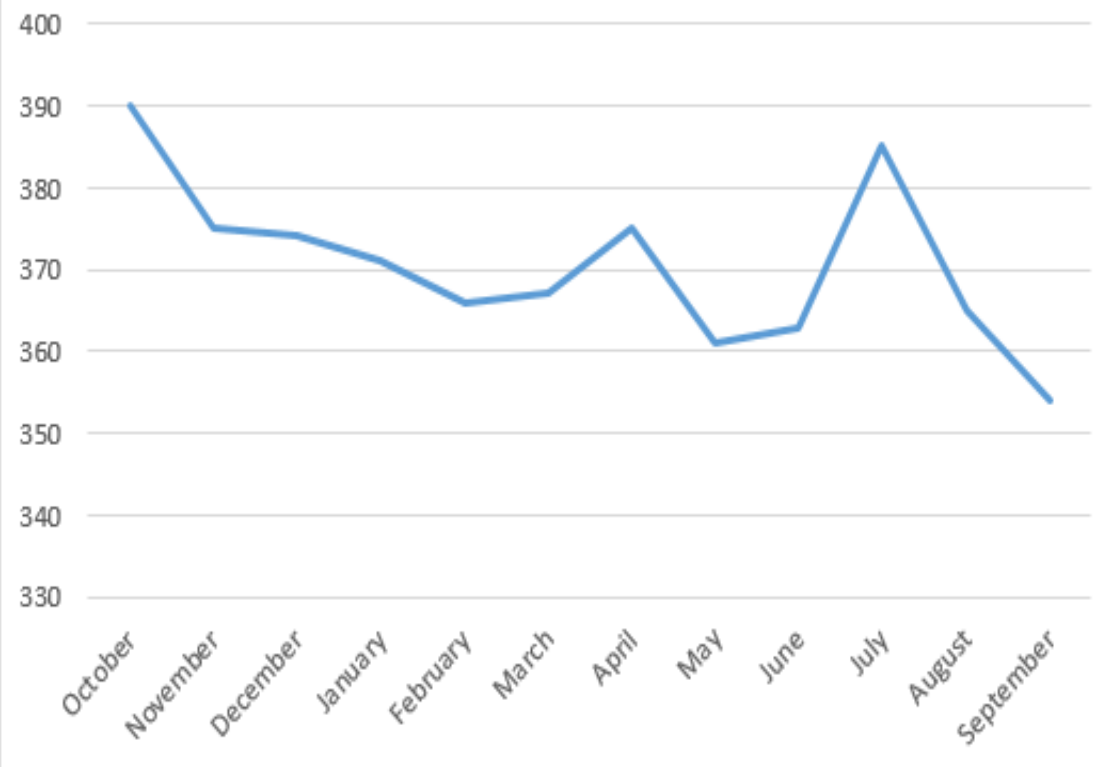

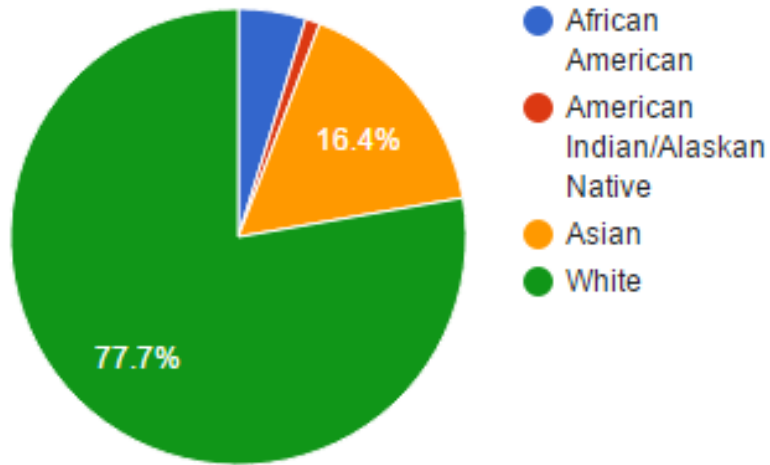

