EXPEDITED PROCESSING – MILITARY SPOUSE/PARTNER AND HONORABLY DISCHARGED VETERANS ONLY

The Board is required to expedite the licensure process for (1) an applicant who is a honorably discharged veteran of the U.S. Armed Forces or (2) an applicant whose spouse or partner is an active duty member of the U.S. Armed Forces and meets other criteria pursuant to Business and Professions Code (BPC) section 115.5. Download the request form available on the Board's website and include it ON TOP OF your Request for Initial California Law and Ethics Examination form.

NEXT STEPS

After the Board processes your *Request for Initial California Law and Ethics Examination*, you will receive a *Candidate Handbook* in the mail as your notification of eligibility. <u>Processing times will vary depending on the volume of applications received.</u> You may contact PSI to schedule your exam once you receive the handbook. TESTING ACCOMMODATIONS

All exam sites are physically accessible to individuals with disabilities. Pursuant to the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) and California law, the Board and its contracted testing vendor will provide reasonable accommodations to candidates who have a qualifying disability or medical condition. Accommodations will not be provided unless prior approval by the Board has been granted. The processing time will vary depending on application volumes. LAW AND ETHICS EXAM - IMPACT ON REGISTRATION RENEWAL

- Registrants Must Take the California Law and Ethics Exam to Renew
 You are required to take the California Law and Ethics Exam for the license type you are pursuing while a registrant (unless you have already passed the Standard Written Exam). Your registration will not be renewable until you have taken the required exam.
- Passing Score Required for Issuance of a Subsequent Registration
 Subsequent Registration Number Application Postmarked Between January 1, 2016 and
 December 31, 2016: During this time, applicants may be issued a subsequent registration number without passing the California Law and Ethics exam. However, applicants must pass the exam prior to the first registration renewal. The subsequent registration cannot be renewed until the exam has been passed.

<u>Subsequent Registration Number Application Postmarked on or After January 1, 2017:</u> From this point forward, applicants cannot be issued a subsequent ASW or Intern registration (second or third number, etc.) without first **passing** the California Law and Ethics Exam.
