
We must join forces and get organized

In France, one of the richest country of the world, we all suffer from austerity policies : 2 500 000 people do not have any decent accomodation or no accomodation at all. Among them, 30 000 children, 38 000 people living in hotels, 85 000 in caravans and huts. To face this situation, some turn to the State but without success. Thus, 1 200 000 people are waiting for social housing. Yet, 3 500 000 accomodations are empty, including 5 500 in the urban agglomeration of Caen.

Since the end of May, the emergency housing services of the Prefecture (115) does not answer anymore and evince those who were accomodated. Thus, 780 asylum seekers were accomodated in the end of May, only 500 today. Consequently, we are already 280 on the street. And evictions are going on.

To face this, to stop evictions and ask for decent accomodation for all, we must join forces and get organized :

- Every Monday at 6pm ===> Demonstration in front of the Prefecture
- Every Tuesday at 6pm ===> General Assembly in the 202 rue de Bayeux



In 2012, there were 37 000 escorting back to the border, which is six time more than 10 years ago. The French state announced the continuation of the same pace of evictions (20 000 forced evictions until the end of the year). Moreover, special court are set up for illegal immigrants. 86% of the applications for asylum are rejected, pushing us to become illegal immigrants, therefore likely to be evicted.
