Ambulances, if required, are called by teachers / supervisors and they may use the NEEC office phone if this is more efficient than their own mobile phone. If the person requiring medical assistance is the teacher/supervisor, NEEC staff are able to make the call.		
	How can emergency service vehicles and personnel access the venue? Emergency service vehicles can park within 15 metres of the NEEC entrance. Personnel would be met at the entrance and escorted to the emergency by a NEEC staff member.		
	If a medical evacuation is required what is the process? Emergency service personnel would direct any medical evacuation.