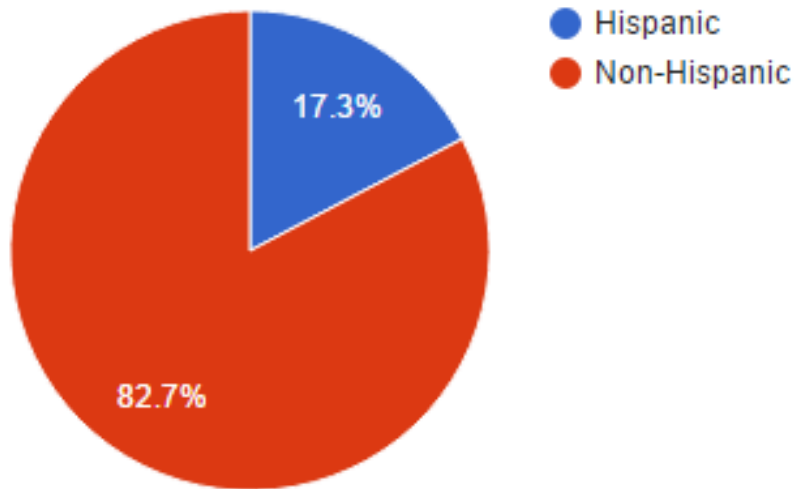

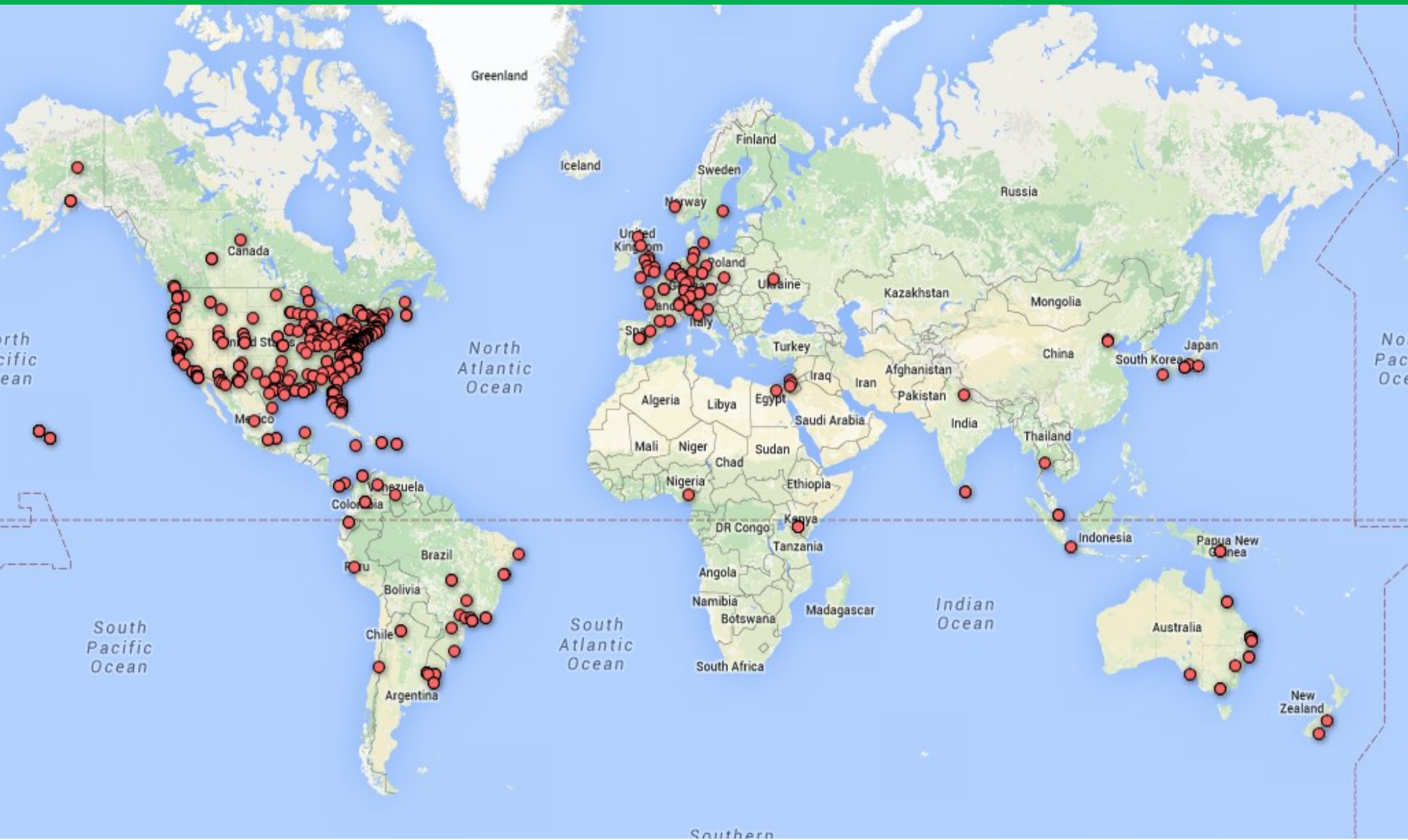

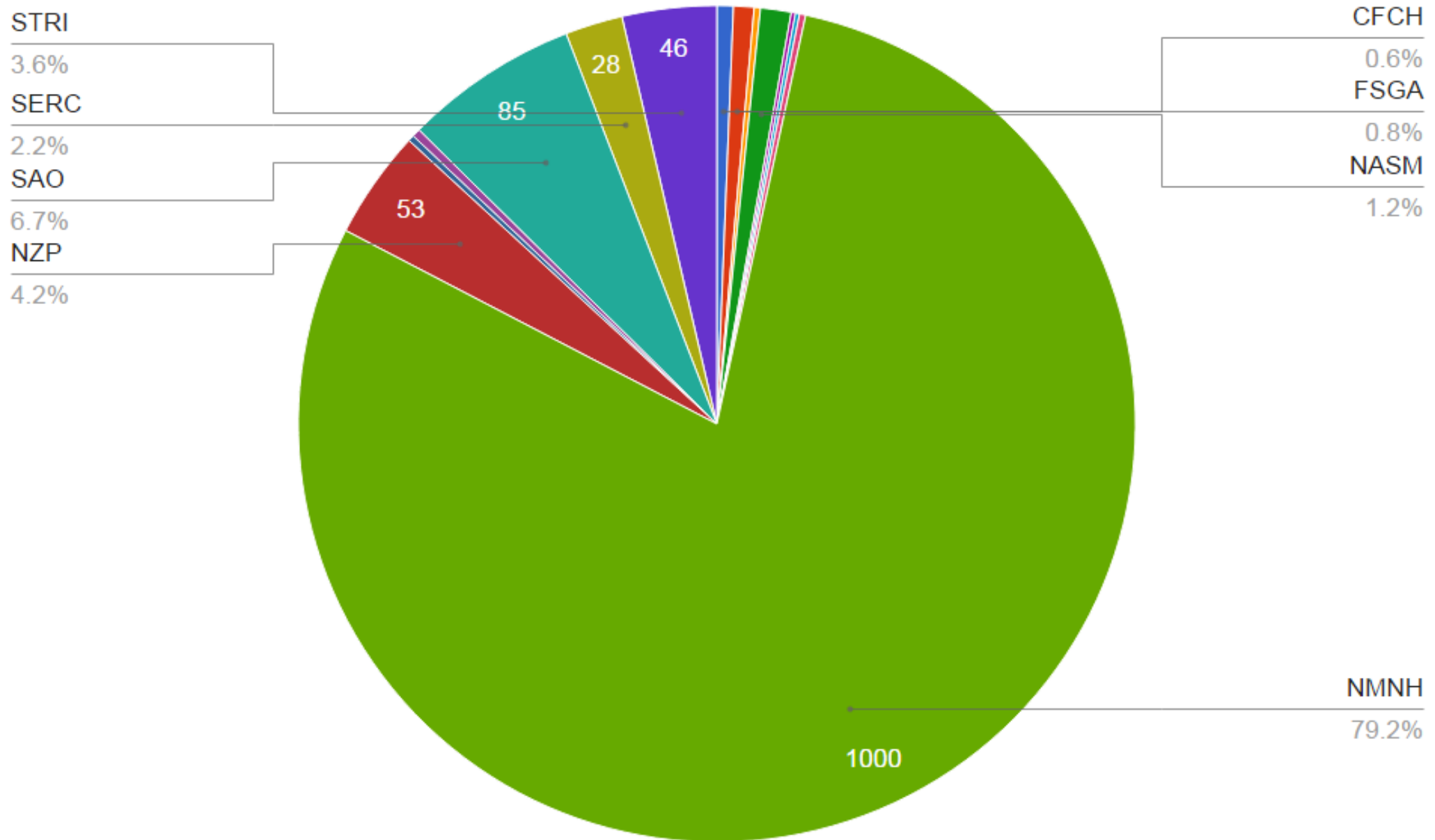

Where Did FY15 Smithsonian Research Associates Come From? (Click Map)



