PLAYOFF TEAM NOTES

THOMAS HAS 113 POINTS THROUGH FIRST FOUR GAMES...

Isaiah Thomas has netted 113 points through the first four games of the 2016 playoffs for the Celtics...According to the Elias Sports Bureau that matches a mark that has not been seen since Larry Bird recorded an identical 113 points through the first four games of the 1988 playoffs.

THOMAS NETS 42 IN GAME 3 AGAINST ATLANTA...

Isaiah Thomas scored 42 points against Atlanta in Game 3 behind 12 field goals and 13 free throws...According to the Elias Sports Bureau Thomas is only the fourth Celtic to record at least 12 field goals and 13 free throws in a playoff game joining John Havlicek, Sam Jones and Larry Bird.

THOMAS FIRST NON-FIRST ROUNDER TO RECORD 40 IN PLAYOFF GAME SINCE 2007...

Isaiah Thomas scored 42 points against Atlanta in Game 3 to go along with four rebounds and an assist...According to the Elias Sports Bureau Thomas is the first player that was not drafted in the first round to record 40 or more points in a playoff game since Carlos Boozer recorded 41 points for the Jazz in 2007.

REGULAR SEASON TEAM NOTES

THOMAS CHASING C'S HISTORY...

Isaiah Thomas recorded 1,823 points and 509 assists during the 2015-16 season...He joined Larry Bird and John Havlicek as the only three Celtics in franchise history to record 1,600 points and 500 assists in a single season...Bird recorded the feat five times (1983-84, 1984-85, 1985-86, 1986-87 and 1989-90) while Havlicek recorded the feat four times (1969-70, 1970-71, 1971-72, 1972-73)...Thomas also became just the eighth player in C's franchise history to record 1,800 points in a season joining Bird, Havlicek, Sam Jones, Kevin McHale, Paul Pierce, Antoine Walker and Jo Jo White.

THOMAS SETS FRANCHISE RECORD FOR MOST CONSECUTIVE GAMES AS TEAM'S OUTRIGHT LEADING SCORER...

Isaiah Thomas recorded 32 points against the New Orleans Pelicans on Apr. 6 marking his 17th consecutive game during which he has been the Celtics' outright leading scorer...According to the Elias Sports Bureau the 17 consecutive games breaks a franchise record that was held by Larry Bird who recorded 13 straight games as the outright leading scorer during the 1987-88 season...Thomas broke Bird's record with his 14th consecutive game leading the team in scoring against Portland on Mar. 31...Listed below are the top single season streaks in franchise history...

CELTICS DEFENSE AMONG BEST IN THE NBA...

The Celtics have prided themselves historically on having a good defense and this season they are boasting one of the tops in the NBA...The Celtics finished the 2015-16 season tied for the fourth-ranked defense in the NBA (by Defensive Rating) with a mark of 100.9...They also are second in the NBA in opponent turnovers per game (16.4), second in steals per game (9.2), 13th in defensive points per game (102.5), tied for seventh in defensive field goal percentage (44.1%), fourth in defensive three-point field goal percentage (33.6%) and tied for eighth in defensive effective field goal percentage (48.7%)...Since Coach Stevens came in prior to the start of the 2013-14 season the Celtics have made improvements on the defensive end every season...Listed below are where the Celtics currently rank during the 2015-16 season as well as where they have finished in those categories during Stevens' two previous campaigns...

CROWDER AMONG LEADERS IN NBA IN STEALS PER GAME...

Jae Crowder finished the 2015-16 season ranked 14th in the NBA with 1.73 steals per game and finished 15th in total steals across the NBA with 126...Crowder's career high in a season for steals per game came during last season when he averaged 0.88 steals per game and he also amassed his highest single season total with 72.

THOMAS HAS MONTH OF MARCH TO REMEMBER...

Isaiah Thomas had an outstanding month of March as he recorded an average of 25.9 points to go along with 3.6 rebounds and 4.1 assists while shooting 42.0 percent from three point territory over 14 games...According to the Elias Sports Bureau, Thomas is just the third Celtic in the past 40 seasons to record 20 or more points in all of his game during a month (with 10 or more games played during the month) joining Kevin McHale (Nov. 1986 – 13 games) and Larry Bird (Feb. 1986 – 14 games).

