Andrew Vogeney is throwing a party this weekend, complete "with two kegs, music and tons of drunkenness," according to his Facebook.com event invitation.

Officers with the Gainesville Police may already know about Vogeney's "Tennessee Trash Bash" event because they have access to the popular social networking site.

Gainesville Police has been using sites like Facebook and MySpace.com to locate parties and sometimes check on them, according to a memo from police Capt. Ed Book to Chief Norman Botsford.

Serial child molester Andrew Lubrano was looking to hook up with underage boys on MySpace, when a computer search by Wired News picked him out of the site's 100

million-plus user base, along with over 700 other registered sex offenders. MySpace says it can't do the same. By Kevin Poulsen. Oct 16, 2006 | 2:00 AM

Today's investigatory target, 39-year-old Andrew Lubrano, has been less careful, and now he faces his fourth arrest for a sex crime. Lubrano was sentenced to three years probation in 1987 for sexual abuse against a 7-year-old boy, according to police. In 1988, he got another probation term for second-degree sex abuse. In 1995, he earned a 3 to 9 year prison term for sexually abusing two boys he'd been babysitting, one 11, the other 9. The parole board turned Lubrano down three times, and he was cut loose in September 2004 largely unsupervised, having served every day of his nine-year max. By November 2005 he was on MySpace, making friends.



Figure 1 Sentinel Complaints by Calendar Year¹





January 1 - December 31, 2005









Number of Months Between Date Identity Theft First Occurred and Date First Discovered by Victim¹



Percentages are based on the total number of identity theft complaints where victims provided the dates on which the identity theft first occurred and they first discovered it (135,437). 54% of the victims who contacted the Federal Trade Commission directly reported this information. Because some victims experienced multiple instances where their information had been misused, these figures do not track the amount of time it took a victim to discover a particular instance of identity theft, but, rather, the amount of time between the initial misuse of the the victim's information and when the victim first discovered that their information had been misused.

Whereas the users on Facebook.com support the site's stated philosophy of helping people spread information through social networks;

Whereas the users on Facebook.com understand the privacy settings and their role in protecting personal, private information;

Whereas drastic changes were make to Facebook.com on September 5, 2006, including the introduction of the "News Feed" and "Mini Feed" that call into question the safety and privacy of its more than 9 million users;

Whereas there has been an unprecedented outpouring of opposition to the changes within the community;

Whereas many users feel uncomfortable participating on Facebook.com because of the changes to the point that some have deactivated their accounts:

We, the Facebook.com user community:

--Encourage Facebook.com administrators to actively communicate and consult with users in a democratic dialogue concerning any current and future changes.

--Demand the immediate removal of the "news feed" and "mini feed" feature from Facebook.com.

OR:

- --Allow an individual to remove himself or herself from the "news feed" and "mini feed" feature on other users' page.
- --Allow an individual to remove his or her own personal "news feed" and "mini feed" feature from his or her personal profile.


