



Newstart Allowance (\$260 per week) Vs. Poverty-Line (\$400 for a single adult with no kids – higher for those with kids)



GRAPH ONE: NUMBER OF JOB VACANCIES IN SA VS. NUMBER OF JOB-SEEKERS IN SA


