

OLD AGE IN AUSTRALIA A History by Pat Jalland

The Australian population is rapidly getting older, demanding important policy and service decisions.

This groundbreaking book is the first to explore a 100-year history of older people in Australia from 1880 to 1980. Over that period the aged suffered terribly as 'forgotten people' until 1945, when there was the promise of a new deal for the elderly.

Major themes include poverty among older people, the awful conditions in the benevolent asylums, gender, the impact of economic depression and wars, the aged pensions debates, housing and welfare, medical policy, nursing homes and the retirement debates.

Drawing on rare unpublished diaries and family correspondence, four biographical chapters illuminate the realities of daily life and the advantages of wealth, family and religion, and the vital importance of gender in the historical experience of ageing.

Old Age in Australia provides essential historical context for current discussions about the implications of ageing in Australia.

Pat Jalland, FASSA, FRHistS, is an Emeritus Professor of History at the Australian National University. Her ten books include *Australian Ways of Death: A Social and Cultural History, 1840–1918* (OUP, 2002); and Changing Ways of Death in Twentieth-Century Australia: War, Medicine and the Funeral Business (UNSW Press, 2006).
