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Subject: Florida 4th Judicial Circuit survey conducted for FloridaPolitics.com

Date: July 25, 2016

Executive Summary:

This poll of 821 Florida likely Republican primary voters was conducted on July 25th 2016. This poll used the registered voter lists supplied by the state of Florida as of July 12, 2016. The sample of voters that were contacted included random samples of registered Republican voters within the boundaries of Florida’s 4th Judicial Circuit.

The issues surveyed included questions related to the Florida 4th Judicial Circuit primary election.

Methodology:

The poll was conducted by an automated phone call polling system. The results were then weighted to account for proportional differences between the respondents' demographics and the demographics of the active Republican primary voter population for Florida’s 4th Judicial Circuit. The demographics used were: race, age and gender.

The sample of voters polled was chosen at random within the registered Republican voter population within Florida’s 4th Judicial Circuit. Only those voters that voted in a primary election in 2012 or 2014 were included in the results.

The scientific results shown below have a sample size of 821 and a 3.4% Margin of Error at a 95% confidence level.