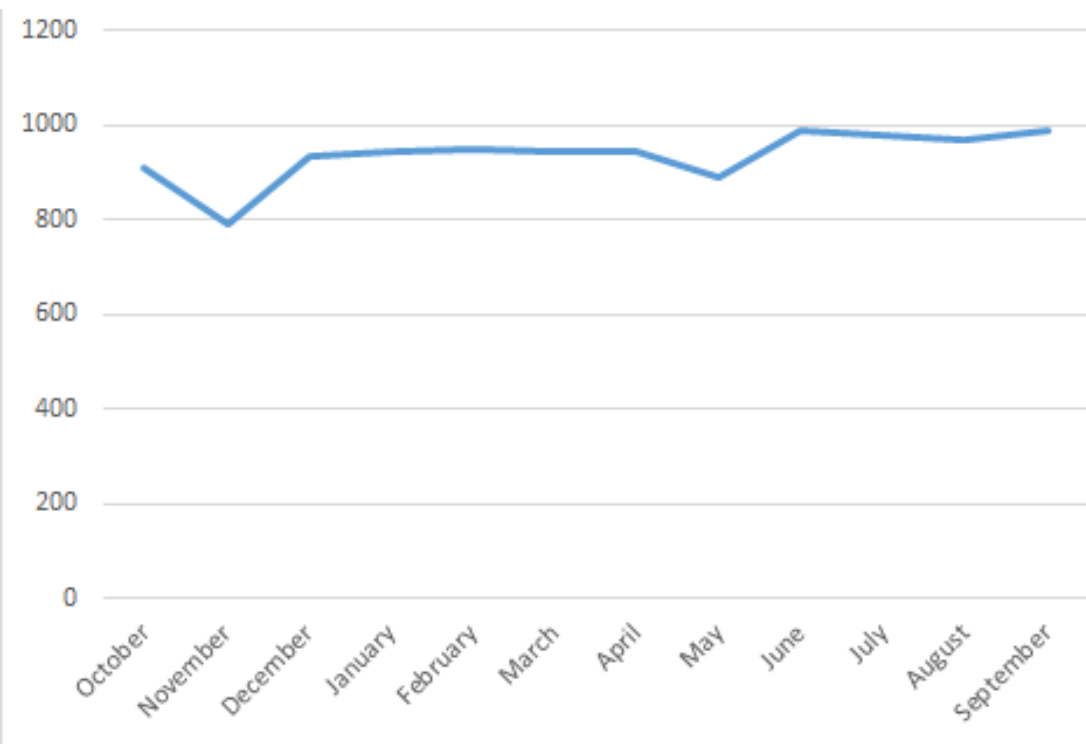
Where Did FY15 Smithsonian Research Associates Go? (Click Chart)



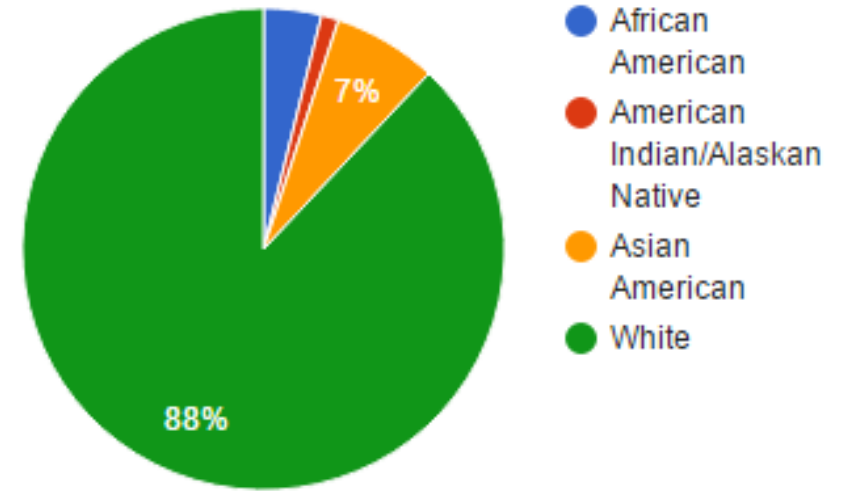

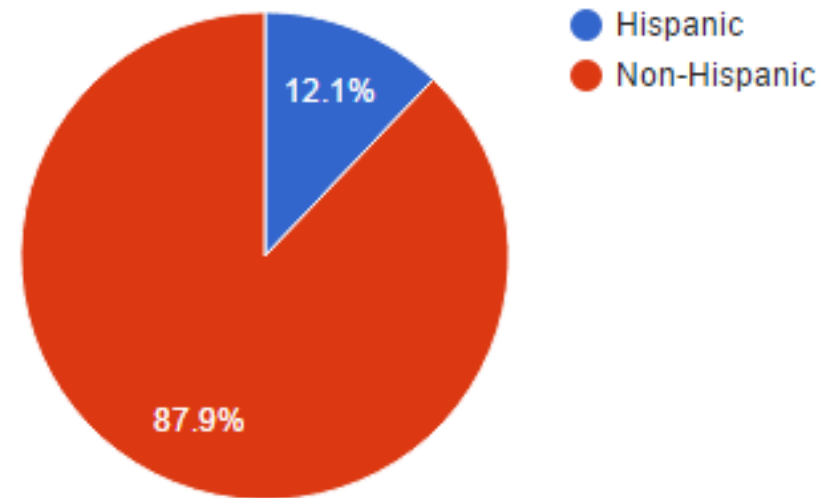
