## THE WAR ON JOB SEE

Governments always blame unemployed people for being unemployed instead of looking at other factors. The Federal Budget continues the trend with an extreme attack, especially on the young. Proposals include:

- Job-seekers under 30 allowed only six months on Newstart before payment is cut completely for six months.
- Work For The Dole for under 30s unemployed for more than six months. This means working at less than minimum wage with limited industrial rights and conditions.
- People under 30 who lose their jobs being denied Newstart for 6 months, affecting over 100,000 people per year. What will happen to them?

### Where Are The Jobs?

The Federal Government wants to make welfare as unpleasant as possible to make job-seekers as desperate as possible – to make them compete for jobs that do not exist.

But there are not enough jobs to go around - there are at least six job-seekers for every job vacancy.

In December 2013 that there were 716,000 job-seekers. Job vacancies were 140,000.

Youth unemployment is even higher than overall unemployment. In June 2014 it was 13.1 percent in in poorer areas like Adelaide's northern suburbs it was 20 percent.

Here is one way of thinking about how we treat job-seekers:

### Every morning 100 dogs go out into the paddock to dig for bones.

Every evening they return to their kennels but at least six are unsuccessful, because there were only 94 bones buried to start with.

Some dogs were just lucky whilst some knew where the bones were buried.

Would you say that giving the unlucky ones a damn good flogging will cause more bones to get buried?

Would you?



### Cuts to Family Tax Benefits:

Two-year freeze on payment levels proposed. This means payments stay at the same level for two rears even though cost-of-living keeps rising neaning overall their value goes down.

Access to payments might also be limited, with proposals for Family Tax Benefit B to completely cut off when the youngest child turns six. The cuts will be the worst for single parent families.

- Low income single parents with one child aged 6-12 could lose up to \$131.62 per fortnight.
- Single parent with two teenagers could lose more than \$200 per fortnight.
- Single parent of two school-aged children looking for work could lose \$4,243 per year or 14.8 percent of income by 2017.
- Around 1.2 million families would lose on average around \$3,000 per year by 2017.

The Federal Government is also looking to cut the **School Kids Bonus.** 

# WHAT BUDGET

We have a **manufactured excuse** for a brutal policy agenda. To radically change the country.

Australia has a "triple-A" credit rating and a public debt ratio of 12 percent of Gross Domestic Product (among lowest in developed world - average is 60 percent).