JOHNSON MATCHES PERFORMANCE BY MCHALE AGAINST TORONTO ON MAR. 23...

Amir Johnson recorded 11 points of 5-of-6 shooting and grabbed 14 rebounds while handing out five assists against Toronto on Mar. 23...According to the Elias Sports Bureau, Johnson is the first Celtic since Kevin McHale on December 26, 1986 to record double-digits in points, double-digits in rebounds and have at least five assists and shoot 80% or greater from the field.

CELTICS 14-GAME HOME WINNING STREAK ENDS AS LONGEST HOME WINNING STREAK IN TD GARDEN HISTORY...

The Celtics 14-game home winning streak that started on Jan. 13 against Indiana and ended on Mar. 11 against Houston was the longest home winning streak since the 1990-91 season and was the longest home winning streak in the history of TD Garden...This home winning streak was the longest streak during Brad Stevens' tenure as Celtics head coach and is just the fourth home winning streak of 10 or more games since the start of the 2007-08 season...Listed below are the five longest streaks at TD Garden and the longest single-season home winning streaks in C's franchise history...

STEVENS NAMED EASTERN CONFERENCE COACH OF THE MONTH FOR FEBRUARY...

Brad Stevens was named the NBA's Eastern Conference Coach of the Month for the month of February after leading the team to an Eastern Conference best 9-3 mark and an undefeated 6-0 at home...This is the second time that Stevens has been honored as Coach of the Month also winning the award during April of 2015.

THOMAS NAMED TO 2016 EASTERN CONFERENCE ALL-STAR TEAM...

Isaiah Thomas was named as a reserve for the Eastern Conference for the 2016 NBA All-Star Game that will take place in Toronto on February 14...He is the Celtics first All-Star since the 2012-13 season when Rajon Rondo and Kevin Garnett were both voted in as starters...Thomas is the 25th Celtic to have been named to an All-Star game...During the All-Star Game Thomas finished with nine points, three rebounds, an assist and a steal in just under 19 minutes of action.

THOMAS NAMED EASTERN CONFERENCE PLAYER OF THE WEEK...

Isaiah Thomas was named the Eastern Conference Player of the Week for the games played between Feb. 1 and Feb. 7...He averaged 20.3 points, 7.0 assists and 4.5 rebounds in leading the Celtics to a 4-0 week including a win over the Eastern Conference-leading Cleveland Cavaliers...This is Thomas' third time winning the award as a Celtic and the first this season.

THOMAS TO PARTICIPATE IN TACO BELL SKILLS CHALLENGE AT ALL-STAR WEEKEND...

Isaiah Thomas participated in the Taco Bells Skills Challenge as part of the NBA's All-Star weekend in Toronto...This is the second straight season that Thomas has participated in the contest and it is the second time that a Celtic has participated in the contest...Rajon Rondo competed in the Skills Challenge during the 2012 All-Star weekend in Orlando...Thomas finished second in the contest during the Saturday night event, losing to Karl-Anthony Towns in the finals.

SMART NAMED TO 2016 BBVA COMPASS RISING STARS CHALLENGE...

Marcus Smart was named to the USA team at the 2016 BBVA Compass Rising Stars Challenge at All-Star Weekend in Toronto...This is the third straight Rising Stars Challenge that the Celtics have had a participant in and Smart is the 15th Celtic to have participated in the contest...Kelly Olynyk was named to the World team last season despite having to miss the game due to injury and Olynyk and Jared Sullinger were named to the game during the 2014 All-Star Weekend in New Orleans...Smart started the contest and finished with three points, four rebounds, five assists and a steal in 21:40 of action.

Brad Stevens begins his third season as Head Coach for the Boston Celtics. He was named the 17th head coach in the history of the Boston Celtics on July 3, 2013.

In his second season with the Celtics, Stevens led the team to a playoff appearance with a furious finish to the season. After starting the season 16-30 the team finished the season 23-12 to clinch the seventh seed in the Eastern Conference. During the month of April when the team was 7-1 he was named the Eastern Conference Coach of the Month and became the fifth Celtic Head Coach to win the award joining K.C. Jones, Jimmy Rodgers, Chris Ford and Glenn "Doc" Rivers. Stevens has posted a record of 65-99 (.396) in his two seasons with the team.

