Jamil Abdullah Al-Amin, also known as H. Rap Brown, came to prominence in the 1960's as chairman of the Student Nonviolent Coordinating Committee and the Justice Minister of the Black Panther Party. Before his incarceration he was a Muslim spiritual leader and community activist in Atlanta, GA.

Robert Stephenson was sentenced to 18 mos for theft during a rebellion in Ferguson, MO in August 2014. The rebellions occurred in response to the police execution of 18 year old Michael Brown.

Jermaine Parker was sentenced to 14 years in 2015 for his participation in a rebellion in Ferguson, Missouri in November 2014. The rebellion was in response to the Grand Jury's non-indictment of police officer Darren Wilson in the murder of 18 year old Michael Brown. Jermaine was charged with firing a revolver out of a vehicle while being pursued by undercover police officers.

Robert (Seth) Hayes is one of the longest-held political prisoners in the U.S., held since 1973. Seth was active in the Black Panther party and its community programs in the 1970's. As the BPP faced greater repression he went underground and formed the Black Liberation Army. In 1973 he was arrested for the death of a NYC transit officer and subsequently charged with eight other crimes. He has worked as a librarian, pre-release advisor and AIDS counselor in prison. He has been denied parole ten times since 1998.

Malik is serving eight consecutive life sentences for his participation in a 1970's rebellion in the Virgin Islands against U.S. colonial rule. In Sept 1972 eight American tourists were gunned down at the Rockefeller-owned golf course on the island of St. Croix. Colonial authorities picked up over 100 Black people for interrogations. U.S. troops carried out a series of repressive acts of violence against Black communities. Malik and four other known supporters of the independence movement were charged with the attack.