Stevens, 39, joined the Celtics after coaching Butler University where he boasted a 166-49 record, four league regular season championships, three league tournament titles and six trips to post-season tournament play. He has the top two single season win totals in Butler and Horizon League history, and he became the only coach in school history to lead a team to the NCAA Division I national championship game which he did twice.

Stevens owns two Horizon League Coach of the Year awards and has rewritten the NCAA record book for Best Coaching Starts by Wins. During the 2012-13 season, he moved into the top spot on the six-year list with 165 victories. He captured the five-year record (139), moving ahead of Everett Case of North Carolina State (1947-51) in 2011-12, and he owns the three-year (89) and four-year (117) records. He is second on the two-year list with 56 wins.

Stevens left a position as a marketing associate at Eli Lilly and Company in Indianapolis to pursue a career in basketball coaching. He served in a volunteer capacity in Butler's basketball office during the summer of 2000, before eventually gaining a full-time administrative position under Thad Matta. Stevens joined the Bulldogs' staff in 2000-01 as coordinator of basketball operations, handling a variety of administrative duties. He was offered a full-time assistant coaching position by Todd Lickliter in 2001-02. Stevens worked with Lickliter for six seasons spanning from 2001-07. During Stevens' tenure as an assistant coach with the Bulldogs, Butler compiled a 131-61 record, won three Horizon League regular season championships and made four trips to post-season tournament play.

Stevens was introduced as the new men's basketball head coach at Butler University on April 4, 2007, just three days after his former boss, Todd Lickliter, was named head coach at the University of Iowa. He became the third consecutive former Butler assistant coach to be named head coach of the Bulldogs, and he served under the previous two - Thad Matta and Lickliter. In his debut season in 2007-08, Stevens helped Butler become the first team in school and Horizon League history to record 30 wins. The 30-4 Bulldogs captured the Great Alaska Shootout, won a second consecutive Wooden Tradition Trophy, and wrapped up the Horizon League regular season and tournament championships. Butler won a first-round NCAA Tournament game, before falling in overtime to #5 Tennessee in the second round. The Bulldogs were ranked in the "Top 25" of the AP and ESPN/USA Today national polls for 19 consecutive weeks, including a record three weeks in the "Top 10." Only three coaches in NCAA Division I history - Bill Guthridge, North Carolina (34), Bill Hodges, Indiana State (33) and Jamie Dixon, Pittsburgh (31) - posted more first-year wins than Stevens did. At the age of 31, Stevens became the third-youngest Division I coach to guide his team to 30 wins - the youngest in more than half a century.

During the 2009-10 season, Stevens led the Bulldogs to a 33-5 overall record, the Horizon League's first 18-0 conference mark and fourth overall unbeaten record, a fourth consecutive league regular season championship, a second Horizon League Tournament crown in three years and a national runner-up finish in the NCAA Tournament. The Bulldogs were nationally-ranked for the fourth straight year, and Butler compiled a school-record, a 25-game winning streak, the longest winning streak in the nation. The Butler coach was named NABC All-District 12 Coach, and he was a finalist for several additional national coaching awards. Butler ended the season as the No. 2-ranked team in the final ESPN/USA Today national poll. The following season he guided Butler to a 28-10 campaign, a league-record fifth consecutive Horizon League regular season championship, a second straight league tournament title, a fifth consecutive trip to the NCAA Tournament and a second straight national runner-up finish.

In 2011-12, Stevens led a young Butler team to a 20-win season, a third place finish in the Horizon League regular season race and a return trip to post-season play. He helped the Bulldogs to the semifinals of the Horizon League Tournament and to the semifinals of the College Basketball Invitational.

During the 2012-13 season, Butler's first in the rugged Atlantic 10 Conference, Stevens guided the Bulldogs to 26 wins, a tie for third place in the A-10, a trip to the A-10 Tournament semifinals, a runner-up finish at the Maui Invitational and three "Top 10" victories, including a win over No. 1 Indiana. He had the Bulldogs, picked sixth in the A-10 preseason poll, ranked in the "Top 25" for 11 weeks, reaching as high as No. 9 in both the Associated Press and the USA Today national polls.
